Imus City to open Three(3) weekends for tax payments

IMUS CITY, Cavite -- The city government of Imus will accommodate business and realty tax payments during the next three weekends.

In an advisory issued Tuesday, City Mayor Emmanuel Maliksi also reminded business owners to pay their taxes, permits renewal, and other regulatory fees before the deadline on January 20 to avoid interest charges for late payments.

Maliksi said the City Treasurer's Office will be open to the public from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.


Owners and/or administrators of properties are also urged to settle their real property

taxes before March 31.

An incentive of 20 percent discount for real property taxes for calendar year 2019 is offered for full payments made on or before January 20, and a 10 percent discount if paid in full before March 31.

A 10 percent discount is also provided for real estate taxes paid on or before the quarterly payment scheduled every 20th of January, April, July and October.



CHANGING THE COURSE OF THE RISING HIV EPIDEMIC

Akbayan Senator Risa Hontiveros' statement on the President's signing of the Philippine HIV and AIDS Law*

As principal author and co-sponsor of the Philippine HIV and AIDS Policy Law, I am happy that the measure was finally signed into law by the President. It is a great way to start the new year. With the signing into law of this measure, we now have a modern policy to curb the

prevalence of HIV and AIDS in the country. In September of last year alone, there were 954 new cases of HIV in the country, many of which involved young people. With this law, the government can now effectively update and upgrade its response to this growing problem.

The law affirms a human rights-based, humane and scientific approach in addressing HIV and AIDS. It will protect the rights of persons living with HIV, afford accessible treatment through updated health technologies, and educate more people for prevention and de-stigmatization.

The law offers hope to future generations. As the only country in Southeast Asia where the number of new cases is on the rise - and where there has been a 170% increase among those aged 15-24 - the measure provides young Filipinos with the correct information and healthy values that will protect them from the disease.

I join the thousands of advocates who worked day and night for many years to ensure this important milestone in our healthcare system. It is ar institutional victory that will certainly make our healthcare services more responsive to the needs of the people. Many lives have been unnecessarily lost due to AIDS, including the lives of many young people. Today, we change the course of this rising epidemic and hopefully, help usher in an AIDS-free generation.

Tolentino to focus on disaster preparedness in Senate bid

TAGAYTAY CITY -- Former presidential political affairs adviser Francis Tolentino said he will put disaster preparedness as his main thrust in his bid for a Senate seat in the May 2019 mid-term elections.

At the sidelines of his birthday celebration held at the Sigtuna Hall of Tagaytay International Convention Center (TICC) on Thursday, the former Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA) chairperson cited the onslaught of Tropical Depression Usman in the Bicol region, which claimed more than 100 lives with some still missing, as a need to prioritize disaster management and readiness.

"Wala kasing nagbabantay [sa Bicol] kaya 100 agad ang patay (There is nobody monitoring Bicol, that's why 100 died)," Tolentino said

" W a l a n g tumatakbong senador na nakahawak na ng patay, naghukay ng bangkay,



nakahawak ng naagnas na bangkay (No other candidate has held, extracted bodies, or even held a decomposing cadaver)," he said, noting that he experienced all these during Supertyphoon Yolanda.

When asked for his birthday wish, Tolentino said he wishes for continuous growth for Calabarzon through various infrastructure projects. The region consists of the provinces of Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon.

The ongoing projects include the extension of the Light Rail Transit (LRT) from Manila to Bacoor City, and the proposed New Centennial Water Supply Project-Kaliwa Dam, which will ensure water supply for Metro Manila residents and an additional raw water source that will augment the supply from Angat Dam.

Tolentino said he also hopes the Tutuban-Los

Baños Railway (Southern Line) project of Philippine National Railways (PNR) to materialize soon.

The bridge project will connect Batangas province to Mindoro (an alternative for the current ferry system), the Tayabas (Quezon) Highway, and the extension of Lucena (Quezon) to South Luzon Expressway (SLEX) road.

Filipino chef brings lechon to London's SohoBy Embassy of PH in London

The world can now sink their teeth into the Philippines' famed lechon and pork barbecue in Central London as chef and founder of hit Filipino pop-up Sarap London Ferdinand 'Budgie' Montoya takes up residence at corner pub and restaurant Sun and 13 Cantons in Beak Street, Soho beginning 19 January.

Sarap will be serving its signature lechon—slow-roasted, brittle-skinned suckling pig stuffed with spices—and Filipino pork barbecue together with extra dessert options in its new location, which is a who's who hangout of the United Kingdom's stage and screen stars such as Oliver Reed, Peter O'Toole, Jude Law, Ewan McGregor, Sean Pertwee, Russel Crowe, Gemma Arterton, Lars Ulrick, Mick Rock, and Kasabian, among others.

Lechon is a popular Filipino pork dish that is cooked and prepared slowly over low fire and hot, glowing embers. Although traditionally a dish served during celebrations, lechon skyrocketed to international acclaim as Filipino chefs brought the tradition overseas and as celebrities like the late Anthony Bourdain raved about it in their shows and social media accounts.

"Our lunch menu will revolve around rice plates incorporating some of our regular dishes such as the best-selling lechon liempo and in-house pickles," said Budgie in an interview with Adam Coghlan of Eater London.

Since his illustrious IT career in Australia for his calling in the kitchen, Budgie has been keen on whetting Britain's appetite for lechon and other roasted and grilled Filipino fares. Through his pop-up Sarap London, Budgie has been spearheading a monthly supper club called aptly Pulutan Nights, which easily became the talk of the town in the UK's foodie circles.

While supper clubs allow for limited engagement and a smaller number of diners owing to its traditional format of dining and social club, Budgie's residency at the Soho joint will open the doors wide for people around the world to feast on lechon and pork barbecue all day, every day. Sarap's new location is very strategic in that Soho is London's culinary epicentre.

Noveleta-Makati P2P bus service opens to commuters

NOVELETA, Cavite -- After a month-long delay, the Noveleta-Makati Point-to-Point (P2P) bus service went on its maiden trip Tuesday with embarkation areas in this town going to destination points at the Makati Business District

In an interview with Philippine News Agency (PNA), Mayor Dino Reyes Chua said the bus operator San Agustin Transport Service Corp. started operating at 6 a.m. Tuesday with a fleet of seven Golden Dragon buses, proceeding from their pick-up terminals in Puregold Noveleta and All Home, Kawit, going to the drop-off point in Trasierra in Makati City.

"This P2P will not only benefit people from Noveleta, but also the nearby towns of Rosario, Kawit, Cavite City, and Tanza," Chua said.

The new transport service has hourly trips starting 6 a.m., with its last trip leaving at 7 p.m.

Meanwhile, vice versa trips from Trasierra to Noveleta starts at 8 a.m. and the last trip taking to the road at 9 p.m.

The P2P transport service charges passengers a flat-rate of PHP120.

"Nagpapasalamat po ako sa Department of Transportation (DOTr) and Land Transport Franchising and Regulatory Bureau (LTFRB) na nabigyan ng aksyon ang aming hiling (We thank the DOTr and LTFRB for acting on our request)," Chua added.

The P2P transport service has scheduled a 15-minute boarding time and its estimated arrival at destination point is about 30 minutes per trip.

The buses will traverse Cavitex to NAIA Expressway to Skyway to Trasierra, Makati and vice versa. Senior citizens and persons with disabilities (PWDs) are entitled to a 20 percent discount and have standard designated seats in the front bus seats, it was explained. (Dennis Abrina/PNA)

AFP joins PNP, Comelec for HOPE

The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), Philippine National Police, Commission on Elections and other stakeholders joined the 2019 Midterm Elections Unity Walk, Interfaith Prayer Rally, and Peace Covenant Signing on Sunday, 13 January 2019, for the honest, orderly, and peaceful conduct of elections (HOPE).

Around 500 AFP soldiers from the General Headquarters, Army, Navy, and Air Force participated in the unity march that started at the Quezon City Hall, going around the Elliptical Road and ended at the QC Memorial Circle.

AFP Deputy Chief of Staff, Vice Admiral Gaudencio Collado Jr. led the contingent. He was joined by Maj. Gen. Pablo Lorenzo, deputy chief of staff for Intelligence, J2; Commo Sean Anthony Villa, assistant deputy chief of staff for operations AJ3; and Brig. Gen. Edgard Arevalo, deputy chief of staff for civil military operations, AJ7, along with other AFP key leaders.

The unity march was culminated with the signing of an Integrity Pledge to manifest the candidates' and government organizations' and non-government organizations' commitment to make the May 2019 elections clean, safe, credible, and orderly and the casting away of white doves to symbolize peace.

VAdm Collado said that the AFP's participation signifies its resolve to ensure that the elections shall be honest, orderly, peaceful and safe in coordination with other GOs and NGOs.

In a meeting with COMELEC in Camp Crame last Friday, AFP Chief of Staff Gen Benjamin Madrigal Jr., said that the participation of AFP personnel shows the military's "unwavering commitment in keeping the integrity, sanctity, and security of a fair and honest elections."

"AFP is the protector of the Filipino people and the state, intensifying our efforts to keep all electoral threats at bay, coordinating with everyone who attended here to uphold successful elections and the AFP shall remain apolitical and non-partisan as the President continues to remind us to be neutral." Gov. The Duterte government, through the "Build, Build, Build" infrastructure program, has earmarked several important projects that would spur even more growth and development in the province and its people, according to Go.

Among others, right-of-way acquisition-related activities are ongoing for the PHP35.43 billion project consisting of a 44.63-km closed system Cavite-Laguna Expressway connecting the CAVITEX in Kawit, Cavite and SLEX in Binan, Laguna.

Also ongoing are preconstruction activities for the PHP64.9 billion LRT Line 1 Cavite extension, starting from the Baclaran station to the future station at Niyog in Bacoor, Cavite.

Go added that a Malasakit Center will soon open in Cavite.

Similar to what happened on Tuesday morning at the Batangas Provincial Hospital in Lemery, Batangas, the government plans to launch a Malasakit Center in Cavite to cater to the need for financial and medical assistance of poor and disadvantaged residents of the province.

"Mahalaga ang kalusugan ng mamamayan para mas makatulong sa paglago ng pamumuhay ng pamilya kaya kailangan natin tugunan ang mga pangangailangan ng mga may sakit," Go told the audience.

Malasakit Center, a brainchild of former Go and President Rodrigo Duterte, is a one-stop shop initiative where PCSO, DSWD, PhilHealth, and other relevant government satellite offices are housed together in one location to ease the process for patients in need of speedy medical and financial assistance.

There are presently 20 Malasakit Centers operating in various parts of the Philippines.

Go intends to add to this number through a law that would mandate the creation of Malasakit Centers in all provinces and urban centers of the country.

Related to the Malasakit Center, Go also stressed the need to increase available hospital beds for patients in crowded public hospitals.

"Huwag natin pahirapan ang mga may sakit na pasyente; bigyan natin silang may sakit ng tamang higaan para gumaling sila nang maayos," Go said.

Meanwhile, Go emphasized the need to protect the welfare of barangay officials as well as barangay health workers by providing proper compensation and benefits packages and by pushing for a Magna Carta for Barangays.

Go said he is also supporting the move to extend the current term of elected barangay officials so that they can have more time to cater to the needs of their constitu-

The term of current barangay officials has been cut short to two years due to the postponement of the last barangay elections.

"Sila po ang frontliners natin sa pagharap sa mga pangangailangan ng ating mga barangay. Pagdating sa droga o sa kalusugan, sila ang ating maaasahaan kaya kailangan natin silang bigyan ng pagpapahalaga," Go added. (PR)

AMADEO, Cavite -- The municipality will officially kick off its annual "Pahimis" Coffee Festival of thanksgiving scheduled on February 22 to 24 with a coffee farmers' symposium next week.

Local tourism officer Jam Medina Tibayan on Friday said the event aims to gather some 350 coffee farmers from this town and neighboring coffee-producing towns of Indang, Silang, Alfonso, Magallanes, Gen. Emilio Aguinaldo and city of General Trias.

The forum set on January 16 will be done in partnership with local tourism council and Philippine Coffee Board, Inc. (PCBI), and will carry the theme Pick Red "Specialty Robusta".
