## PhilHealth to start reprocessing denied claims

MANILA — The Philippine Health Insurance Corp. (PhilHealth) will start reprocessing 1.1 million denied claims amounting to PHP8.8 billion.

PhilHealth president and chief executive officer Edwin Mercado said Thursday the flexibility claim reimbursement would cover the unpaid claims from Dec. 1, 2018 to Dec. 31, 2024.

"So, the significant list, 30 to 40 percent of all denied claims with finality, ang babayaran namin, 'yun nga 'yung (we will pay them, that is the) flexibility program," he said in a press conference in Pasig City.

"Yung mga natitirang 60 percent, pinag-aaralan pa rin namin. So, 'yung uunahin muna natin 'yung medyo mas malinaw 'yung pinaka-rason, para mas mabilis nating magawan ng proseso at polisiya (We're still studying the 60 percent. So, we'll focus first on those with clear reasons, so we

can easily create a process and policy)."

Mercado said the unpaid claims include those labeled as return to hospital due to incomplete documents, expected claims from individuals confined in hospitals but not yet discharged, and claims being reviewed for validity.

The program aims to reduce the burden of PhilHealth and ensure that health care providers receive appropriate payment for their services.

It will also improve access to health care and improve the bureaucratic procedures for hospitals and patients, Mercado said.

Hospitals and health facilities are given six months from the effectivity of the circular to submit their denied claims.

Only claims submitted between Jan. 1, 2018 and Dec. 31, 2024 that have not been appealed or complained by

health care providers will be included in the reprocessing.

Included in the reconsideration are the claims of PhilHealth Regional Office Benefit Administration Sections, claims under administrative protest in PhilHealth

Regional Office — Claims Review Committee, or appealed in the Protest and Appeals Review Department.

Mercado reminded hospitals about the importance of submitting claims to ensure quick payment. (PNA)

DA: Onion prices to drop

MANILA – The Department of Agricul-  
ture (DA) on Tuesday  
said the prices of red and  
white onions may drop  
amid the harvest sea-  
son, making it unlikely to  
set a maximum suggest-  
ed retail price (MSRP).

This came after  
some groups suggested  
to include onions in ag-  
ricultural commodities,  
like rice and pork, with  
MSRP.

In an interview,  
DA Assistant Secretary  
for Agribusiness, Mar-  
keting, and Consumer  
Affairs Genevieve Veli-  
caria-Guevarra said they  
have not received any  
formal request yet.

“Ngayon po  
ay tag-ani ng sibuyas.  
Mayroon talaga tayong  
mamamataan na pagba-  
ba ryan. Hindi po natin  
nakikita na maglalagay  
ng MSRP diyan (It’s now  
harvest season for on-  
ions. We can definitely  
see a decrease. We are  
not seeing the setting  
of MSRP for that),” she  
said.

Guevarra said  
the DA’s MSRP is used  
to help tame the spiking  
prices of a certain com-  
modity.

“Kung ito naman  
ay nasa normal o  
mababang presyo, hin-  
di po tayo maglalagay  
(If this is within the nor-  
mal or low price range,  
we will not impose [an  
MSRP]),” she said.

As of March 10,  
the price range of local  
red onions in Metro Ma-  
nila is set at PHP70 per  
kilogram to PHP180/  
kg and PHP60/kg to  
PHP150/kg for local  
white onions, according  
to the DA Bantay presyo  
(price monitoring).

The imported  
white onions, meanwhile,  
range from PHP60/kg to  
PHP160/kg.

“Nakikita po na-  
tin ngayon kung bakit

bumaba ng PHP20 to  
PHP30 dahil medyo mal-  
aki iyong supply natin ng  
(We are now seeing why  
it has dropped by PHP20  
to PHP30 because we  
have a huge supply in  
our) local,” Guevarra  
said.

Some agricul-  
ture groups, however,  
pegged the requested  
onion MSRP at PHP100  
for red onions; and  
PHP70/kg to PHP80/kg  
for white onions.

To date, at least  
2,300 metric tons (MT) of  
imported red onions and  
970 MT of white onions  
have arrived in the coun-  
try, according to the DA.

**Market linkages for to-  
matoes**

Guevarra ,  
meanwhile, assured aid  
to local tomato farmers  
affected by the decline of  
prices amid the harvest  
season.

This came as the  
wholesale price of toma-

toes declined to PHP13/  
kg; while retail price  
ranges from PHP25/kg  
to PHP60/kg, according  
to the DA.

“Mina-market  
link namin sila (We are  
giving them market links),  
linkages with direct buy-  
ers na (that are) whole-  
salers. Alam naman po  
natin perishable ang  
kamatis so kailangan  
ma-dispose po iyan (We  
know that tomatoes are  
perishable so we need to  
dispose this) the soonest  
possible time at a large  
quantity,” she said.

Guevarra said at  
least six farmer groups  
in the country have se-  
cured market linkages  
through the DA, while  
others sought help from  
DA regional offices.

She urged to-  
mato producers to coor-  
dinate with DA for mar-  
ket linkages to ensure a  
reasonable buying price.
