## DOJ reaffirms PH's commitment to UN efforts vs. illegal drugs

MANILA – The Department of Justice (DOJ) on Tuesday said it has reaffirmed the Philippines' eight-decade-old commitment to the United Nations to help eradicate the illegal drug problem.

"As the Philippines celebrates its 80 years of partnership with the UN as one of its founding members, we reiterate our commitment to multilateralism and the UN as the most vital platform for international cooperation to tackle our common challenges, including the world drug problem," DOJ Secretary Jesus Crispin Remulla told world leaders during the 68th Session of the UN Commission on Narcotic Drugs.

The session is being held from March 10 to 14, 2025 in Vienna, Austria.



# DOH: Dengue cases up 73% infirst2 months of 2025

MANILA - The Department of Health (DOH) on Tuesday said a total of 62,313 dengue cases have been recorded from Jan. 1 to March 1 this year, 73 percent higher compared to the same period in 2024.

The three regions having the most

number of cases are Calabarzon with 12,735 cases; National Capital Region with 11,291; and Central Luzon with 10.185.

However, the case fatality rate this year is lower at 0.35 percent compared to 0.42 percent logged in 2024.

"Inaabisuhan ng Kagawaran ng Kalusugan (DOH) ang publiko at mga lokal na pamahalaan na ituloy at gawing regular ang vector control activities o ang pagpuksa sa mga pinamumugaran ng lamok habang hindi pa tagulan (The DOH urges the public and local government units to continue with their regular vector control activities or those aimed at destroying mosquito breeding grounds," it said in a news release.

The DOH reminded the public that dengue cases may rise nationwide during the rainy season. (PNA)

## DA: Onion prices to drop PGCs health

Department of Agriculture (DA) on Tuesday said the prices of red and white onions may drop amid the harvest season, making it unlikely to set a maximum suggested retail price (MSRP).

This came after some groups suggested to include onions in agricultural commodities, like rice and pork, with MSRP.

In an interview. DA Assistant Secretary for Agribusiness, Marketing, and Consumer Affairs Genevieve Velicaria-Guevarra said they have not received any formal request yet.

"Ngayon po ay tag-ani ng sibuyas. Mayroon talaga tayong mamamataan na pagbaba riyan. Hindi po natin nakikita na maglalagay ng MSRP diyan (It's now harvest season for onions. We can definitely see a decrease. We are not seeing the setting of MSRP for that)," she

Guevarra said the DA's MSRP is used to help tame the spiking prices of a certain commodity.

"Kung ito naman ay nasa normal o mababang presyo, hindi po tayo maglalagay (If this is within the normal or low price range, we will not impose [an Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. MSRP])," she said.

As of March 10. the price range of local red onions in Metro Manila is set at PHP70 per kilogram to PHP180/ kg and PHP60/kg to PHP150/kg for local white onions, according to the DA Bantay presyo problem. (price monitoring).
