## Calabarzon students get first hand info on COVID-19 from DOH

**CALABARZON**—The Department of Health Region (DOH) 4A continues its intensified health education campaign now targeting various schools in the region to extend awareness and proper information on the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) to help reduce fear and worry among students including their families.

DOH 4A Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo said proper education and information on COVID-19 would help students to prevent the disease and avoid confusion and panic.

“Ang mga eskuwelahan lalo na ang mga pribado ay itinuturing na entry at exit point ng corona virus dahil

sa mga dayuhang estudyante at kasama na dito ang iba pang madalas lumalabas ng bansa upang umuwi o magbakasyon,” Janairo said.

“CALABARZON has no confirmed case of COVID-19 yet but health measures to contain and prevent its spread are in place should there be a need to implement an emergency procedure,” he assured.

He added that the Rapid Response Unit (RRT) composed of Emerging and Re-emerging Infectious Disease Program (EREID), Health Emergency Management Service (HEMS), Health Education and Promotion Unit (HEPU) and the Regional Ep-

idemiology and Surveillance Unit (RESU) is making rounds in various schools to educate students on COVID-19.

A series of lectures about COVID-19, how it began, its symptoms, complications, transmission and prevention including national and global updates were given to grade 7 to grade 10 students including proper wearing and disposing of masks and hand washing.

Janairo encouraged students to help disseminate proper information to their families and avoid spreading fake news about the virus online.

The information dissemination in schools is also supported by CHED’s guide-

lines to prevent the spreads of COVID-19 issued on February 2020 which urged faculty members, staff, and students to avoid digesting and spreading fake news about the disease and are encouraged to only rely on and disseminate relevant information obtained from DOH and WHO via their official website.

It also directed students and personnel to strictly follow recommended preventive actions to prevent its spread, such as avoiding close contact with people who are sick, staying home when sick, covering mouth and nose when sneezing, cleaning and disinfecting frequently used objects, and sanitizing hands regularly. “We live in an environment polluted by too much verbal violence, by many offensive and harmful words, which the internet amplifies,” he explained.

“We are inundated with empty words, with advertisements, with subtle messages. We have become used to hearing everything about everyone and we risk slipping into a worldliness that atrophies our hearts.”

In this noise, “we struggle to distinguish the voice of the Lord who speaks to us, the

voice of conscience, of good,” the pope said.

According to Francis, the ‘desert’ of Lent, where we can be in conversation with the Lord, becomes a life-giving place.

He acknowledged that it is not easy to make space for silence in one’s heart, but invited everyone to imagine themselves in the desert, surrounded by a great silence, with “no noises, apart from the wind and our breath.”

“It is the absence of

words to make room for another Word, the Word of God,” he said.

Pointing again to the image of the desert, Pope Francis said it recalls what is essential, and how often in life people become surrounded by many useless things.

“We chase a thousand things that seem necessary and in reality are not. How good it would be for us to get rid of so many superfluous realities, to rediscover what matters, to find the faces of those around us!” he urged.

“Prayer, fasting, works of mercy: here is the road into the Lenten desert.”

The solitude of the desert also reminds us of the people around us who are lonely and abandoned, he said, saying the “path in the Lenten desert is a path of charity towards the weaker.”

He also said fasting is a way of seeking a simpler life by giving up superfluous, vain things. But, he warned, it is not about “slimming down.”

“In the desert one finds intimacy with God, the love of the Lord,” he stated. “The road that leads us from death to life opens up in the desert. We enter the desert with Jesus, we will go out savoring Easter...”

“Have courage.”

Volunteer medical professionals rendered medical and skin disease consultation, dental check-up and HIV counselling and screening to 231 inmates of the facility.

World Wildlife Day: Taking a holistic approach in wildlife conservation

The survival of iconic animals, such as elephants, orangutans, tigers, raptors, and horn-bills, to name a few, easily comes to mind when we talk about wildlife conservation. While the plight of endangered species gives conservationists, governments, and organisations more obvious reasons to work even harder, wildlife conservation goes beyond the protection of species and needs to be carried out in a holistic fashion.

From large predators feeding on small ones to bees that act as pollinators, all these that live in the wild are interconnected with each other and need further protection.

The theme of this year's World Wildlife Day celebration "Sustaining all life on Earth" reminds us of the bigger picture of wildlife, which encompasses wild animals and plant species and their habitats.

The ASEAN Centre for Biodiversity (ACB) stands in solidarity with the international community in celebrating this important occasion for all living things on the planet, especially at this crucial time when one million species are on the brink of extinction, according to the 2019 report of the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services.

In the ASEAN Region, the Red List Index (RLI) has been decreasing, albeit slowly, from 2006 at 0.8510 to 0.8485 in 2013, according to the data of the International Union for Conservation of Nature. This means the rate of species extinctions has increased in seven years. Lower RLI means higher rate of species extinctions.

There have been cases of local extinction in the past. The Helmeted hornbill or Rhinoplax vigil, which is native to six ASEAN Member States, namely Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, Singapore, and Thailand is considered extinct in Singapore and is listed as critically endangered species in the five other member states.

Late last year, the last Sumatran rhinoceros in Malaysia died, making the species extinct in the country. At present, there are only 80 remaining rhinos, all are living in Indonesia. These cases of local extinction and threats of species extinction are discomfiting, serving as a wake-up call for all of us. Conserving biodiversity in ASEAN is globally significant as data from the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species in 2019 show that 3,875 species, or 13 per cent of the species threatened with extinction globally, are found in the ASEAN region.

As the region is constantly challenged by wildlife trafficking and loss of natural habitats, actions at all levels are important. Thus, we commend the efforts of the ASEAN Member States in enforcing wildlife protection laws and improving habitats for wildlife.

In Thailand, a wildlife corridor built to connect Khao Yai National Park and Thap Lan National Park through added vegetation and improvement in the landscapes, has helped the movement of wildlife and increased the population size of at least five endangered species and five endemic species, according to Thailand's sixth national report recently submitted to the Convention on Biological Diversity.

In Malaysia, citizens, particularly the youth, are tapped to lead conservation-related efforts. Volunteers patrol the Sungai Yu Wildlife Corridor, which connects the greater Taman Negara landscape with the Titiwangsa range. They dismantle snares and report illegal logging activities and encroachment within the forest reserves. Certified divers have also been trained as 'EcoDivers' in Reef Check surveys that are conducted annually around the country.

With the ASEAN Member States, the ACB has made strides through programmes, such as the ASEAN Heritage Parks Programme, which supports wildlife conservation in the ASEAN by training park managers and protected area staff in effective protected area management, and providing opportunities for them for collaboration. The ACB also recognises the importance of livelihood opportunities through biodiversity-based products for members of communities who are often lured to illegal wildlife hunting and other environmental crimes.

Indeed, hope is empowering. With 2020 as "super year for nature and biodiversity," governments and stakeholders are working with optimism and vitality on the development of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework, which will guide the world's actions towards wildlife conservation and addressing biodiversity loss.

At the upcoming Third ASEAN Conference on Biodiversity or ACB 2020 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, this month with "Towards 2050: Living in harmony with nature" as the theme, representatives of the ASEAN will discuss key issues and best practices in wildlife conservation and sustainable management, among other topics like climate change, sustainable financing, and mainstreaming biodiversity. Outputs from the ACB 2020 will likewise feed into the region's unified position on the post-2020 global biodiversity framework.

An action-oriented and forward-looking biodiversity framework, together with initiatives on the ground, is crucial for a holistic and effective approach in protecting and conserving wildlife and their habitats. source:(TLM | ACB)

“Lent is the right time to make room for the Word of God. It is the time to turn off the television and open the Bible. It is the time to disconnect from your cell phone and connect to the Gospel,” the pope said last Feb. 26.

live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.”

This penitential period, he continued, is also the time to work on giving up gossip, rumors, and useless chatter, focusing instead on giving yourself to the Lord, who spent 40 days in the desert in fasting and prayer.

During Lent, Jesus is “calling us into the desert,” Francis explained. Jesus “invites us to listen to what matters. To the devil who tempted him, he replied: ‘Man does not

“Like bread, more than bread we need the Word of God, we need to speak with God: we need to pray,” he urged.

In his weekly general audience, which fell on Ash Wednesday, Pope Francis reflected on the “desert” of Lent and how countercultural it is to spend time in silence, away from the noisiness of modern life.
