PhilHealth eyeglasses package finalized by end of November

MANILA – The Integrated Philippine Association of Optometrists (IPAO) and the Philippine Health Insurance Corp. (PhilHealth) are working to finalize coverage guidelines for optometric services and prescription eyeglasses by the end of November this year.

This, after House Resolution No. 1623 urged PhilHealth to include optometric services worth PHP4,000 in its benefit packages, emphasizing the importance of eye care in Filipinos' lives.

"HR No. 1623 paved the way and advocated for Filipinos' right to comprehensive optometric services and free prescription eyeglasses to improve productivity and reduce the financial burden of the Filipinos," IPAO chairman Charlie Ho said in a news release Monday.

The International Agency for the Prevention of Blindness Vision Atlas and the Lancet Global Health Commission on Global Eye Health report stated that 90 percent of vision loss can be prevented or treated if detected early.

A Leap Toward the Green Economy and **Smart Education**

The 2024 Regional Science, Technology, and Inovation Week (RSTIW), held from October 14-16at the Carmona Community Center, City of Carmona, showcased scientific breakthroughs and innovations with a focus on building a sustainable future. The event with the theme "Siyensya, Teknolohiya at Inchasyon: Kabalikat sa Matatag Maginhawa at Panatag na Kinabukasan Providing Solutions and Open."

Month Celebration: Opening Salvo Inobasyon: Kabalikat sa Matatag, Maginhawa at Panatag na Kinabukasan, Providing Solutions and Opening Opportunities in the Green Economy," was organized by DOST-Calabarzon, through the Provincial Science and Technology Office - Cavite headed by Provincial Director Gilda De Jesus. It featured exhibits, forums, and activities aimed at promoting environmental sustainability and economic growth.

A significant highlight of the event was the launching of the 21st Century Learning Environment Model (CLEM) Classroom at Angelo L. Loyola Senior High School (ALLSHS) in Carmona. The innovative initiative, led by DOST-Calabarzon in collaboration with local government units, is designed to enhance 11502, which designates October each year as a time to honor cooperatives, we reflect student learning by incorporating cutting-edge technologies and teaching practices, equipping learners on the vibrant cooperative movement in Trece Martires City with the skills needed for a sustainable economy.

Carmona Mayor Dahlia A. Loyola also praised the CLEM Classroom, noting its relevance to modern educational demands. The project aligns with the city's vision of becoming a smart city through the Science for Smart Cities Program (SSCP), which encompasses governance, infrastructure, and education. DOST-Calabarzon Regional Director Emelita Bagsit highlighted Carmona's ambitious goal to evolve into Carmona International City, a move supported by the integration of smart technologies.

DOST Undersecretary Maridon Sahagun lauded the CLEM initiative as a key step in enhancing student engagement and collaboration, while DOST Undersecretary Dr. Teodoro Gatchalian outlined the five core goals of CLEM: bridging technological gaps, promoting STEM education, fostering 21st-century skills, improving teaching and learning, and boosting student outcomes.

DepEd enhances MATATAG curriculum with new, highquality textbooks

CAINTA, Rizal (PIA) - The Department of Education (DepEd) in Calabarzon has been distributing additional instructional materials to supplement its current textbooks in support of the MATATAG curriculum.

In the latest episode of Philippine Information Agency Calabarzon's Kapihan sa Bagong Pilipinas, Atty. Alberto Escobarte, DepEd IV-A regional director, highlighted that the Education department has been procuring new, high-quality textbooks for students.

Loida Nidea, Assistant Regional Director, assured that textbooks are reviewed to flag errors and ensure that flawed materials are not published or distributed to schools

"As much as possible, we will not print materials with numerous errors. However, we acknowledge that nothing is perfect," she noted.

DepEd has also been proactive in correcting errors in content before textbooks are distributed for classroom instruction.

"There may be some minor errors, but before these books are distributed to the field, we try our best to rectify them to ensure they are ready for student use.

For School Year 2024-2025, over 43,362 educators have been trained to implement the new curriculum, reinforcing the commitment to continuous professional development and the effective rollout of the MATATAG curriculum. (PB/PIA-4A)

Mega transport hub to rise in QC

MANILA - The Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) said a giant transport hub to rival the size of the Parañaque Integrated Terminal Exchange (PITX) will be built on its three-hectare property in Quezon City.

In a statement on Monday (Oct. 21), GSIS said the transport hub dubbed as 'Project Hub', will be located at the corner of the Elliptical Road and Commonwealth Avenue.

The project is expected to provide much needed augmentation to several major transport lines already plying through the area.

By 2027, the hub is expected to enhance access to the neighboring Philcoa Station of the Metro Rail Transit-7 (MRT-7) when it begins operating from the North Triangle Common Station in North Edsa to San Jose del Monte in Bulacan.

"Our property in Quezon City is centrally located and accessible, positioned in a location that maximizes connectivity with the city and surrounding regions," GSIS President and General Manager Wick Veloso said.

"The end view of the Project Hub is a world-class intermodal transport hub that is a well-organized, modern facility that streamlines the bus travel experience, focusing on efficiency, passenger comfort, and seamless connectivity with other transport modes including the MRT-7."
