

Sen. Go extends support to hundreds of farmers affected by Taal crisis in Silang, Cavite

PASAY CITY -- In line with his push for measures that aim to build safer and more resilient communities, Senator Christopher "Bong" Go continued to respond to the needs of areas and communities affected by natural disasters and other crisis situations to help them build back better.

Last Tuesday, November 9, Go's team organized a relief effort for 500 farmers whose

livelihoods and daily lives were adversely affected by the Taal Volcano eruption.

"Mga kababayan ko, alam kong mahirap ang panahon ngayon. Nandito pa tayo sa gitna ng pandemya, tinamaan pa tayo ng pagputok ng bulkang Taal. Magtulungan lang po tayo," Go said in his video message.

Go's team, in support of initiatives provided by the Department

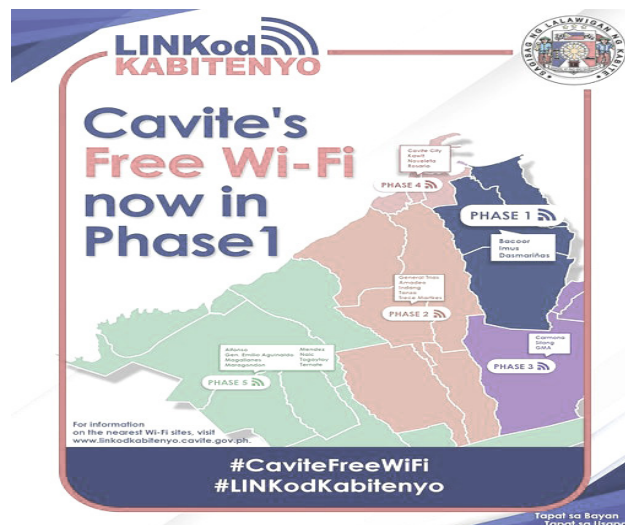

of Agriculture, conducted the relief operation at the Cavite State University-Silang Campus where necessary safety and health protocols were strictly observed to prevent the further spread of the virus.

The team gave essentials such as meals, masks and vitamins to each affected farmer. They also gave new pairs of shoes and bicycles to selected residents, as well as computer tablets for children's use in their blended learning activities.

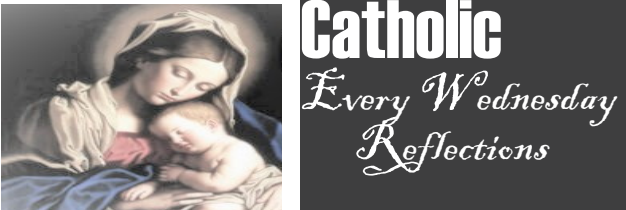

Your Apostolic Calling
Wednesday, November 17, 2021

“A nobleman went off to a distant country to obtain the kingship for himself and then to return. He called ten of his servants and gave them ten gold coins and told them, ‘Engage in trade with these until I return.’ His fellow citizens, however, despised him and sent a delegation after him to announce, ‘We do not want this man to be our king.’” Luke 19:12-14

There are three categories of people in this parable. The first includes those who received a gold coin and followed the master’s request to “engage in trade” until he returned. The second has those who received the same command but were lazy and failed to produce any good fruit from that which our Lord has given them. And the third includes those who “despise” our Lord and do not want Him as their King.

Upon the king’s return, this first category of people are represented by the two servants who took the gold coins, engaged in trade, and made five and ten more. These are those who have much apostolic zeal. God not only calls us to use the gifts we have received to expand His Kingdom on earth, He also expects it of us. His expectation is a command of love. For those who understand this command, they see it as a glorious invitation to make an eternal difference in the lives of many. They do not see the apostolic works to which they are called as a burden. Rather, they see them as a joy, and that joy fuels their efforts. The result will have exponential effects for God’s Kingdom.

The second category of people is illustrated by the one servant who kept the one gold coin “stored away in a handkerchief” out of fear. These are the people who avoid evangelizing and furthering the Kingdom of God out of fear. Fear is paralyzing. But giving in to fear is a sin. It’s a lack of faith and trust in God. Serving God will inevitably require courage on our part. It will demand that we step out of our comfort zone and do that which we may not immediately feel comfortable doing. But as that servant in the parable foretold, God is a demanding God. And He will not accept fear as an acceptable excuse not to zealously help to build the Kingdom of God.

The third category of people is the category in which you definitely do not want to fall. These are those who actively work to undermine God’s Kingship and reject Him as God. The world is filled with these people. The only thing we need to say about those who fall into this category is that which our Lord said of them. “Now as for those enemies of mine who did not want me as their king, bring them here and slay them before me.”

Reflect, today, upon which category of people your life most fully resembles. Most likely it is one of the first two. Do you have great zeal for

IATF approves new alert levels

MANILA -- The Inter-Agency Task Force approved last Saturday, November 13, 2021, placing Catanduanes under Alert Level 4 effective November 17, 2021 until November 30, 2021.

Baguio City in the Cordillera Administrative Region and Siquijor in Region VII shall be placed under Alert Level 3 effective November 15, 2021 until November 30, 2021.

Also placed under Alert Level 3 are Batanes, Quirino and Nueva Vizcaya in Region II and the City of Isabela and Zamboanga City in Region IX from November 17, 2021 to November 30, 2021.

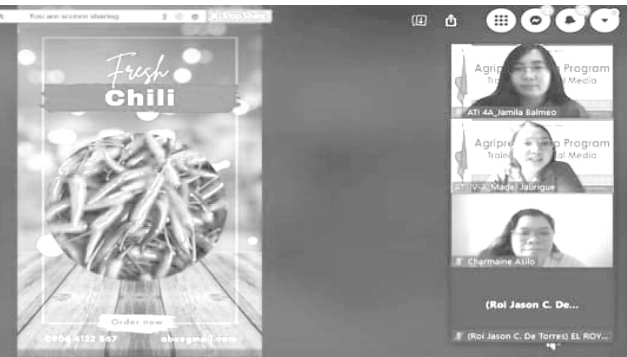
Meanwhile, under Alert Level 2, effective immediately until November 30, 2021 are Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan, Davao del Norte, Davao Oriental, Davao Occidental, Davao City, Misamis Occidental, Lanao del Norte, Bukidnon, Camiguin, Misamis Oriental and Iligan City in Region X; and Zamboanga City in Region IX.

Moreover, under Alert Level 2, effective November 17, 2021 until November 30, 2021 are City of Santiago, Cagayan and Isabela in Region II; Albay, Sorsogon, Naga City, Camarines Sur, Camarines Norte and Masbate in Region V; Zamboanga del Norte, Zamboanga Sibuyan and Zamboanga del Sur in Region IX. extend assistance to help the farmers start anew through the provision of farming equipment, plant seeds, fertilizers and many others.

Florizel Hernandez, 58, expressed his gratitude towards Senator Go for being one of the first government leaders to visit Silang to check on their well-being and living conditions after the Taal erupted. He also mentioned the Go was instrumental in making sure that farmers in their community are given the necessary assistance to help them recover.

“Napakalaking pasasalamat namin sa intervention na binibigay ng ating pamahalaan sa aming mag-sasaka sapagkat nababawasan po ang paghihirap namin. Para po sa minamahal naming Senator Bong Go, mula po sa aming mag-sasaka, kami po ay lubusang nagpapasalamat sa inyo,” Hernandez said.

Knowing the vulnerability of the country when it comes to natural disasters and calamities, Go reiterated the importance of creating the Department of Disaster Resilience that would be

primarily responsible for ensuring that communities are well-adapted, resilient, and safe from the harmful impact of climate change, especially those living in remote areas.

Under the proposed Senate Bill No. 205, otherwise known as the Department of Disaster Resilience Act, the establishment of DDR will unify and streamline all responsibilities related to disaster preparedness and response, functions that are presently scattered across various departments and offices.

Ako po ay hindi titigil at hindi mawawalan ng pag-asa. Isa po sa na-file ko sa Senado ang Department of Disaster Resilience (bill) kasi kailangan po nating i-scale up po ang preparedness to resilience. So ibig sabihin, hindi lang nakahanda, talagang kaya na natin makatayo muli kapag tinamaan tayo ng bagyo o pagputok ng bulkan o earthquake,” said Go.

“Ang gusto po mangyari ng departamentong ito bago pa po dumating ang bagyo o ‘yung pagputok ng bulkan, meron na pong secretary-level na makikipag

coordinate po sa local governments. Kung meron pong departamentong nakatutok po sa kanila, ito na po ‘yung makikipag-coordinate,” he added.

Continuing his message, Go urged residents to stay cooperative and disciplined as the fight to end the pandemic continues. As the Chair of Senate Committee on Health and Demography, the senator asked the public to help the government attain population protection and herd immunity by taking part in the national vaccination program.

“Nakikiusap po ako sa mga kababayan ko na magtiwala po kayo sa bakuna. Nakikita ko po kanina na marami pa pong takot mag-pabakuna, kaya andito po ako to encourage them na ang bakuna po ang tanging susi o solusyon para unti-unti na tayong bumalik sa normal na pamumuhay,” expressed Go.

“Natutuwa naman po ako na dumadami na po ang gustong magpabakuna kaya po hinihikayat ko ang ating mga local governments na i-deploy kaagad ang ba-

kuna. Kapag dumating ang bakuna, iturok kaagad ang wag na patagalin,” he added.

Go also offered additional assistance and encouraged the residents to visit the Malasakit Centers at Southern Tagalog Regional Hospital in Bacoor City and General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital in Trece Martires City.

The center is a one-stop shop designed to provide convenient assistance to help particularly poor and indigent patients with their medical expenses.

“Ngayon, kung hindi kayang operahan dito, magsabi lang po kayo. Huwag ho kayong mag-atubiling magpa-hospital. Huwag n’yo na pong alalahanin ang inyong babayaran... tutulong po kami,” Go expressed.

To further accelerate the economic progress of the locality, Go, as Vice Chair of the Senate Committee on Finance, supported various road improvements in the cities of Bacoor, Cavite, Dasmariñas, General Trias, Imus and Tagaytay; rehabilitation of covered courts in various barangays in Gen-

eral Trias City; acquisition of ambulance units for the local governments of Bacoor City, Indang and Trece Martires City; rehabilitation and improvement of the municipal fire station in Noveleta; and the improvement of a sports facility in Cavite State University in Indang.

Go commended

the local officials of Silang for their continued service to their community especially in crisis situations.

In 2019, Go was declared an adopted son of the CALABARZON region in a manifesto issued by the governors of Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon. (OSBG)

rate, no collateral loan that is payable in 12 months, inclusive of the three-month grace period.

“I encourage our employers, especially yung mga nahihirapan pa (hard up firms), to avail of this facility so that they can comply with the mandate to pay our workers with what is due them, especially this Christmas season,” Bello said.

CAVITE PROVIDES SECURITY AWARENESS TRAINING FOR TOURISM STAKEHOLDERS

Criminal gang sub-leader killed in joint PNP-NBI op in Cavite

The brother of a notorious crime group leader in Albay was killed in a clash with lawmen at dawn on Sunday(Nov.14) in a subdivision in Barangay Biclatan, General Trias City, Cavite, authorities said.

Killed was Emmanuel Concepcion, sub-leader of the Concepcion Criminal Group operating in Albay, and brother of Gilbert Concepcion, the head of the gang.

A tracker team composed of Philippine National Police (PNP) personnel from General Trias led by Col. Edward Cutiyog and National Bureau of Investigation (NBI)-Bicol operatives were about to serve a warrant of arrest against the Concepcion brothers

at a residence in Cliffwood Subdivision, Governor Hills, in the said village at around 3:30 a.m.

As the group arrived at the house and introduced themselves as law enforcers, the suspect armed with a still unknown handgun fired upon the operating troops, which led to a brief firefight that resulted in the suspect's death.

The operatives, during the search, recovered a .45 caliber handgun, a .40 caliber pistol, several fired empty shells, and several cell-phones.

Emmanuel's brother Gilbert was not around during the service of the warrant.

The Concepcion brothers were tagged as among the most wanted

persons in Bicol, facing criminal complaints of murder, rape, direct assault, and illegal possession of firearms.

The Concepcion Criminal Group was organized by Gilbert in 2010, a former communist rebel who became a soldier but went on absence without leave and was eventually dismissed from the service.

The group was involved in activities such as robbery and extortion, gun for hire, gunrunning, and also became a political armed group employed by local politicians. SOURCE:(PNA)

bridges, fences, and buildings and for furniture shall be allowed," Cuna said in his memorandum.

Per initial data given by the respective local government units, there are a total of 370 illegal aquaculture structures in Cavite waters: 271 in Cavite City, 97 in Kawit, and 2 in Noveleta. However, per data gathered during the actual marking conducted from September 15-22, 2021, a total of 949 structures had been marked: 789 in Cavite City and 160 in Kawit. Most of these structures are bamboo-made.

On November 4, 2021, Manila Bay Inter Agency Task Force - Cavite Cluster started the clearing/dismantling of 32 sapras in Cavite City. DENR CALA-

BARZON Regional Executive Director Nilo Tamoria said that the said demolition is part of the Manila Bay Rehabilitation Program of the DENR. "Yun lang naman po ang ating intensyon, isaayos, bilang bahagi ng rehabilitasyon ng ating Manila Bay dahil 2008 pa tayo inutusan ng kataas-taasang hukuman ng ating bansa na ibalik ang kalidad ng tubig sa Manila Bay sa Class SB. Ang gagawin natin ngayon ay isa sa mga hakbang upang matulungan nating mai-balik sa ganung kalidad", he explained.

Early in July 2021, Environment Secretary Roy A. Cimatu ordered DENR CALABARZON to regulate illegal aquaculture structures in Manila Bay. — DENR CALABARZON

Apply for 13th-month pay loan, Bello tells small biz owners

MANILA – Micro and small enterprises that are having difficulty in giving the 13th-month pay of their employees can apply for a government loan, Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) Secretary Silvestre Bello III said in a statement on Sunday.

The Labor chief made the call as he reminded employers that the grant of 13th-month pay is mandated by law. He, however, assured establishments that are still struggling amid the reopening of the economy of the government's support through the Small Business Corporation (SBCorp).

"Let me remind the employers that the grant of 13th-month pay is mandatory. We issued a Labor Advisory where we maintained that no exemption and no deferment will be allowed on the payment of the 13th-month pay. So, with this loan facility from SB Corporation, there is no more reason to not give the 13th-month pay," Bello said during the ceremonial launch of the loan program with the Department of Trade and Industry and its financing arm, SBCorp on Friday.

As of Nov. 12, a total of 25 loan applications amounting to
