Revilla pushes for expansion of Mandatory Immunization Program



Sen. Bong Revilla is seeking for the expansion of the coverage of the mandatory basic immunization program to help prevent the spread of polio and other diseases.

The veteran legislator filed a bill (S. No. 662), "An Act Expanding the Coverage of the Mandatory Basic Immunization Program and Providing a System in the Determination of other types of Vaccine-Preventable Diseases," to amend the purpose of R.A. 10152, or the "Mandatory Infants and Children Health Immunization Act of 2011."

During the observance of the World Immunization Week last April, UNICEF revealed that an estimated 2.9 million Filipino children are unvaccinated, and remain vulnerable to deadly diseases such as measles, rubella and polio. While the increase of the immunization program coverage remains a challenge, Bong Revilla wants to address the insufficient list of mandatory basic immunization to completely protect the infants and children.

Once Republic Act 10152 is amended, vaccinations for Rotavirus, Japanese Encephalitis (JE), Pneumococcal Conjugate

Vaccine (PCV), and Fluman Papilloma Virus (FIPV) will be included in the list of annual vaccines given by the government. The inclusion of the vaccines in the list will be very beneficial not only for the health of infants and children, but also for the mothers who can avail of it for free in any government hospital or health center.

This bill also mandates the Formulary Execu-

tive Council (FEC) and the National Immunization Committee (NIC) to make recommendations to the Secretary of Health as to other types of vaccines that should be included in the list, and to provide technical support for the National Immunization Program of the Department of Health (DOH).

Revilla also deemed the bill necessary after DOH declared a National Dengue Outbreak last month, and after two cases of polio have been recently reported.

Bishop urges strong response to polio epidemic

A Catholic bishop has called on the government to take immediate action amid a polio epidemic or outbreak in the country.

Bishop Broderick Pabillo, the auxiliary of Manila, said efforts must be made to eliminate the disease, such as by achieving high rates of vaccination of children.

The Department of Health recently confirmed the return of the dreaded disease after two decades of being a polio-free country.

"It is very sad that there is a re-emergence of polio after having eliminated it for many years," Pabillo said.

"This tells us that we should not let down our guard in fighting diseases," he said.

The prelate also joined the calls for parents to have their kids vaccinated amid a polio epidemic in the country.

He said that there is no place for complacency when it comes to keeping the country polio-free.

"We encourage parents to have their children vaccinated against polio," Pabillo said.

The bishop said the fear of the parents will have to be addressed by educating the public about the polio vaccine "that it is safe and necessary"

"DOH should also be warned to be very transparent in its programs to gain the trust of the people and to allay their fears," he added.

The agency earlier confirmed two polio cases in the country affecting a three-year-old girl in Lanao del Sur and a fiveyear-old boy in Laguna.

Polio is a highly contagious disease caused by a virus that invades the nervous system causing paralysis and on rare occasion, the DOH said, can be fatal.

The disease mostly affects children under the age of 5 and is transmitted by person-to-person.

While there is no cure, the virus is preventable by vaccine, according to health officials.

With the ultimate goal to achieve zero percent maternal and infant death rate in the province, Naic Municipal Health Office led by Dr. Susan Anselmo-Se, the Department of Health and the Provincial Health Office joined hands to conduct the Buntis Congress 2019 dubbed as "Para sa Ligtas na Panganganak, sa Health Center o Hospital Dapat" which was attended by 115 pregnant women on September 17, 2019 at Daluyan Community Resource Center Brgy. Malainen Bago in the municipality of Naic.

Dr. Se, in her welcome remarks, expressed her gratefulness to the expectant mothers for showing their willingness to learn more about having a healthy pregnancy. She said that in order to save lives, one must undergo regular prenatal checkup to know the condition and position of the baby in the womb.

Likewise, Mayor Junio Dualan also graced the program and advised them that it is beneficial for the parents to value the importance of proper birth spacing and family planning to provide for the needs of every child.

During the program, short video clips showing the significance of family planning, HIV screening, newborn screening and breastfeeding were played to intensify and promote awareness on good nutrition and health for the mother and child before, during and after pregnancy. Meanwhile, Philippine Health Insurance Corporation Representative, Ms. Aleli Ramento discussed the PhilHealth membership process and benefits.

Participants also enjoyed some services offered in the event such as free oral prophylaxis performed by Provincial Oral Health Coordinator Dr. Mary Ann Montenegro along with Dr. Cristy Lim, Dr. Suzette Pulido and MHO dentists; free HIV counselling and screening by Prov'l HIV-AIDS Coordinator Ms. Haydelisa Maderazo, Asst. Prov'l TB Program Coordinator/TBHIV Nurse Mr. Raffy Macdonald and MHO technical staff; and some laboratory services such as free HIV Testing and Blood Typing rendered by Ms. Jennifer S. Casamar, MedTech II of MHO with the assistance of Lab Aide Ms. Myla D. Armendi. They also received free maternity set and giveaways from Mega Soft Hygienic Products and Huggies.

Highlights of the program was the Search for Gandang Buntis 2019 participated by 16 candidates from different barangays. Ms. Chemarie Faustino of Brgy. enter the labor force especially on the socio-emotional skills that will be in need such as communication, creative thinking, collaboration, and problem solving."

Jalbuena pointed out that educators must further innovate on teaching soft-skills rather than prepare the students for jobs that would not exist in the near future.

Special guest speaker Labor and Employment Assistant Secretary Mariano R. Alquiza described the need to produce "future-ready workforce" based on data from the World Economic Forum's Report on the Future of Jobs. The report said that about 7M jobs will be lost due to automation while the International Labor Organization predicts that about half of jobs in five Southeast Asian countries which includes the Philippines are at high risk of being affected by automation.

Mr. Alquiza said that "to produce a future-ready workforce, we must change our approaches towards the holistic development of education and training and our view of learning more generally."

He further encouraged everyone to continue the great work that has been done relative to the reforms in education, training, and employment and stressed that all having a stake on this, "We must come and work together to be able to minimize the negative effects and harness the benefits of Industry 4.0."

JobsFit 2022 Labor Market Information Report highlighted that with Industry 4.0, emerging jobs include business process analysts, mobile app developers, search engine optimization analysts, and social media analysts.

Relevant topics tackled included: Gearing up for the Future of Work: Harnessing the Impacts of the Fourth Industrial Revolution; Role of Career Guidance and Employment Coaching in Shaping the Future Workforce; Developing the Future Workforce: The Academe Perspectives; and Mental Health and Socio-Emotional Skills Development in the Digital-Age.

These topics will help the participant stakeholders to be better informed and competent to continuously shape their students on becoming more employable and adaptive to a productive employment.
