

# Police, civilians hurt in Maragondon demolition operation

The Philippine National Police clarified that the police action that led to the arrest of six civilians during a demolition operation last January 13, in Maragondon, Cavite City was within the bounds of law and in accordance with basic human rights.

PNP Chief Police General Dionardo B. Carlos stated that the presence of cops in the demolition site was to render police assistance as so requested by the Fourth Judicial Regional Trial Court, Branch 15 in Cavite, for the execution of the Writ of Demolition in Patungan, Barangay Sta. Mercedes.

Unfortunately, tension escalated as the affected residents resisted the court order and started throwing stones at the police personnel and members of the demolition team. Some

fought outright against the law enforcers. This commotion injured at least 21 police personnel, and 14 other individuals belonging to the demolition team. The violence also resulted in

damage to some police equipment.

The arrested civilians are Leslie Plantar, Freddie Bascal, Joy Mendoza, and Rizza Sia, while Eric Dominador and Ace Amul are under hospital arrest.

"Those who were hurt have injuries in the different parts of their body. They were immediately treated to the nearest hospital. It could have been a smooth implementation of the court order if not for the tension that disrupted the demolition. The arrested civilians were informed

of their rights in accordance with Republic Act 7438," Carlos said.

The disputed land is being claimed by the private entity MTV Realty Corporation. Around 400 residential structures are said to be affected, with some 2,000 individuals living in the community.

Initial investigation revealed that there was already an attempt to demolish the area but residents installed barricades to prevent the destruction of houses.

"We will file necessary charges against those who inflicted harm to the wounded persons," Carlos added./PNP/PIA Cavite

## 'Effects of lockdown outweigh the benefits' – Gov. Remulla

TRECE MARTIRES, Cavite (PIA) – Cavite Governor Jonvic Remulla stands firm on opposing plans of lockdown because 'the effects of a never-ending lockdown outweigh the benefits.'

Remulla stated

his opinion in the midst of the continuing spike in CoViD-19 cases in the province with 1,188 new positive cases recorded in the province as of January 9, 2022.

The province also recorded the highest number of Active cases

in the CALABARZON region at 4,273 with more cases anticipated in the coming weeks.

Despite the CoViD-19 situation in the province, the CoViD-ICU capacity is at 41.5% in the province's hospitals. Majority of the new cas-

es recorded or 96.4% manifest mild symptoms or are asymptomatic and there are Zero reported deaths in the province.

Thus, the governor remains optimistic that the province would once again overcome this crisis.

He emphasized the need to be responsible, knowledgeable, and disciplined to mitigate the spread of the virus.

"Omicron may be the most contagious variant yet given the tsunami of infections we are seeing. Better safe than sorry so let's all do our part in protecting ourselves and those around us," reminded Governor Jonvic.

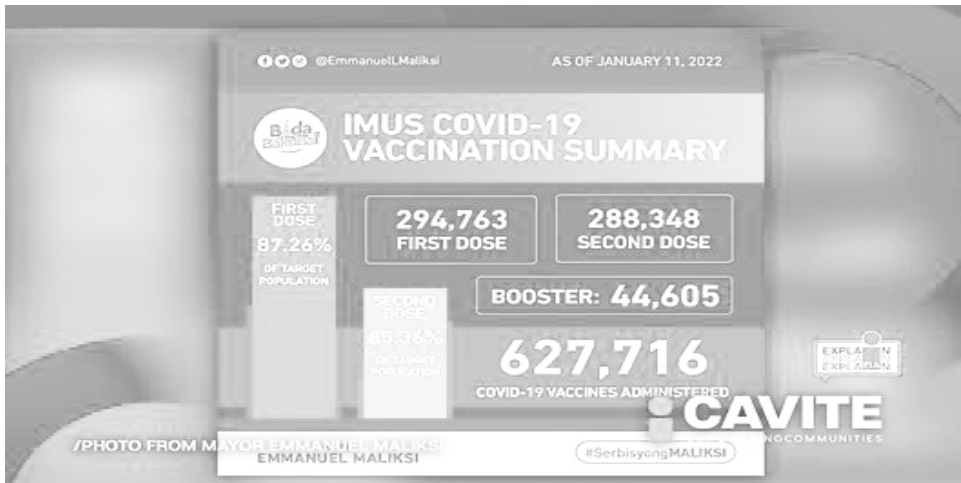

Batay sa datos ng pamahalaang lungsod noong Enero 11, umabot na sa 627,716 dosis ng bakuna kontra Covid-19 ang naipamahagi sa iba't ibang sektor buhat nang magsimula ang vaccination program nito.

Mula sa naturang bilang, 294,763 ang inilaan bilang paunang dose ng bakuna para sa mga residente, habang 288,348 naman ang bilang ng mga ipinama-haging bakuna para sa ikalawang dose.

Samantala, 44,605 dosis naman ang naiturok bilang booster doses. Dahil dito, binuksan na ng pamahalaang lungsod ang kanilang vaccination program para sa mga kalapit na bayan nito.

DepEd hinikayat ang mga unit ng gobyerno,mga katuwang na suportahan ang smoke- free schools

Hinikayat ng Kagawaran ng Edukasyon (DepEd) ang iba't ibang ahensiya ng gobyerno, mga lokal na pamahalaan, at mga katuwang nito upang suportahan ang smoke-free schools at mga komunidad sa 2nd Smoke-Free LGU Forum: Sustaining Smoke-Free Communities in the New Normal nitong nakaraang Disyembre 13, 2021.

Kasama ang Department of Health (DOH), Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), at Health Justice Philippines, nagsagawa ang DepEd ng isang diyologo kasama ang mga LGUs sa kung paano nila mapapanatili ang implementasyon ng mga smoke-free environment programs sa new normal.

"I hope that through this forum, DepEd, DILG, and DOH can commit to complement our resources and

prioritize to issue a joint memorandum circular as soon as possible that will further expound on this need to institutionalize supportive health policies, particularly to strengthen and unify our efforts on tobacco control, especially in our schools," ani Kalihim ng Edukasyon Leonor Magtolis Briones.

Duque III.

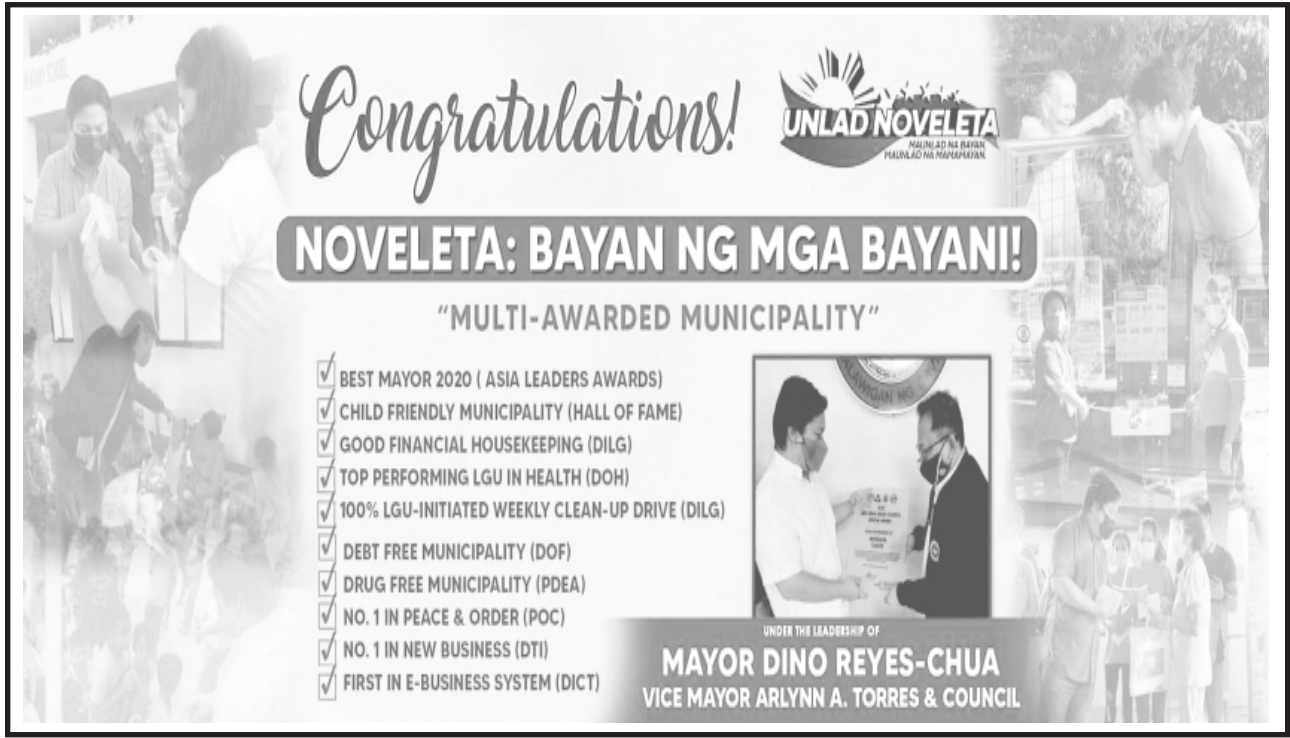

by the Taal Volcano eruption in January 2020 and; COVID-19 response during the current pandemic. He disclosed that the local government's vaccination efforts has inoculated more than 70% of the target population with the town's population at 66,000.

To date, about 31,060 residents are fully vaccinated including the pediatric population against COVID-19 with more than 500 vaccinations a day in the continued vax rollouts, Salamat added.

Meanwhile, the town's agriculture industry produces many high yielding crops due to its fertile land and conducive weather. Fruit-bearing

trees of different varieties, bananas, lettuce and now strawberries and grapes are currently being studied for full production.

300mg syrup thrice daily by children, following the suggested dosage per intake:

2.5 to 5mL for ages 2 to 4

5mL for ages 4 to 6

7.5 to 10mL for ages 6 to 12

Right lagundi dosage can relieve Covid-19 symptoms: DOST

MANILA – A medical doctor and project leader of the study on lagundi as adjuvant therapy for mild Covid-19 reminded the public that there is a prescribed dosage for the herbal medicine that treats cough and asthma.

Department of Science and Technology (DOST) Secretary Fortunato de la Peña, in a taped report aired Friday afternoon, said the prescribed dosages will ensure that treatment using lagundi will render positive results.

Citing the recommendations of Dr. Cecilia Maramba-Lazarte, the project leader of the lagundi clinical trial by the University of the Phil-

ippines Manila with the support from DOST-Philippine Council for Health Research and Development, he said adults may take the 600-milligram (mg) tablet or 5 milliliters (ml) of the 600 mg syrup thrice daily.

Pediatric patients' dosage requirements, on the other hand, would vary depending on the age range.

The 300 mg syrup may be taken thrice daily by children, following the suggested dosage per intake: 2.5 to 5 ml for ages 2 to 4; 5 ml for ages 4 to 6; and 7.5 to 10 ml for ages 6 to 12, according to de la Peña.

People 12 years old and above may also

take the 600 mg tablet thrice daily, he added.

"By following these guidelines, the use of lagundi may alleviate mild Covid-19 symptoms. Lagundi has long been used for cough and asthma relief," the DOST chief said.

The clinical trial on lagundi as adjuvant therapy seeks to determine if the herb can provide symptomatic relief for mild Covid-19 patients without comorbidities or if it can decrease the progress from mild to moderate or severe cases.

The two-stage, randomized double-blind, placebo-controlled study was conducted from July 2020 to August 2021.

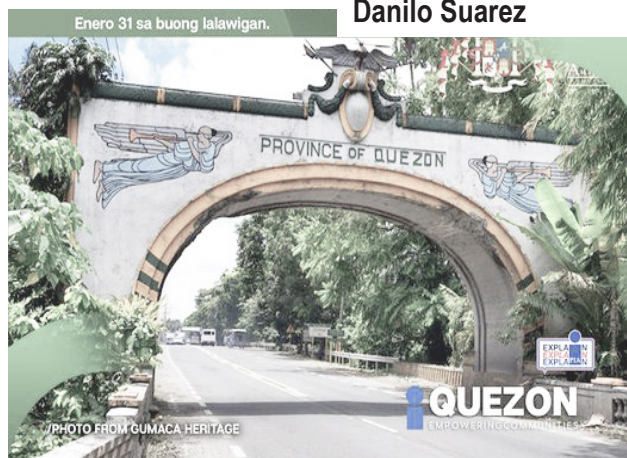

# Alfonso: Hidden Gem of the South yet to be discovered

TRECE MARTIRES, Cavite (PIA) – Alfonso Municipal Mayor Randy Salamat disclosed his vision for the town becoming the 'must-visit' tourist destination in the south, which will pave the way for the development and progress of its tourism and agricultural industry.

Mayor Salamat said in an interview with Bing Kimpo in Presidential Communications Operations Office's Laging Handa Network Briefing News that the municipality consists of 6,996 hectares of agricultural land, 70% of which he intends to maintain solely for agriculture with the recent Land Use plan the LGU had submitted to Congress.

He envisions the municipality to have a distinct identity by not allowing the establishment of relocation sites to maintain peace and order in the town, and intends to further develop the tourism industry which could bring a bigger income for the local government to be able to bring government service to all sectors of society.

Tagged as the 'Hidden Gem of the South', the town boasts of hundreds of resorts, restaurants, events places and accommodation hotels, and "glamping" and camping sites filled with lush greeneries and natural, cool running streams and waterfalls in the cool upland weather conducive for staycations.
