Metro Manila, Cavite and others retains MECQ status until September 7

The Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) retained the Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) status of the National Capital Region.

Also under MECQ are Apayao, Ilocos Norte, Bulacan and Bataan in Region 3, Cavite, Lucena City, Rizal and Laguna in Region 4-A for Luzon; Aklan, Iloilo Province and Iloilo City in Region 6, Lapu-Lapu City, Cebu

City and Mandaue City in Region 7 for the Visayas; and Cagayan de Oro City for Mindanao.

NCR, Bataan and Laguna shall have added restrictions on dining, personal care services and religious activities.

Meanwhile, Ilocos Sur, Cagayan, Que-

zon and Batangas in Region 4-A, and Naga City for Luzon; Antique, Bacolod City and Capiz in Region 6, Cebu Province and Negros Oriental in Region 7 for the Visayas; Zamboanga del Sur, Misamis Oriental, Davao City, Davao del Norte, Davao Occidental

Construction of Retarding Basins to Solve Cavite Flooding Woes

The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) is optimistic that the construction of retarding basins will make flood hazard area in Cavite more resilient during rainy season and swift changes of global weather.

DPWH Secretary Mark A. Villar expressed confidence that the Flood Risk Management Project for Imus River is the most viable solution to mitigate damage on areas vulnerable to flooding in Imus and Bacoar, Cavite.

Baywalk waters may soon be fit for swimming, other recreations

MANILA – The waters off the Baywalk area along Manila Bay can soon be fit for swimming and other contact recreational activities.

Measures for rehabilitating Manila Bay will continue, so the concentration of fecal coliform bacteria in Baywalk's waters can dip further and eventually meet the 100 most probable number per 100 milliliters (MPN/100 mL) standard for accommodating such activities, noted Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Secretary Roy Cimatu.

VIRGIN COCONUT OIL VS COVID-19; PINAG-AARALAN NG MGA EKSPERTO

Patuloy ang mga pag-aaral na isinasagawa ng iba't ibang ahensya sa Pilipinas upang matukoy ang posibleng epekto ng paggamit virgin coconut oil (VCO) bilang pangontra sa COVID-19.

Kamakailan lamang, tinukoy ng Department of Science and Technology (DOST) ang tatlong pag-aaral tungkol sa maaaring maging epekto ng VCO. Ang mga pag-aaral na ito ay pondohan ng naturang ahensya.

Isa rito ay ang pag-aaral sa VCO na gawing isang "adjunctive therapy" para sa mga pasyenteng tinamaan ng COVID-19 na makakatanggap ng Php 8.4 milyong pondo mula sa DOST. Ibinibigay ang adjunctive therapy bilang isang tulong sa pangunahing paggamot na kailangan ng COVID-19 positive na pasyente.

Bukod sa posibleng magandang epekto

ng vco sa kalusugan ng mga mamamayan, isa pang nakikita ng ahensya ay ang maaaring mabuting epekto nito sa industriya ng niyog sa bansa.

Dagdag pa ryan, ang ikalawang pag-aaral ay isasagawa sa tulong ng 74 pasyente sa Philippine General Hospital na lalahok bilang maging parte ng standard care group o treatment group kung saan makakatanggap ang bawat isa ng 15mL na VCO tatlong beses sa isang araw sa loob ng dalawang linggo.

Sa loob ng dalawang linggo, mahigpit na oobserbahan ang lipid profile, creatinine, at blood sugar at maging ang posibleng epekto nito sa paggaling ng isang pasyente mula sa mga sintomas ng COVID-19.

Ang ikatlong pag-aaral ay ilulunsad naman ng Food and Nutrition Research Institute (FNRI) sa pamumuno ni FNRI Director Dr. Imelda

Angeles-Agdeppa na naglalayong pag-aralan ang maging epekto ng VCO sa mga suspected o probable COVID-19 patients na naka-quarantine sa isang isolation facility o ospital.

Ang ilan pa sa mga proyekto ng DOST ukol sa paggamit ng VCO ay kanilang ilulunsad sa kanilang Facebook page sa pamamagitan ng programang BIG 21 sa darating sa ika-7 ng Setyembre, 2021.

The P5.024 trillion is equivalent to 22.8 percent of the country's gross domestic product and is higher by 11.5 percent than the current 2021 national budget.

By sector, social services sector receives the biggest chunk of 2022 NEP with P1.922 trillion, which will fund health-related services such as continued implementation of the Universal Health Care Act, purchase of COVID-19 vaccines, procurement of personal protective equipment, among others. Education-related programs, including the implementation of the Universal Access to Tertiary Education, is also prioritized.

Next is the economic services sector, which gets P1.474 trillion largely to support flagship programs under the Build, Build, Build infrastructure program.

The general public services sector is allocated with P862.7 billion, debt burden with P541.3 billion, and defense sector



The Cavite Task Force Group for Manila Bay installed billboards at conspicuous places in the municipalities of Noveleta and Kawit, Cavite, and Bacoor notifying the public regarding the dismantling of illegal aquaculture structures in the said area on Sept 7.

The said activity was undertaken in compliance with the directive of Environment Secretary Roy A. Cimatu to regulate illegal fishing structures along Manila Bay and its tributaries. The said instruction was in view of the huge amount of bamboo poles from fish pens, fish cages, and baklads/sapras, which were washed from Cavite waters into the shore of Manila Bay due to the recent southwest monsoon.

We have high hopes that this project will reduced flood risk to local homes and businesses, said Secretary Villar.

According to DPWH Undersecretary for Unified Project Management Office (UPMO) Operations Emil K. Sadain, the construction of two (2) reservoir projects namely Imus and Bacoor Retarding Basins located in Brgy. Anabu and Brgy. Buhay na Tubig, Imus City, Cavite will reduce the flood peak discharges to low-lying part of Imus and Bacoor Rivers by temporarily managing flood run-off or stormwater in the off-site retarding basins.

The construction of Imus Retarding Basin has a detention pond area of about 35 hectares while Bacoor Retarding Basin has two (2) temporary storage pond or basin connected by sluiceway for a total area of 9 hectares to contain floodwaters during a storm event and reduce the peak volume of flood flow at Imus River and Bacoor River, added Undersecretary Sadain.

Retarding basins are being constructed to temporarily store most, if not all, of the rainwater run-

off during very high rainfall, to absorb and contain flooding in periods of high rain and later release at regulated flow rate.

The project is based on a flood management master plan for Imus River prepared by Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).

The ongoing structural measure is also being funded by JICA under its Official Development Assistance (ODA) facility and implemented by DPWH-UPMO Flood Control Management Cluster (FCMC) headed by Project Director Ramon A. Ariola III. Undersecretary Sadain together with UPMO FCMC Project Managers Aurelio C. Mendoza and Rogelio O. Ang checked on Friday, August 27, 2021 the progress of work for the putting up of pre-cast concrete blocks revetment wall at surrounding dike, overflow dike, drainage sluice, maintenance road, slope protection, and other project components.

To date, the P2.2 Billion project has a physical accomplishment of about 85 percent, and is slated to be completed by this fourth quarter of 2021.

"Hopefully, we'll be able to go into that standard by October," he said on Thursday during the government's Talk to the People program.

He noted dredging and other rehabilitative activities for Manila Bay are helping improve the quality of Baywalk's waters.

In 2019, the government commenced rehabilitation of Manila Bay so this historic water body can be fit again for contact recreation as ordered by the Su-

preme Court in 2008. Fecal coliform level there was around 1.26 billion MPN/100 mL when the government decided to undertake the rehabilitation, Cimatu noted.

He, however, said fecal coliform level in Baywalk waters already dipped to some 7,000 MPN/100 mL this August.

Treatment of effluent discharging into Manila Bay significantly contributed to such improvement said Manila Bay Coordinating Of-

fice project monitoring and evaluation officer Frann Serrano.

"Baywalk's Abad, Padre Faura and Remedios outfalls are no longer directly discharging effluent into Manila Bay," he said.

The effluent already flows into the new government-built sewage treatment plant to be treated there before being discharged into Manila Bay, he noted.

He said before the government implemented such protocol, fecal coliform

level in 2018 in Abad outfall's untreated effluent reached some 1.26 billion MPN/100 mL.

Fecal coliform levels in Padre Faura and Remedios outfalls' untreated effluent were correspondingly 7.62 million MPN/100 mL and 30.4 million MPN/100 mL in 2019 when DENR began monitoring water quality there, he continued.

"Previously, untreated effluent from the three outfalls directly discharged into Manila Bay, affecting wa-

SPEAKER VELASCO CALLS FOR 'SWIFT AND SMOOTH' PASSAGE OF 2022 NATIONAL BUDGET

Speaker Lord Allan Velasco on Thursday called for swift and smooth passage of the proposed P5.024-trillion national budget for 2022 to avoid a reenacted spending program and ensure continuous government operations amid the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

"We, in the House of Representatives, need to get our act together to ensure

swift and smooth passage of the 2022 national budget in order for the government to continue operating and provide much-needed services to the Filipino people as it is expected to," Velasco said.

The House chief issued the statement as the Committee on Appropriations, chaired by ACT-CIS Partylist Rep. Eric Yap, kicked off its deliberations on the last

full-year budget to be enacted under the administration of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte.

"Our aim is to pass the House version of the 2022 national budget by September 30 before we go on a break in time for the October filing of certificates of candidacy for all elective positions for the May 2022 elections," Velasco said.

Velasco said the ultimate goal is for Pres-

ident Duterte to sign the 2022 General Appropriations Act by December to prevent a reenacted budget that could slow economic growth and hamper the delivery of government services.

The budget deliberations began three

days after President Duterte—through the Department of Budget and Management—submitted to Congress the National Expenditure Program (NEP), which would assist the legislature in the review and deliberation of the government's

spending plan for next year.

The proposed 2022 national budget is focused on getting the Philippines back on the road towards full recovery from the devastating impacts of the pandemic.
