Senator Ramon Revilla Jr.

Revilla urges DPWH to fast-track repair of Paeng-damaged infra

MANILA – Senator Ramon Revilla Jr. sent a letter on Wednesday to Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) Secretary Manuel Bonoan urging to expedite its efforts in the repair and reconstruction of bridges and other public infrastructure damaged by Severe Tropical Storm (STS) Paeng.

Revilla cited in his letter the Bantilan Bridge linking Sariaya, Quezon and San Juan, Batangas; the Paliwan Bridge connecting the Antique towns of Laua-an and Bugasong; and the Nituan Bridge in Parang, Maguindanao.

This, he said, is in addition to the collapsed Romulo Bridge in Bayambang, Pangasinan. The lawmaker, who chairs the Senate Committee on Public Works, stressed that these infrastructures need to be rectified and made accessible immediately as they are vital to the flow of people and goods in those areas.

“Bawat araw na lumilipas na hindi ayos ang mga tulay na ito ay napeperwisyo ang buhay at kabuhayan ng napakarami nating mga kababayan (Each passing day that these bridges are not repaired causes inconvenience to the lives of our people),” he said.

Japan’s speed in repairing and rebuilding damaged infrastructure, Revilla said, should be emulated by the DPWH.

He also asked Bonoan to immediately submit a report to his committee regarding the total damage sustained by public infrastructures, including dikes, revetments and other flood control structures, detailing the required funds for their immediate reconstruction with a timetable as to when the repairs will be completed.

Revilla assured the DPWH that he will personally seek the Senate Committee on Finance’s

help in assuring that necessary funds will be included in the DPWH’s 2023 national budget.

“While the DPWH has Quick Response Funds for times of calamities, these funds are not intended for reconstruction which is what is actually needed in this instance,” the lawmaker explained.

“Kaya kailangan malagyan ng pondo ang DPWH (That is why DPWH should be given funds) specifically for this purpose,” he added.

The lawmaker is currently going around Paeng-affected residents of Cavite to distribute relief packs and vowed to proceed to other provinces once he is done in his home province.

He also thanked President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. for personally visiting Cavite and for declaring a state of calamity in Calabarzon, Cavite’s region, as well as other regions affected by the weather disturbance.

“I agree with the President’s targeted approach. This will facilitate not only rehabilitation, but also in the prioritization of where assistance and resources should first be sent. With everyone’s support, I am optimistic na sapat na yung (that it will last for) six months,” Revilla said in a statement noting that the local government units can also declare a state of calamity on their own if necessary. Int'l travelers to PH reach nearly 2M

MANILA – The Philippines has received a total of 1,961,087 foreign visitors as of Nov. 8, the highest arrival figure since the onset of the pandemic.

Latest data from the Department of Tourism showed that this year’s top markets– the United States, South Korea, Australia, Canada, the United Kingdom, and Japan–make up half of the total arrivals.

From February to Nov. 8, over 370,000 visitors came from the US; 272,299 from South Korea; 93,011 from Australia; 85,784 from Canada; 74,777 from the UK; 73,054 from Japan; and 39,982 from India; 38,270 from Singapore; 33,696 from Malaysia; 32,139 from Vietnam; and 28,536 from Germany.

China, meanwhile, fell to 12th place from being the country’s second top source market for tourists prior to the pandemic.

The Philippines under the new administration has eased several protocols to sustain the increase in arrivals, including the lifting of entry restriction on unvaccinated foreigners provided they present a negative antigen test result.

In a recent engagement in London, Tourism Secretary Christina Frasco reiterated that the Philippines is ready to receive more leisure travelers.

Aside from international visitors, the country is also banking on the domestic tourism to fast-track the industry’s recovery.

“The strategy to be employed by this new administration in the Philippines is to maximize domestic tourism to be able to equalize tourism promotion development throughout and across our 16 regions and 81 provinces all over the Philippines and to give attention and promotion as well as development not only to our key destinations, but as well as our lesser-known destinations,” Frasco said.

“After all, we have 7,641 beautiful islands in the Philippines that are all worthy of a visit, whether from domestic or international tourists,” she added. source:(PNA)

Among all the regions of the country, Abalos said Region 3 (Central Luzon) garnered the highest number of awardees with a total of 61 LGUs composed of 51 municipalities, six cities and two provinces receiving the seal.

This is followed by Region 1 (Ilocos Region) with 54 awardees comprising 48 municipalities, four cities and two provinces, and Region 2 (Cagayan Valley) with 35 awardees from 29 municipalities, four cities, and two provinces.

Other SGLG awardees for 2022 include five in the National Capital Region; 12 in the Cordillera Adminis-



trative Region; 29 in Calabarzon; six in Mimaropa; nine in Region 5 (Bicol); 27 in Region 6 (Western Visayas); six in Region 7 (Central Visayas); 16 in Region 8 (Eastern Visayas); six in Region 9 (Zamboanga Peninsula); 26 in Region 10 (Northern Mindanao); 15 in Region 11 (Davao Region); 13 in Region 12 (Soccsksargen); 17 in Region 13 (Caraga); and, 14 in the Bangsamoro Autono-

mous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM).

All LGU awardees will be recognized and conferred with the 2022 SGLG marker in an awarding ceremony next month.

In addition to getting this year’s SGLG marker, LGU awardees are also eligible for the SGLG incentive fund to finance their local development initiatives in support of national goals and strategic thrusts.

The SGLG program, evolving from the Seal of Good Housekeeping, was institutionalized under Republic Act No. 11292 or The Seal of Good Local Governance Act of 2019.source: (PNA)
