cently approved for this intent upon the request of Mayor Dino Reyes-Chua to the Municipal Council with Vice Mayor Arlyn Torres and ten members of the local council voting for the approval of said resolution.

The waived renewal fee amounts to P 300.00 to aims to alleviate the losses sustained during the period of non-operations due to quarantine restrictions on travel.

Meanwhile, the following cities and provinces have been placed under Alert Level 3:

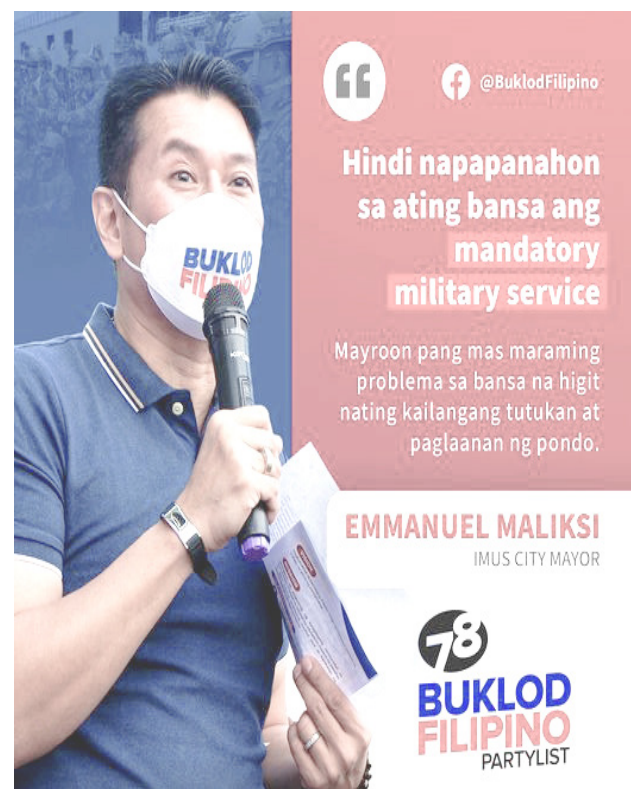
- Cordillera Administrative Region: Abra, Apayao, Baguio City, Benguet, Kalinga and Mountain Province;

SSS urges FB followers to utilize "TULONG PUHUNAN" launched in Dasma

The Social Security System (SSS) encourages its more than five million Facebook (FB) followers to actively utilize its portals and various online facilities including its social media platforms for easier access to SSS information, services, and transactions.

SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Aurora C. Ignacio said that the SSS made available its My.SSS Portal on its website www.sss.gov.ph for members to have exclusive access to their contributions and membership records, facilitate online transactions, set appointments with their servicing branch, and request for copies of their records, among others.

Over the last few years, the My.SSS Portal has undergone enhancements and now includes online applications for loans, benefits, requests for member data change (simple corrections), Payment Reference Number (PRN) generation, and enrollment of disbursement accounts.

“The majority of our FB followers interact with us by writing queries and making follow-ups in the comments section of our official FB posts and the SSS Social Media Services Section is in charge of responding to these concerns. As we encourage active social media engagement, we also invite them to maximize the usage of the My.SSS Portal since benefit claims and loan status are readily available in their respective accounts. Likewise, they may also reach us through the FB Messenger where a Chatbot can respond to their basic and frequently asked questions,” Ignacio said.

Members and employers may also use the SSS Mobile App, with similar features and may be downloaded via Google Play Store, Apple App Store, or Huawei AppGallery for free. They may also avail of the Text-SSS facility via 2600 with a service fee of P2.50 per transaction for Globe, Smart, and Sun Cellular subscribers.

Aside from the My.SSS Portal, the SSS also launched in November 2020, the ExpreSSS e-Learning (ExSSSeL) Portal which allows participants to learn the different SSS policies, programs, and updates at the comfort and safety of their homes. The ExSSSeL Portal is a free online computer-based training wherein participants may choose among the modules, study at their own pace and time, take the post examination to assess the learnings gained, and receive an e-certificate upon obtaining a passing rate of at least 80% in the post examination. Members and other individuals can visit said Portal via http://bit.ly/ExSSSeL_Portal. After selecting a module, they will receive an online registration form via Google Form for them to fill out. Multiple modules can also be accessed simultaneously.

SSS has also launched the uSSSap Tayo Portal via www.crms.sss.gov.ph last September 2021 providing users with easier, simpler, and faster access to SSS information, and an avenue for sending their concerns on how to avail of SSS programs, services, and status verifications of their follow-ups and complaints. Moreover, the uSSSap Tayo Portal utilizes a ticket support system that provides a complete archive of users’ requests which helps them track the status of their tickets in the dashboard of their accounts.

Bong Go highlights heroism and contributions of Filipino nurses as Senate takes up his proposed measure advancing nursing education in PH

PASAY CITY -- Senator Christopher "Bong" Go lauded the heroism and contribution of Filipino nurses both in the country and abroad, particularly amid the pandemic, as the Senate Committee on Civil Service took up his proposed measure improving nursing education in the country.

In a speech on Thursday, January 27, Go expressed his sincere gratitude to the Committee for taking up his Senate Bill No. 395, also known as the "Advanced Nursing Education Act of 2019". The bill seeks to improve the nursing profession by instituting measures that will result in relevant nursing education, humane working conditions, and better career prospects for Filipino nurses.

"Napakaimportante po ng measure na ito upang mas lalong paigtingin ang nursing education program sa ating bansa," said Go.

He noted that Filipino nurses, due to their competence and caring nature, are sought-after even in other countries, thus contributing significantly to the Philippine economy.

"Kilala po ang mga Filipino nurses dahil po sa likas na kakayahan, kalinga, at malasakit na ipinapakita ng mga Pilipino sa kapwa tao. Sa totoo lang po, halos lahat po ng pamilya ay may contribution – at least, may nurse talaga sa pamilya. Even ako, halos sa pamilya natin – pinsan, kapatid – mayroon talagang nurse," said Go.

"At dahil nga po mahusay ang ating mga kababayan, lalong tumataas ang demand para sa Filipino nurses sa iba't ibang panig ng mundo. Ito po ang dahilan kung bakit napakalaki ang nagiging ambag ng Filipino nurses sa ating ekonomiya," he added.

Go then reiterated the need for a more standardized and advanced nursing education program that will establish a solid foundation for the country's nurses to enable them to become more competent and gain better career opportunities.

"Bagama't hinahanap-hanap ng mga dayuhan ang magagandang katangian ng ating Filipino nurses, yung nursing education program po natin ay maaari pang ma-improve dahil naka-focus lang ito sa 'bare minimum' o pag-produce ng graduates na agarang ipapadala abroad o isasabak sa iba't ibang mga lokal na ospital," said Go.

"Sa ngayon, walang oportunidad ang mga Filipino nurses para palawakin ang kanilang kakayahan at kaalaman upang maging dalubhasa sa kanilang napiling propesyon," he continued.

Go's proposed measure will require the establishment of standard basic and graduate programs for nursing education, to be established in Commission on Higher Education-accredited institutions.

Under the basic program, students will be mandated to undergo community integration and immersion to encourage them to work in various communities.

Meanwhile, a graduate program will be built on the experiences and skills of the nurses towards mastery, expertise and leadership in practice, research and education.

The faculty-to-student ratio will also be in accordance with the standards to be determined by CHED. The aspiring nurses will also have to pass a National Nursing Admission Test to ensure the quality of students getting in the program.

"This is indeed very timely as our country and the entire world struggle to strengthen the medical frontliners amid the COVID-19 pandemic," said Go.

He added that the measure will also benefit the entire healthcare system. With more competent nurses manning the hospitals, Go said that patients can rest easy knowing that they are being provided with the best medical care possible.

"Not only this, even the families of the patients will feel more at ease knowing that their loved ones will receive care from highly trained nurses," he noted.

"Kapakanan po ng ating mga nurses at ng ating mga mamamayan ang ating tanging layunin. Once we pass this important measure, there is no question that our nurses, patients and society, as a whole, will reap the fruits of our efforts," added Go.

Ending his speech, Go thanked the nurses and all medical frontliners for their contributions and sacrifices in the fight against COVID-19. He also asked them to continue taking good care of their patients as he pledged his continuing support for them.

"At isisingit ko na lang po, sa lahat po ng ating mga healthcare workers, of course nurses, kayo po yung mga frontliners, maraming salamat po sa inyong sakripisyo sa panahon ngayon. Kayo naman po ang nakakaalam sa laban na ito," said Go.

"Pakiusap ko lang po sa inyo, tulungan po natin ang ating mga kababayan, especially po yung mga pasyente. Huwag po nating pabaya. Kami naman po dito sa Senado, mga trabahante po sa gobyerno, ay handang sumuporta sa

With the waiving of the renewal fee, tricycle operators will only be required to process for the issuance of 2022 Tricycle plates.

"Our tricycle drivers and operators, around 2,000 of them need to pay only P 200.00 for the plate since we had waived the

P 300.00 Mayor's Permit fee for them to cope up and lessen the expenses of renewing their permits," Mayor Chua said.

To further help the members of this transport group, the LGU ordered the RHU to give way for the vaccination for Booster shots for tricycle drivers

and ambulant vendors every Saturday at the Nov-eleta Health Center for the added protection of the drivers against COVID-19.

Despite their return to operations with the gradual loosening of quarantine protocols to help the economy recover, their income is still insuf-

ficient for their daily living expenses.

TOP 1 MWP- PROVINCIAL LEVEL COLLARED, 45 OTHERS ARRESTED

3,784 MPHS VIOLATORS RECORDED BY CAVITE PNP ANTI-CRIMINALITY OPS

Camp BGen Pantaleon Garcia, Imus City-Cavite Police collared Top 1 Most Wanted Person (MWP) Provincial Level, arrested 45 others, and recorded 3,784 Minimum Public Health Standards (MPHS) protocols violators in the past 24-hour anti-criminality operation.

In the campaign against wanted person, joint operatives of Naic MPS, Kawayan MPS, and CIDG Biliran PFU conducted a manhunt operation at Brgy. Doto-rea 1 Brgy. Halang, Naic, Cavite and collared one (1) Melvin Ezperanza for the Crime of Murder under CC No.2274, issued by Hon.Enrique C. Asis, Presiding Judge of RTC 8th Judicial Region, Branch 16, Brgy. Larrazabal, Naval, Biliran dated March 11, 2004 with no bail recommended.

In the campaign against illegal gambling, 39 persons were arrested while caught in the act of engaging in illegal cockfighting "Tupada". Police operatives confiscated 14 heads of fighting cocks, 12 pieces gaff "tari" and cash amounting to P13,250.00 in different denomination as bet money.

In the campaign against illegal drugs, three (3) individuals were arrested in a buy-bust operation conducted by Dasmariñas PNP which resulted in the confiscation of 8 pieces of small size heat-sealed transparent plastic sachets containing white crystalline substance suspected as shabu, one (1) piece HSTPS containing dried leaves suspected as marijuana and other drug paraphernalia.

In various cases, three (3) suspects were arrested in a Robbery Incident that transpired in Dasmariñas City; Attempted Homicide and Violation of Art. 151 of the Revised Penal Code (RPC) and Alarms and Scandal and Violation of Art. 151 of RPC in Bacoor City, Cavite.

A total of 3,784 MPHS violators were recorded, 1,052 for not wearing face mask; 2,017 for improper wearing face mask; 333 violated the curfew hours and 382 violated the social distancing.

Cavite PNP, together with the active support of the community, maintains its proactive stance in the fight against all forms of criminality and will continue enhancing its performance and gain more positive and significant accomplishments towards the attainment of a safer province to live, work and do business. DOH CONDUCTS INSPECTIONS OF HEALTH FACILITIES IN QUEZON PROVINCE

DOH Assistant Secretary Maria Francine M. Laxamana, together with DOH-Center for Health Development-Calabarzon (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, Quezon) Regional Director Ariel I. Valencia, began a series of ocular inspections to several health facilities in the region, first in the Quezon Province from January 24-27, 2022 to ensure smooth delivery of health care services to the public.

"It is crucial to personally see if the people in the community are meeting their basic health needs and progressively expand health services that will cover for its population." Assistant Secretary Laxamana disclosed.

Both officials

mainly checked the existing operational standards of some local government hospitals and the available health equipment, supplies, logistics, and amenities that cater to the patients' needs.

Director Valencia stressed that facilities must be maintained appropriately and medical equipment must be complete, which are vital in

giving health services to the patients.

If the local health facilities provide primary health needs, patients need not seek health care in distant facilities.

"Kailangan na maibigay ng waste at sapat ang pangangailang-pang-kalusugan ng mga lokal na residente upang hindi na sila dumayo pa sa ibang lugar upang magpagamot. Makakatipid na sila sa gastos, maliligtas pa ang kanilang buhay kung sapat ang naibibigay na serbisyong pang-kalusugan." Director Valencia emphasized.

Quezon Province has 28 hospitals, 13 of which are government-run.

Part of his itinerary is the site visits to the proposed super health centers and specialty medical centers, coordination meetings to various local government units regarding the completion of several municipal hospitals and district hospitals, and the enhancement of existing facilities.

All improvements are in the Health Facility Enhancement Program (HFEP) pipeline for this year.

According to Director Valencia, "A well-planned and designed hospital and health facility will provide relatively sophisticated health services to the community as part of our continuing mandate under the Universal Health Care law to ensure that no one's health is left behind."

'No Vaxx, No Ride' lifted in areas under Alert L 2

As the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) on Sunday placed the seven provinces and National Capital Region (NCR) back under Alert Level 2, the government is expected to ease some restrictions where the "no vaccination, no ride" policy is expected to be lifted.

The Department

of Transportation (DOTr) said that the public will not be required to present proof of their vaccination status in order to ride the public transportation beginning on Tuesday, February 1. "Once we de-escalate to Alert Level 2, the no vaxx, no ride policy shall automatically be lifted," Transportation Assistant Secretary Goddess Hope Libiran told the reporters.

Other areas placed under Alert Level 2 from February 1 to 15 are Batanes, Bulacan, Cavite, Rizal, Biliran, Southern Leyte, and Basilan.

Under Alert Level 2, the buses, trains, jeeps can now serve up to 70% of their passenger capacities.

To recall, the government implemented the policy in early January to prevent the public transportation shut down and to stop the growth of new COVID-19 infections.

Meanwhile, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Secretary Eduardo Año, said that the monitoring will continue since commuters and workforce will increase.

Año also expressed the the de-escalation of different areas from Alert Level 3 to the Alert Level 2 is a sign that the public is following the guidelines and observing health protocols set by the authorities to contain the COVID-19 surge.

"Ang pinaka-importante kasi dyan 'yung cooperation ng lahat. Nakita naman natin nung nag-Alert Level 3, hindi na tayo nag-Level 4. Sila na 'yung nag-stop papunta ng mall, sila na mismo 'yung tumigil sa mga ibang activities," he said.

The alert level takes effect until Feb. 15 unless extended or lifted by the government. (JAFD/PIA-IDPD)
