**TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite (PIA) –** The local government of Amadeo issued Executive Order No. 24, an order amending E.O. #23 s. 2021, which places identified puroks in Barangays Maitim, Loma, Maymangga, and Halang under localized granular lockdown effective 6pm of September 2 until 6pm of September 12, 2021.

This developed

in the wake of the alarming increase in the number of CoViD-19 cases recorded in the municipality with current data from the Rural Health Office of 191 active cases as of September 1.

While EO No. 23 ordered the granular lockdown of Barangays Banaybanay, Pangil, Tamacan, and parts of Poblacion 6, succeeding EO No. 24 lifted the lockdown category of Barangays Maitim, Loma, May-

mangga, and Halang and instead placed Purok Gubat, Ilaya, Centro and Kanluran of Barangay Maitim 1st; Purok 2 and 3 of Barangay Loma; Purok 1 and 4 of Barangay Maymangga; Puroks 1, 3, 5 and 7 of Barangay Halang as Critical Zone areas.

Quarantine guidelines as ordered under EO No. 23 shall be in force such as the implementation of curfew

The first state-of-the-art training facility for government media workers and information officers is set to be built within the compound of the Northern Bukidnon State College (NBSC) in Manolo Fortich, Bukidnon.

Secretary Andanar bared that the PCOO project will be breaking ground this month, along with its partner agencies, including the local government of Manolo Fortich, the NBSC, and the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH).

# House approves anti-child marriage bill

MANILA – The House of Representatives on Monday (Sept.6) approved on final reading a measure seeking to end child marriages in the country.

With 197 affirmative votes, 0 negative votes, and 2 abstentions, the chamber passed on third and final reading House Bill 9943, which seeks to protect children by prohibiting and declaring child marriage as illegal and imposing penalties for violations.

Other unlawful acts would be the solemnization of child marriage and cohabitation of an adult with a child outside wedlock.

The proposed law would impose penalties against solemnizing officers, parents, guardians, or adults who fixed, facilitated, or arranged child marriage.

Deputy Speaker Bernadette Herrera, one of the authors of the bill, said child marriage denies children of their childhood, disrupts their education, and limits their opportunities.

Herrera cited the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) stating that in developing countries, nine out of 10 births to adolescent girls occur within a marriage or union and these girls are vulnerable to pregnancy-related complications, which are among the leading causes of mortality among adolescents around the world.

"Women and girls' development is hindered by CEFM (child and early forced marriages) as married girls most likely drop out of school and lose the chance to be educated and gain skills and knowledge which will help her gain a good job and earn for herself and her family," Herrera said.

She said the perpetration of violence and gender inequality is another negative impact of CEFM.

Albay Rep. Edcel Lagman, another author of the bill, said the United Nations World Population Prospect ranks the Philippines as the 10th country with the highest absolute number of child marriages at 808,000 in 2019.

"The country's adverse situation is due to the practice of child marriage by Filipino Muslims and indigenous peoples, in addition to co-habitations outside wedlock or illicit live-in unions involving adult men and young girls, which the bill now proscribes," Lagman said. Lagman said the deleterious effects of child marriage include vitiating marital consent because either or both the child bride or groom are underage to give valid consent; violating

## Participatory Guarantee System: Susi sa Sertipikasyon at Akreditasyon sa Organikong Pagsasaka

Ang Agricultural Training Institute (ATI) Region IV-A sa pakikipagtulungan sa Department of Agriculture (DA) Region IV-A ay nagsagawa ng Training of Trainers on Participatory Guarantee System (PGS) para sa lalawigan ng Quezon. Ang labinlimang (15) kalahok ay binuo ng mga kinatawan mula sa Office of the Provincial Agriculturist - Quezon at Southern Luzon State University kasama ang mga magsasakang miyembro ng Quezon PGS mula sa Sariaya, Lucban at Tayabas. Layunin ng pagsasanay na mapalawak ang kaalaman ng mga kalahok ukol sa pagtatatag at operasyon ng PGS na naaayon sa Republic Act 11511 o Act amending the Organic Agriculture (OA) Act. Ang pagsasanay ay naganap noong ika-16 hanggang ika-27 ng Agosto, 2021.

Sa loob ng sampung (10) araw na pagsasanay, ipinaliwanag sa mga kalahok ang Module 1 to Module 5 ukol sa PGS. Nagsilbing tagapagtalakay ang mga nagsipagtapos ng Specialist Training Course on PGS na sina G. Arnaldo Gonzales, G. Jun Villarante, Bb. Crissel Tenolete mula sa DA Region IV-A; Soledad E. Leal mula sa ATI Region IV-A; at G. Philip Reyes, OA consultant. Gayundin ay nagkaroon ng online discussion at workshops kung saan gumawa ang grupo ng draft ng kanilang Manual of Operations na magsisilbing gabay ng PGS Group sa kanilang pagsisimula. Layunin ng nasabing grupo na sila ay makapag-apply para sa sertipikasyon at akreditasyon ng Bureau of Agriculture and Fisheries Standards (BAFS) bago matapos ang taong ito.

Sa pagtatapos ng pagsasanay, nagbigay ng mensahe si Gng. Eda F. Dimapilis, Regional OA Focal Person ng DA Region IV-A at G. Manuel Dimalaluan, OA Focal Person mula sa ATI Central Office. said. This would also be open to media workers in the private sector who want to take part in the training programs.

"Training programs include broadcasting and writing, among others. This profession is a vocation. It's really something that you do because you believe in public service, in informing the people through development communication," he added.

The GCA was supposed to start construction last year, however funds and other documentary requirements were yet to be complied with until now.

Secretary Andanar said that big-ticket projects under the PCOO would have not been realized without the support of the President. Among these is the Mindanao Media Hub in Davao City, the first government media hub outside of Metro Manila. A Visayas Media Hub will also be constructed with its initial budget already approved.

"We will finally have a Government Communications Academy and this is because of President Rodrigo Duterte, who supports all of our programs," he said.

He went on to enumerate other initiatives of the PCOO, especially on policy development. The agency is firm on promoting the welfare of media workers in the country and has been one of the partners in pushing for the passage of a Media Workers Welfare bill.

Other policies passed at the legislative branch are the Freedom of Information Bill and the People's Broadcasting Corporations Bill. (PCOO)

## OCD vows continued support to Bacoor quarantine efforts

MANILA – To address the concerns of Bacoor City Mayor Lani Mercado raised regarding difficulties in managing the quarantine of her Covid-19 affected constituents, Office of Civil Defense (OCD) head and National Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council (NDRRMC) executive director, Undersecretary Ricardo Jalad, on Thursday directed the provision of additional support to the city.

These will be done while the procurement process to engage the services of additional quarantine facilities (hotels) is in progress.

OCD Calabarzon reported that the temporary treatment and monitoring facilities (TTMFs) in the region can still accommodate more individuals. The Calabarzon TTMFs can house a total of 6,900 individuals with only 2,500 (35 percent) occupants currently admitted.

"The national government has opened these TTMFs to ensure that LGUs (local government units) will not be overwhelmed with the responsibility of taking care of their Covid-19 affected constituents. We will ensure that the Bacoor LGU and all other LGUs will be able to avail of this service," Jalad said.

"OCD-Calabarzon is in close communication with the office of

In a meeting done with OCD officials, OCD Calabarzon head Ma. Theresa Escolano reported that they have been closely working with the city in the management of their Covid-19 situation since the start of the pandemic operations.

During the meeting, Jalad directed Escolano to ensure that the additional positive cases in Bacoor will be housed in all available quarantine facilities in the region as well as provide other support such as the fuel

for the transport vehicles and the needs of those in quarantine.

Mayor Lani Mercado so that we can continue supporting them while Bacoor is still preparing the proposal for the engagement of additional facilities," Escolano said.

Meanwhile, the Calabarzon Regional Interagency Task Force (RITF), through the Department of Social Welfare and Development, provided additional 4,000 family food packs earlier this August to the Bacoor to support the intensified granular lockdowns.

The Department of Education-Calabarzon, on the other hand, also committed the avail-

**Camp BGen Pantaleon Garcia, Imus City, Cavite – Cavite Police Provincial Office arrested 58 individuals in Anti-Criminality Drive and 8,397 GCQ violators were recorded over the last 24 hours of Sept 6.**

In the campaign against illegal drugs, six (6) individuals were arrested in 3 buy-bust and 1 other drug related operations in Bacoor City, Dasmariñas City, Trece Martires City and Kawit. Police confiscated 11 pieces of small size heat-sealed transparent plastic sachets containing white crystalline substance suspected as shabu, drug money and other drug parapherna-

Quarantine passes shall be issued by barangay officials in the affected barangays to only one qualified member of the household, aged 19 - 64 years old. Authorized Persons Outside of Residence (APORs) need not acquire Q-Passes, which are effective only between 6am – 8am and 4pm – 5:30pm within their respective barangays.

Public transportation within the municipality shall be available to APORs and for emergency use only.

Main roads in affected areas shall remain passable, while road

# Pope Francis: Find time for silence with the Gospel every day

VATICAN— Pope Francis said Sunday (Sept 5) that silent prayer with the Gospel is the “secret to spiritual health.”

“Do we remember to listen to the Lord? We are Christians, but sometimes with the thousands of words we hear every day, we do not find a few seconds to let a few words of the Gospel resound in us,” the pope said in his Angelus address on Sept. 4.

“Jesus is the Word: if we do not stop to listen to Him, He passes on. ... But if we dedicate time to the Gospel, we will find the secret to our spiritual health.”

Speaking from the window of the Vatican’s Apostolic Palace, the pope told the pilgrims gathered in St. Peter’s Square that spending time in silence with the Gospel is like “medicine” for one’s spiritual life.

“Every day a little silence and listening, fewer useless words, and more of the Word of God,” Pope Francis recommended.

He said that it is a good thing to turn to the Lord with prayer requests, but above all, it is important to listen to the Lord.

“Jesus asks this

of us. In the Gospel when they ask Him what is the first commandment, he answers: ‘Hear, O Israel.’ Then he adds ... ‘You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart ... and your neighbor as yourself’ (Mk 12:28-31). But first of all, he says, ‘Hear, O Israel,’” the pope explained.

Pope Francis said that today many people have “an interior deafness” that Jesus can touch and heal. This “deafness of heart” can lead to a deadening of awareness of the needs of those around us, he said.

“Taken up with haste, by so many things to say and do, we cannot find time to stop and listen to those who speak to us. We run the risk of becoming impervious to everything and not making room for those who need to be heard. I am thinking about children, young people, the elderly, the many who have less need for words and preaching, and more to be heard,” Francis said.

“Let us ask ourselves: how is my capacity to listen? Am I touched by people’s lives, do I know how to spend time with those close to me?”

The pope said that this especially applies to priests, who need to be

attentive to listening to the people in their parishes.

He said it also applies family life, where there can be a temptation to speak without really listening.

At the end of his Angelus address, the pope prayed for the people of Afghanistan and for hurricane victims in the United States.

Pope Francis also applauded Mother Teresa’s Missionaries of Charity for their “heroic service” on the feast of St. Teresa of Calcutta.

The pope expressed hope that his attendance at the International Eucharistic Congress in Budapest next Sunday and his visit to Slovakia will be days “marked by adoration and prayer in the heart of Europe.”

“Jesus, I wish to be open to your Word ... Jesus, heal my heart from being closed, heal my heart from haste, heal my heart from impatience,” the pope prayed.

“May the Virgin Mary, open to listening to the Word which became flesh in her, help us every day to listen to her Son in the Gospel and our brothers and sisters with a docile heart, with a patient heart, and with an attentive heart.”

ability of their schools for conversion into isolation facilities if the need arises. The Department of Public Works and Highways is also building additional isolation facilities.

“We stick to the Bayanihan approach in dealing with this concern. OCD will continue to help the people of Bacoor as before, with the cooperation and assistance of

its LGU, led by Mayor Lani Mercado, and our colleague agencies in government such as the DepEd, DOH (Department of Health), DPWH, DSWD,” Jalad said.

“We will continue to execute our Covid-19 Response duties in support of the national effort without sacrificing the integrity of our systems. We will strictly adhere

to the prescribed procedures in RA 9184 (Procurement Law),” he added.

Jalad’s office has yet to receive the proposal documents such as the program of expenditure and other particulars relating to the request to open additional quarantine facilities mentioned by Mercado in her interview. (PR)
