Cavite PPO Red Team Conducts Polling Center Inspection in Imus City

Continuing its efforts to ensure a safe, peaceful, and orderly electoral process, the Cavite Police Provincial Office (PPO) Red Team, under the leadership of Police Colonel Dwight Alegre, conducted a Polling Center Inspection on May 5, 2025, at approximately 12:37 PM at Imus Pilot Elementary School, Imus City, Cavite.



The inspection was carried out in coordination with PLTCOL Chey Chey Ilano Saulog, Acting Chief of Police of the Imus City Component Police Station (CCPS). Duty personnel present at the site were Pat Jerwin Rodil and Pat Jemuel Villapando, who confirmed that the situation remained normal and peaceful during the activity.

The team was welcomed by School Principal Divina Narvaez, alongside an on-duty security guard. This inspection supported the Final Testing and Sealing (FTS) of the Automated Counting Machines (ACM) in preparation for the upcoming elections.

DA chief: Sustainable farming key to Philippine food security, growth

Agriculture Secretary Francisco P. Tiu Laurel Jr. has underscored the urgent need for the Philippines to adopt sustainable farming practices in light of intensifying challenges

posed by climate change, population growth, and shrinking farmlands.

"These challenges are not distant threats," the DA chief told the 2025 Sustainable Agriculture Forum

hosted by the European Chamber of Commerce of the Philippines. "They are here now, testing the resilience of our food systems and urging us to act with urgency and vision—one more creative

and adaptive than ever before," he said.

For an archipelagic nation situated along the Pacific Ring of Fire and directly facing the Pacific Ocean—both sources of extreme

weather—building a resilient agricultural sector is vital to ensuring long-term food security, economic stability, and inclusive job growth.

Tiu Laurel said transforming Philippine agriculture is no longer optional, but essential. As increasingly erratic

In line with the global observance of World Malaria Day, the Office of the Provincial Health Officer (OPHO) spearheaded a province-wide celebration held last April 28, 2025, at the Cavite Collaboration Center for Public Health in Trece Martires

City. The event gathered medical practitioners from various public and private hospitals, as well as Rural Health Units (RHUs) across the province, to reinforce the importance of malaria prevention and control.

The program officially commenced with

a warm welcome from Dr. Nelson Soriano, Provincial Health Officer I, who expressed his gratitude for the active participation of healthcare professionals in the fight against vector-borne diseases. He emphasized the significance of collaboration in

PhilHealth reminds mothers of benefit packages for safe pregnancy

MANILA – The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) on Wednesday encouraged expecting mothers to consult their doctors to ensure a healthy and safe pregnancy.

This call coincides with the country's celebration of Safe Motherhood Week from May 6 to 12. The celebration focuses on innovations for safer birth to address maternal mortality.

For safe pregnancy, mothers are advised to complete eight antenatal check-ups

—one in the first trimester, two in the second trimester, and five in the third trimester.

For safe delivery, mothers are urged to go to hospitals and other

the mother and the child in case of emergency during delivery.

The PhilHealth offers a normal spontaneous delivery package in hospital facilities with PHP9,750 coverage (from PHP5,000) and in non-hospital facilities with PHP12,675 coverage (from PHP6,000).

Hospitals and health facilities can also respond to the needs of

UPLB, DILG launch capacity building program

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — The University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB) and the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) have teamed up to empower barangays in enhancing the delivery of social services through the Barangay Readiness Enhancement and Development Interventions (BREADI) Academy.

Conceptualized by the UPLB Department of Social Development Services (SDS), College of Human Ecology, the BREADI Academy seeks to strengthen grassroots governance through community-driven and science-based capacity building.

According to Dr. Ma. Charisma T. Malenab, one of the program's lead designers, the BREADI program is structured around four major components such as needs analysis, capacity building, documentation, and validation.

Malenab also emphasized the importance of the technical support offered by the BREADI Academy in strengthening barangay leadership:

"Barangays play a vital role in driving social and environmental change. As the closest governance unit to the community, they shoulder great responsibility—but often struggle with

limited resources and technical expertise," she explained.

BREADI's pilot implementation focused on enhancing disaster preparedness in Barangay San Pablo Norte, Sta. Cruz, Laguna. It zeroed in on capacitating local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (BDRMCs).

"Evacuation remains a major challenge for many barangays. This program aims to bridge the gap between technical knowledge and community practices," said DILG Laguna Director Jay-Ar T. Beltran, who was instrumental in mobilizing support for the pilot testing.

Using partic-

ipatory tools, the pilot identified risk communication as a key area for improvement in Barangay San Pablo Norte's disaster response strategy. UPLB faculty and students worked hand-in-hand with barangay officials to co-create a training module on risk communication during disasters.

The pilot also led to the development of the BREADI Manual on Disaster Risk Management, a collaborative output written by students and partners that captured the experiences and lessons from the pilot run.

Other partners involved in implementing the program include Rappler, the Office of Civil Defense Region IV-A, and the Laguna Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRMO).

Through the BREADI Academy, UPLB and DILG also hope to establish Communities of Practice (CoP), a mentoring network where barangays that have completed BREADI can help guide others.

Malenab said discussions are currently underway to secure small grants that would support barangays in implementing their own development initiatives following the training.

"Barangays are at the frontline of community development and disaster response. BREADI is about equipping them with the right tools while respecting and amplifying their existing capacities," Malenab added. (CCM, PIA4A)

1st e-jEEPNEY factory opens in Lima, Batangas

A game-changing moment occurred last Wednesday when the Philippines' first e-jEEPNEY assembly plant opened in Lima, Batangas, bringing the country a step closer to eco-friendly, cleaner and greener commutes. Leading the charge is former Ilocos Sur governor Luis "Chavit" Singson, who has spent years standing with jeepney drivers and operators struggling

with the cost of the shift to modernized transport.

Inside the vast assembly plant, Singson spoke about his mission: to give jeepney drivers a fighting chance in the modern era.

For the former governor, the plant, named "LCS (Luis Chavit Singson) EMON Lima Factory," is more than just a business—it's about saving livelihoods and catching up with the Public Utility Vehicle Modernization Program.

"We copied the iconic jeepney design exactly because drivers and transport groups requested it. The government required it. But now, we're making it sustainable," he said in Filipino, gesturing to the factory floor where three models of e-jEEPNEYS were on display.

Each basic unit costs P1.2 million, against the prevailing market price of P2.5 to P3 million—a price Singson claimed drivers could recover in two to three years.

"We plan to produce 500 units a month, but if demand grows, we'll ramp it up," he added.

Unlike imported e-vehicles, the e-jEEPNEYS come with a crucial advantage in local parts and maintenance support.

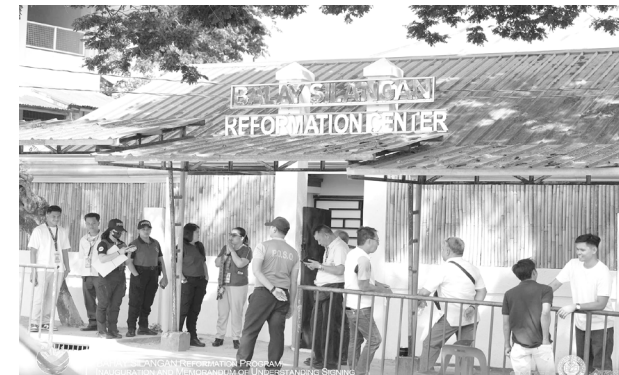

ic weather patterns—typhoons, droughts, and shifting seasons—upend farming routines, the country's food producers are left vulnerable, he noted.

"In the Philippines, climate change is not an abstract concept. Our farmers live with its impact every day," he said. "From typhoons that devastate harvests to droughts that parch fields to unpredictable seasons that unsettle even the most experienced growers... these phenomena are occurring more frequently. That is a clear warning that our agricultural practices must change as well."

Among the Department of Agriculture's responses are adaptive, climate-smart innovations aimed at boosting both

resilience and productivity. These include revised cropping calendars, greenhouse farming with fertigation systems, and alternate wetting and drying technologies for water conservation. The DA is also rolling out mobile soil laboratories to optimize land use and improve yields.

Central to this shift is the promotion of precision and regenerative agriculture. These methods help farmers use fewer resources while increasing output and minimizing losses. Advanced tools like artificial intelligence-powered analytics and digital farm management systems are being introduced to support smarter, data-driven decisions.

Attracting younger generations to farming is

equally critical, the DA pointed out. With the average age of Filipino farmers now over 55, Tiu Laurel stressed the importance of programs that make agriculture "aspirational" again—such as startup incubators, digital mentorships, and scholarship opportunities.

"Technical solutions alone are not enough," he said. "Building resilience also means investing in the people who feed us."

The DA is also expanding crop insurance coverage, improving early warning systems, and providing localized climate advisories to empower farmers with timely, informed choices.

Public-private partnerships, he added, are essential to scaling up these efforts.

Collaborations with agribusinesses, financial institutions, and global partners aim to co-develop inclusive value chains, widen access to capital, and bring modern technologies even to small-holder farms.

"Our Agri-Puhunan at Pantawid Program provides affordable, insured loans and a ready market to ensure stable farmer incomes," he noted. "Currently piloted for rice, it will soon expand to other agricultural sectors."

Ultimately, Tiu Laurel said, the future of Philippine agriculture will be shaped by the choices made today. By embracing innovation, supporting its farmers, and building strong cross-sector partnerships, the country can create a food-secure future that is economically robust and environmentally sound. ### (Photo by Ian Roy Leaño, DA-AFID)

plementation of the reduced interest rates for these loan programs is July 2025.

"As announced early this year, we proposed and obtained approval of the Social Security Commission, headed by our Chairperson Finance Secretary Ralph G. Recto, to reduce interest rates for salary loans and calamity loans. From the current interest rate of 10 percent, salary loan interest rate shall be reduced to 8 percent while calamity loan interest rate shall be reduced to 7 percent," SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Robert Joseph de Claro said.

SSS is also looking at expanding the Pension Loan Program to include surviving spouse pensioners. Data from the agency showed that as of December 2024, there are 1.2 million surviving spouse pensioners who could benefit from the expanded Pension Loan Program which is targeted to be implemented by September this year. "We acknowledge the need of other pensioners for access to a dependable loan facility, so we are expanding the PLP to surviving spouse pensioners. The maximum loanable amount shall be PHP150,000," de Claro said.

The PLP for surviving spouse pensioners shall also be covered by Credit Life Insurance, with the insurance premium to be deducted from the proceeds of the Pension Loan (PL). SSS said this

will ensure that in the event of the death of the PL borrower before full payment and end of the loan term, the PL balance shall be fully paid.

The SSS has also begun discussions with partner financial institutions on the feasibility of implementing a micro-credit loan facility for members with a tenor between 15 to 90 days.

"Currently, we are bringing the idea of a micro credit loan facility among our partner financial institutions through meetings and brainstorming sessions, and see if we can address such short-term cash needs of our members. When we see a framework for this micro-credit program, we will implement as soon as possible," de Claro said.

"We offer these enhancements to all Filipino workers, here and overseas, for Labor Day – Araw ng mga Manggagawa. We remain committed to our push for service excellence with program enhancements and innovations," De Claro added.

De Claro said SSS is also looking at ways on how to help members through livelihood loans as part of the Marcos administration's bid to reduce poverty.

The SSS is also in talks with the Department of Information and Communications Technology on digitalization programs, with PhilHealth for better collaboration through data synchronization, and with several industries for targeted stakeholder engagements. (PNA)
