Camp BGen Pantaleon Garcia, Imus City, Cavite — Naninindigan ang Philippine National Police (PNP) sa kanilang matibay na pangako na pangalagaan ang buhay at tiyakin ang kaligtasan ng publiko sa pamamagitan ng mahigpit na pagpapatupad ng One-Strike Policy laban sa indiscriminate firing. Binibigyang-diin ng patakarang ito ang zero-tolerance na tindig ng PNP laban sa iresponsableng paggamit ng baril, lalo na tuwing may mga pagdiriwang at espesyal na okasyon kung kailan mas mataas ang panganib sa kaligtasan ng publiko.

Sa ilalim ng direktibang ito, ang sinumang kawani ng pulis na mapatunayang sangkot sa indiscriminate firing ay agad at walang pag-aalinlangang pananagutin. Walang ikalawang pagkakataon—ang mga lalabag ay haharap sa kaukulang kasong kriminal, administratibo, at panloob na disciplinaryong aksyon alinsunod sa umiiral na mga batas at regulasyon ng PNP. DHSUD eyes stronger 2026 rollout of Expanded 4PH, housing reforms

MANILA – The Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD) said it is entering 2026 with a strengthened housing roadmap, banking on reforms and expanded programs rolled out in the second half of 2025 to accelerate the delivery of safe, decent, and affordable homes.

DHSUD Secretary Jose Ramon Aliling said the gains recorded toward the end of 2025 have laid a solid foundation for a more responsive housing and real estate sector in 2026, particularly with streamlined processes, stronger inter-agency collaboration, and an ex-

panded flagship housing program.

"Sa pagpasok ng Bagong Taon, asahan po ninyo ang mas mabilis, malinis at maasahang serbisyo mula sa DHSUD (As we welcome the New Year, you can expect faster, cleaner, and more reliable services from the DHSUD)," Aliling said, adding that the department is now focused on sustaining and intensifying implementation.

"Tumatakbo na po ng maayos ang ating mga programa, kailangan na lamang i-sustain at paigtingin pa ang implementasyon (Our programs are already running smoothly, what is

needed now is to sustain and further intensify their implementation)."

Aliling assumed office in May 2025 and laid down an eight-point agenda anchored on transformative, proactive, and collaborative leadership, which began yielding results in the latter part of the year.

Among the key developments was the issuance of Revenue Memorandum Order 048-2025 by the Department of Finance and the Bureau of Internal Revenue, which established a more uniform process for tax exemptions for socialized housing projects.

Philippines to host ASEAN–Korea ROUND Festival in 2026

The Philippines is set to take center stage in regional cultural exchange as it hosts the ASEAN-Korea Music Festival 2026, widely known as the ROUND Festival, on April 18 and 19 at the Araneta Coliseum in Manila.

The National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA), in partnership with KBS WORLD and the ROUND Secretariat, announced that the festival will be staged in the country as part of the Philippines' role as ASEAN Chair for

2026. The hosting marks a milestone for Philippine cultural diplomacy, positioning music as a bridge that connects ASEAN communities and South Korea.

Launched in 2020 by Korean public broadcaster KBS, the ROUND Festival has grown into a platform that celebrates contemporary music while encouraging mutual understanding among nations. With the Philippines serving as host, organizers expect the 2026 edition to be the most expansive yet, reflecting the country's active role in promoting people-to-people ties across the region.

The Araneta Coliseum, long regarded as a landmark of Filipino popular culture, will serve as the venue for the two-day festival. Korean singer-songwriter



er 10CM, recognized for his contributions to popular Korean drama soundtracks, has been confirmed as festival host and is also set to perform for audiences in Manila.

To formally launch the festival, a production press conference will be held on Jan. 28, 2026, at the

Quantum Skyview Deck in Gateway Mall. Filipino pop groups HORIZON and KAIA will take part in the event as presenters, offering a preview of the collaborative spirit that will define the festival.

In line with the festival's goal of accessibility and cultural inclusion, admission to the

nand Marcos Jr.'s push to amplify the implementation of Republic Act No 9262, or the Anti-VAWC Act, to safeguard women and children from any form of violence.

According to the DILG, from September to November 2025, the National Call Center received almost 600 VAWC emergency calls. The DILG added that through efficient coordination with first responders and law enforcers, domestic assault incidents were intercepted, and due process was upheld through pursuing legal remedies.

In Makati City, a concerned neighbor reported to 911 an ongoing violent altercation between a married couple. With the wife being threatened by her husband using a dead-

ly weapon, every second matters to prevent further assault. In no time, the Bantay Bayan personnel arrived at the scene and brought the involved parties to the nearest police station to process their VAWC case.

In Masbate City, an alleged rape incident was reported, wherein a minor's sensitive video was circulated online. As the case covers both VAWC and the Anti-Photo and Video Voyeurism Act, the victim was immediately referred to the Women and Children Protection Desk (WCPD) and the Cyber-crime Division for prompt intervention.

Meanwhile, the immediate arrest of the suspect in the alleged battered wife and child abuse incident at Negros

Occidental was facilitated through the 911 hotline. The caller sought police assistance to save the GBV victims while the case was filed at the WCPD for proper disposition.

A joint agreement between the DILG, Department of Justice (DOJ), and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) institutionalized the inclusion of GBV emergency and distress calls in the 911 hotline to streamline referral and response pathways. With the government's inclusive emergency response, the culture of silence surrounding VAWC victims can be resolved, as 911 provides a safe space to report domestic abuse while giving assurance of an immediate response within minutes.

ATI CALABARZON Trains Over 7,000 Farmers, Agri Stakeholders in 2025

In 2025, the Department of Agriculture (DA) capacity builder, the Agricultural Training Institute (ATI) in CALABARZON, equipped a total of 7,084 individuals with the knowledge and skills necessary to help steer a competitive and prosperous agriculture and fisheries sectors towards a vibrant economy.

As the catalyst and knowledge bank of the Philippine agriculture and fishery extension (AFE) system, the DA-ATI CALABARZON trained 4,783 farmers; 1,209 agricultural extension workers (AEWs) from various local government units; 555 DA staff; and 537 students, agri-enthusiasts, and individuals from the general public.

Training and other extension initiatives by the DA-ATI CALABARZON primarily focused on good agricultural practices, farm mechanization, climate-resilient agriculture, smart farming, and integrated nutrient and pest management.

These programs were not limited to the production aspect, as the agency also equipped the aforementioned individuals with technologies along the agricultural value chain, including post-harvest technologies, processing, and marketing—across different banner programs like rice, corn, livestock, Coconut Farmers and Industry Development Plan (CFIDP), High Value Crops Development Program (HVCDP), organic agriculture, and National Urban and Peri-urban Agriculture Program (NUPAP), and additional extension services.

"Sobra po ang pasasalamat ko sa ATI CALABARZON dahil ine-ensure po nila na may bago silang kaalamang naihahatid at nakakarating po ito sa aming mga farmers. Sa training na ito, privilege po para sa akin na matuto at ma-experience 'yung mga hands-on kung paano ba bumuo ng cacao-coconut fusion products, na totoo pong helpful para mas ma-maximize pa 'yung gamit ng raw materials and ma-improve 'yung pwedeng pagkakitaan ng mga farmers," said Carla Pante, one of the farmer participants who shared her impression of the Training on Coconut and Cacao Fusion: Value Chain-based Product Development and Market Integration last July.

John Mark Sto. Domingo, an agricultural and biosystems engineer from Teresa, Rizal, also shared how the DA-ATI CALABARZON helps extension workers like him in performing their duties at the grassroots level.

In his impression of the Training on Testing and Evaluation of Agricultural and Fisheries Machinery held last June, he said: "This training is a great help for me to understand how procurement and acceptance testing work in acquiring farm machinery. That's why every one of us ay sobrang eager ding pumasa – 'cause it will give us a chance to evaluate the machinery that we're acquiring more thoroughly. Because in the end, we want our farmers to receive those interventions na up-to-standards and fit talaga sa kung ano ang needs nila."

Moreover, social technologies, including training facilitation and management, and extension communication, were also imparted to participants, especially AEWs, farmer-leaders, and farm cooperators

These accomplishments reflect the unwavering dedication of the DA-ATI CALABARZON in empowering its stakeholders through a resilient and responsive agriculture and fisheries extension system in the region.

Meanwhile, Dr. Rolando Maningas, Center Director of the DA-ATI CALABARZON, shared a glimpse of the agency's plans as it gears towards 2026.

"For 2026, we will solidify our efforts to modernize and mechanize the agri-fishery sector by reinforcing technologies, innovations, quality extension services, inclusivity, and skills-based trainings that respond to the evolving needs of our farmers and fishers," said Dr. Maningas.

He added, "At the same time, we will strengthen our role as a nexus in empowering and catalyzing our extension workers as key change agents in the region, ensuring that our services and their impacts are met on the ground and will truly lead to 'masaganang agrikultura at maunlad na ekonomiya.'"

DSWD IV-A builds stronger pathways for 4Ps families through multi-sector partnerships

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna — The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) Field Office IV-A continues to reinforce its commitment to empowering Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) households by widening access to education, employment, and healthcare services through strategic partnerships across the CALABARZON region.

On December 15, 2025, the regional office entered into new partnership agreements with five institutions from the education, training, and health sectors—National University (NU) Dasmariñas, University of Batangas, Dualtech Training Center Foundation, Inc., Technovative Training Center, Inc., and San Antonio Medical Center of Lipa, Inc.

Assistant Regional Director Mylah Gatchalian said the partnerships are aligned with the Department's thrust

to equip 4Ps beneficiaries with the necessary skills, knowledge, and health support needed to achieve self-reliance as they prepare for transition or graduation from the program.

"These collaborations strengthen our capacity to deliver more responsive and comprehensive services, particularly in education, skills development, and health, which are critical to improving the long-term outcomes of 4Ps households," Gatchalian noted.

Through the partnership, NU Dasmariñas and the University of Batangas will extend scholarship opportunities, competency-building initiatives, and community-based programs that aim to enhance the academic performance and employability of 4Ps college students.

Meanwhile, Dualtech Training Center Foundation, Inc. and

Technovative Training Center, Inc. will provide enterprise-based training programs designed to link technical education with actual industry requirements, offering beneficiaries pathways toward certification and employment through partner companies.

Dualtech Training Center President Engr. Jerry Web Muhi emphasized the broader impact of the collaboration, stating that the initiative seeks to develop learners who can contribute meaningfully to their communities and to national development.

To further support the well-being of 4Ps families, San Antonio Medical Center of Lipa, Inc. will deliver medical assistance and preventive healthcare services, helping reduce health-related expenses that often hinder economic progress.

Bam Aquino: 2026 nat’l budget a huge win for education, Filipino youth

With P1.35 trillion earmarked for education – the largest education fund in Philippine history – the 2026 national budget marks a major victory for education and the Filipino youth, Senator Bam Aquino stressed.

According to Aquino, who voted in favor of the ratification of the 2026 national budget, the historic allocation will translate into concrete support for students nationwide.

"Mas maraming estudyanteng makikina-bang sa dagdag na si-lid-aralan at libreng pag-kain, pati na sa pinataas na pondo para sa libreng kolehiyo, at pinansiyal na tulong sa RLE ng nursing at health science students," said Aquino, chairperson of the Senate Committee on Basic Education.

The P1.35-trillion education budget – higher than the about P1 trillion in 2025 – includes P67 billion for the imple-

mentation of Republic Act No. 10931, or the Free College Law which he authored. The amount includes additional fund-ing for Tertiary Education Subsidy (TES) or allow-ance for underprivileged students.

The budget also allocates P68 billion for classroom construction (up from P18 billion), and P25.6 billion for the School-Based Feeding Program (up from P11.7 billion).

Included in the 2026 national budget was Aquino's proposal for the allocation of P500 million under the Mainte-nance and Other Oper-ating Expenses (MOOE) of the Higher Education Development Program, specifically allotted for Fi-nancial Support for RLE Requirements in Allied Health Sciences Pro-grams.

The senator also expressed his gratitude to the various groups and individuals who helped

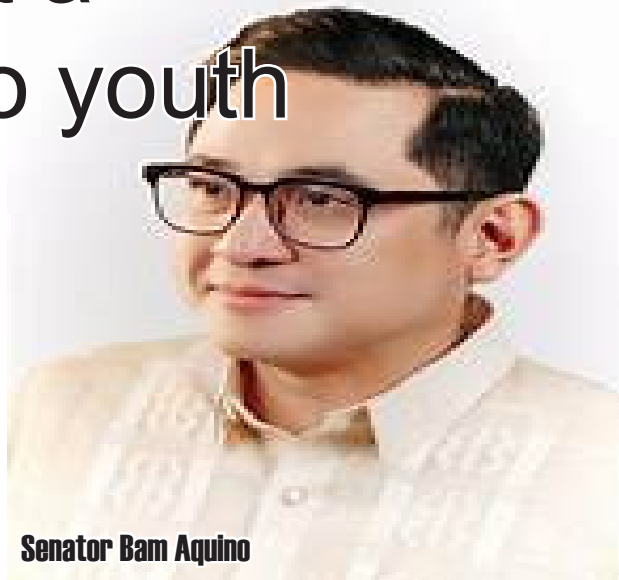
monitor and safeguard the budget process.

However, Aquino emphasized that the re-sponsibility does not end with the passage of the budget, saying the public must remain vigilant to ensure that the fund will be implemented properly.

"Subalit hindi rito nagtatapos ang ating

tungkulin. Patuloy tayong maging mapagbantay upang matiyak na ang pondo ay magagamit nang tama at hindi ma-pupunta sa balsa ng mga tiwali sa pamahalaan," he said.

"Sama-sama nating siguruhin na ang pondo ay mapupunta sa edukasyon—hindi sa ko-rapsyon," he added.

Over 4.5M workers benefit from wage hikes in 14 regions

MANILA – More than 4.5 million minimum wage earners in the pri-vate sector benefited from wage hikes in 14 regions in 2025.

According to the data from the De-partment of Labor and Employment (DOLE) re-leased on Wednesday, the wage adjustments ranging from PHP20 to PHP100 were issued consistent with the pol-icy of the National Wages and Productivity Com-mission (NWPC) on reg-ular, moderate and pre-dictable minimum wage increases.

The 14 Region-al Tripartite Wages and Productivity Boards (RTWPBs) namely: National Capital Re-gion (NCR), Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR), Regions 1 (Ilo-cos), 2 (Cagayan Val-ley), 3 (Central Luzon), Calabarzon, Mimaropa, 6 (Western Visayas), 7 (Central Visayas), 8 (Eastern Visayas), 9 (Zamboanga Peninsula), 10 (Northern Mindanao), 12 (Soccsksargen) and 13 (Caraga), have is-sued their respective Wage Orders this year.

Pay hike for kasam-bahays

It also report-ed that 11 wage orders granting monthly mini-mum wage increases for domestic workers were also issued by RTWPBs in CAR and Regions 1, 2, 3 Mimaropa, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11 and 13.

The increases range from PHP300 to PHP2,000 per month, benefitting 755,000 do-mestic workers in 2025.

The DOLE add-ed that wage orders were issued in consul-tation with workers and employers to ensure bal-ance between protection and needs, reasonable returns on investments and employment gener-ation.

At the same time, it said about 8 mil-lion full-time wage and salary workers earn-ing above the minimum wage are also expected to indirectly benefit from wage adjustments at the enterprise level, arising from the correction of wage distortions.

Wage distortion occurs when the imple-mentation of a mandat-ed wage increase (i.e. wage order) results in the elimination or severe contraction of intentional quantitative differences in wage or salary rates between and among em-ployee groups in an es-tablishment.

The NWPC has issued Advisory No. 01, Series of 2023 which provides guidance to correct possible wage distortions.

Productivity initia-tives

RTWPBs were also instructed to roll out productivity improve-ment programs and gainsharing schemes designed to foster sus-tainable and long-term wage growth.

As of November 2025, the NWPC and the RTWPBs have provided productivity and orienta-tion to 28,115 MSMEs, benefitting 32,211 em-ployers and workers across the country.

Of this number, 3,525 MSMEs have suc-cessfully implemented their action plans, trans-lating knowledge into ac-tual and measurable pro-ductivity improvements in workplaces.

The DOLE, through the NWPC, has provided guidelines for an exemption mecha-nism for calamity-affected enterprises following the several typhoons that hit the country and caused significant chal-lenges to businesses in affected areas.

Enterprises may inquire and apply through the RTWPB with jurisdiction over their business areas whether they may be eligible for a full exemption or for a specific minimum wage tranche, if any.

Likewise, DOLE urged businesses and workers to avail of existing DOLE programs, such as the Adjustment Measures Program (AMP), and take full advantage of the opportunities avail-able to reduce and miti-gate vulnerabilities from economic disruptions, including those resulting from natural calamities.

A total of 1,754 MSMEs also received technical assistance in designing and formulat-ing Productivity-Based Incentive Schemes (PBIS). PBIS is a work-place-initiated program on improving the pro-ductivity of workers and enterprises to generate savings or additional revenues, which can be shared by enterprises with their workers.

The programs are focused on particular areas with lower produc-tivity levels, and where implementation of these programs can signifi-cantly enhance overall efficiency. source:(PNA)

This followed the release of Joint Memo-randum Circular 2025-001 by the DHSUD and the Department of Econ-omy, Planning and De-velopment adjusting the price ceiling for social-ized housing under the Expanded Pambansang Pabahay Para sa Pilipino (4PH) Program.

The DHSUD also forged data-sharing agreements with the De-partment of Science and Technology, and the De-partment of Environment and Natural Resources to support risk-informed and climate-resilient ur-ban planning and signed a memorandum of agree-ment with the Depart-ment of Social Welfare and Development to en-roll graduating Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Pro-gram (4Ps) beneficiaries into the Expanded 4PH.

"Patuloy po tay-ong makikipag-ugnayan sa ibang ahensya ng gobyerno pati na rin sa private sector upang mas paghusayin ang ating serbisyo (We will continue to work closely with other government agencies as well as the private sector to further improve our services)," Ailing said.

Internally, the department addressed more than 3,800 back-logged regulatory con-cerns and adopted a zero-tolerance policy against corruption, while pushing forward a digital-ization roadmap aimed at fully digitized processes by 2028.

"Even 1 percent of corruption should not be tolerated," he added.

A major focus for 2026 is the scaled-up implementation of the Expanded 4PH Program, which has been recal-i-brated to cover not only vertical housing but also horizontal developments, rental housing, the en-hanced community mort-gage program (ECMP), incremental housing, temporary shelters, and high-density housing for highly urbanized areas.

Ailing cited that low-income families, in-formal settlers, and those living in danger zones as priority beneficiaries of the government.

Under the ECMP, 34 project sites nationwide have been re-ceived, projected to bene-fit about 35,000 individ-uals through collective land acquisition.

Rental housing projects are also be-ing expanded, with at least 10 more set to be launched in the first quar-ter of 2026 following pilot initiatives in Quezon City, Negros Occidental, and state university campus-es.

The DHSUD like-wise fast-tracked the dis-position of lands covered by long-standing pres-idential proclamations, distributing certificates of entitlement and lot awards to around 5,000 families, while strength-ening in-city, high-densi-ty housing solutions for informal settler families.

The agency ex-pressed optimism that the reforms and part-nerships forged in 2025 will translate into faster project rollouts and wid-er access to housing. source:(PNA)

Upon receipt of a call, incidents are immediately assessed, verified, and relayed to the appropriate responders, law enforcement units, and partner agencies.

From timely dispatch, coordinated response, and proper handling of these sensitive incidents, the central emergency hotline fulfills President Ferdi-
