OATH-TAKING OF CAVITE ELECTED OFFICIALS

Governor Jonvic Remulla took oath of office on June 25, 2019 at the diocesan shrine of Saint Augustine, popularly known as the Santa Cruz Parish in Tanza. Outgoing Cavite Governor Boying Remulla led the simple oath-taking rites of the new governor and other elected officials in the province including Vice Governor Jolo Revilla, board members of the eight districts of the province as well as the elected officials of Tanza. Governor Boying Remulla also sworn to his duties as the 7th District Representative before Tanza Mayor Yuri Pacumio at the altar of the 200-year-old cross of the historic church where Gen. Emilio F. Aguinaldo took his oath of office as the president of the revolutionary government on March 23, 1897. Other guests who attended the ceremony were Senator Bong Revilla, city and municipal mayors, congressmen, councilors, families and friends of the elected officials and all the department and unit heads of the provincial government.

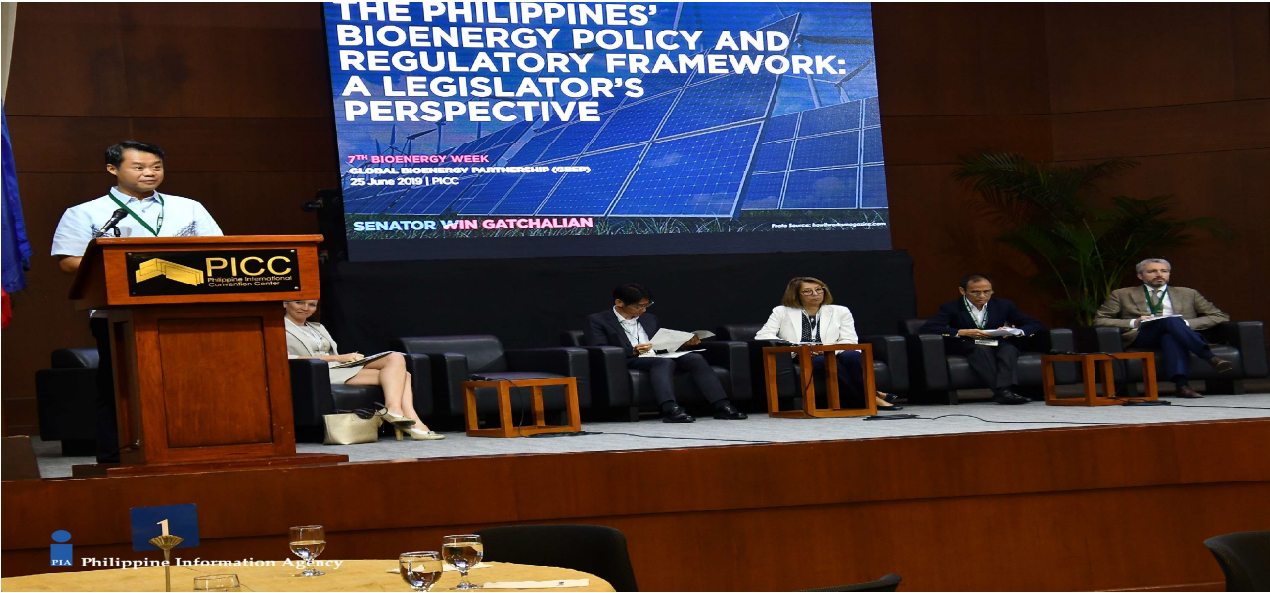

QUEZON CITY-The timing is perfect. This is what local proponents were saying in describing the Philippines' hosting of the 7th Bioenergy Week of the Global Bioenergy Partnership (GBEP) in Manila from June 24-28, where different countries discussed their utilization of biofuels and biomass.

Philippine Senator Sherwin Gatchalian, chair of the Senate Committee on Energy, said the event was "really timely" because, according to him, the Philippines embraced the use of bioenergy, particular biofuels, as well as renewable energy, even before its ASEAN peers.

"We came up with our renewable energy law ten years ago, we also have a biofuels law ten years ago, and the direction here is to embrace the use of renewable energy, as well as biofuels, and achieve two folds. Number one is to come up with a sustainable future for our next generation. Cleaner power, cleaner energy for the next generation. And the second is to help out our farmers increase their income, increase their productivity, and this will come

in the form of expanded use of methanol and biodiesel in our country," Gatchalian said.

For his part, Department of Energy Assistant Secretary Robert Uy said, "We would like to really thank the GBEP for considering the Philippines as a venue for the event. We have cooperation and the technologies here. We are going to learn all these experiences all over the world and hopefully we can have them adopted in the local content."

"As far as the Sugar Regulatory Administration (SRA) is concerned we strongly support the Bioenergy program under our government and surely whatever it is there for the bioethanol energy, the SRA supports," Administrator Hermenegildo Serafica said. SRA is one of the hosts of the major event that brought together public, private, and civil society stakeholders committed to promoting bioenergy for sustainable development.

Gatchalian admits however, that despite bioenergy remaining costly, he and other proponents still see its potential benefits to farmers and for the environment.

"One of the things we wanted to push in the country is R&D, meaning looking for alternative feedstock to supply biofuels. We need to conduct research and development as well as compare it with other countries' best practices around the world and bring that know-how here to the Philippines," he said.

"Unfortunately, even though we were one of the early adopters of bioenergy, biofuels, renewable energy, if you look at the statistics, its not growing at the phase that we want it to be. In fact, if you were going to ask our farmers, if they are benefiting from biofuels, our local farmers would probably have many qualms before they answer yes, but the farmers in the United States may probably answer a resounding 'yes' because half of our ethanol comes from abroad. And this is not the spirit of the Biofuels Act. The spirit of "biofuels" is really to propagate the use of ethanol and biodiesel in order to lift our farmers from poverty. But if you are importing half of our ethanol from the US, then we are not achieving what we want to achieve on our social aspect," he added.

Meanwhile, Sergio Taam, GBEP co-chair, said better energy access creates opportunities for the development of social programs such as healthcare, safer water supplies, sanitation, and better education facilities, and helping in the irradiation of poverty.

The previous Bioenergy Week was held in Buenos Aires, Argentina. (PIA InfoComm)

Watch: Cavite-Laguna Expressway progress update

Just last month, we were treated to another progress update on the Metro Manila Skyway Stage 3 Project courtesy of YouTuber dmitrivalencia’s drone-shot video. The guy recently headed down south to document more infrastructure projects, this time capturing the ongoing Cavite-Laguna Expressway Project (CALAX).

Yet again, we get to see the actual progress from a great point of view—hundreds of feet above the ground. As you watch the video, you can tell that the majority of the developments so far can be seen on the Santa Rosa and Laguna side of the project. Judging by how things look around the areas in Cavite, we can assume that it will only be a matter of time before major construction begins in those locations as well.

The CALAX is a four-lane tollway that will connect the Manila-Cavite Expressway (CAVITEX) and the South Luzon Expressway (SLEX) once completed. It stretches 44.2km long, starting from CAVITEX in Kawit and ending at SLEX in Mamlasan, Biñan, Laguna. The new roads will definitely ease the flow of traffic along major roads in both Cavite and Laguna. It will also provide cities and municipalities in both provinces a new route to the southern expressway, allowing for a seamless drive into Metro Manila.

According to the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), there will be a total of eight interchanges along CALAX, namely: Kawit, Open Canal, Governor’s Drive, Aguinaldo Highway, Silang East, Santa Rosa–Tagaytay Road, Laguna Boulevard, and Laguna Technopark. The project is set to be completed in October of 2020, as indicated in the government’s Build Build Build website./source:top gear

MEDICAL MISSION IN GEN. TRIAS PRIORITIZES PWDs

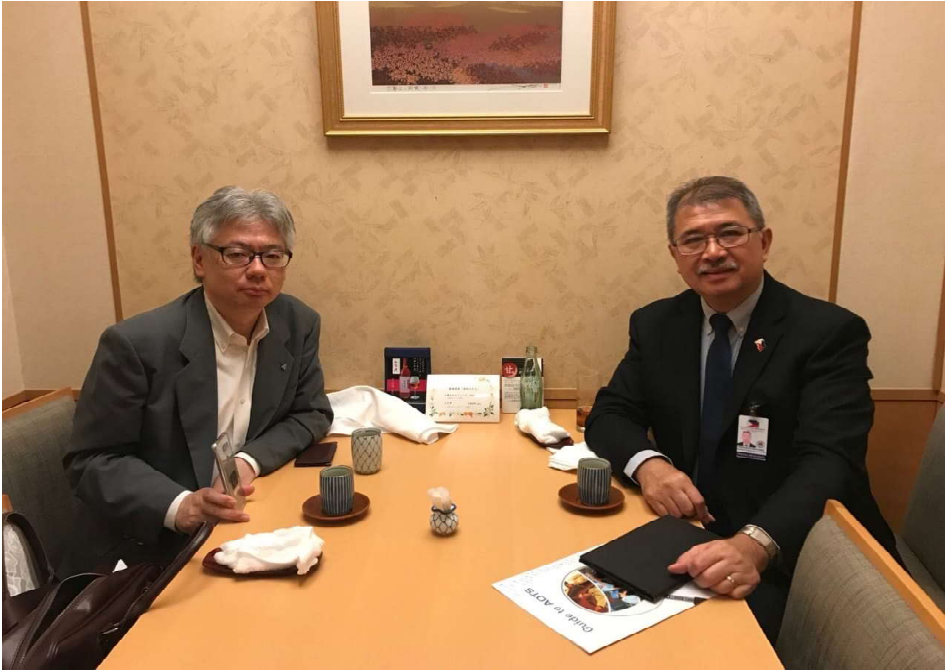

JAPAN MISSION HIGHLIGHTS COLLABORATION FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



The Nikkei Conference on the Future of Asia annually gathers leaders of business and government to share their assessment of Asia’s prospects and their positions on the trajectory that Asia should make and take for itself.

At the said conference, President Rodrigo R. Duterte topbills a roster of imminent speakers who will cover industry, the digital economy, commerce and trade, economic revitalization, and finance.

DOST Secretary Fortunato T. de la Peña, at the sidelines of the Nikkei, met with Tetsuiji Kawakami on May 29 to discuss opportunities for technical and management training either in Japan or onsite in a Japanese-affiliated company in a developing country particularly in ASEAN. Kawakami is the senior

managing director of the Association for Technical Cooperation and Sustainable Partnerships, a Japanese-affiliated company.

Recognizing the opportunity to support the creation of the Philippine Space Agency, Secretary de la Peña while in Japan sought to firm up the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on Space Cooperation with Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency or JAXA. The MOU provides the Philippines access to satellites and their applications (remote sensing, navigation, communication, disaster risk reduction.); co-development of satellites; joint research and access to launch vehicles; and capacity building for policy and technology development, as well as human resources upgrading.

During this mission,

DOST will also seek to open opportunities of sending more scholars to prestigious universities in Japan to pursue advanced degree programs in areas identified under the Harmonized National Research and Development Agenda but are not yet offered in local universities in the country.

DOST Sec. Fortunato T. de la Peña discusses opportunities for technical and management training with Tetsuiji Kawakami of the Association for Technical Cooperation and Sustainable Partnerships, a Japanese-affiliated company.

10K runners eyed as Sesame Street Run Tour kicks off in PH

MANILA -- About 10,000 runners are expected to participate in the Sesame Street Run Tour that will kick off at the SM by the Bay in Pasay City on August 17.

The event is a five-kilometer run to celebrate Sesame Street's 50th year.

"This is a once in a lifetime event, and it won't be staged again like on a yearly basis. The event really is to mark the Sesame Street's 50th year," Veronica Ramos, Aldenver marketing director, told the Philippine News Agency (PNA) on Thursday.

She said the run tour will kick off in the Philippines because the country has the biggest social media followers of Sesame Street. It will later be held in Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand, Indonesia and Hong Kong, she added.

What's unique about this run, Ramos said, is that there
