TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite (PIA) -- The local government of Alfonso entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Social Housing Finance Corporation (SHFC) on May 4 to help Alfonseños realize their dream of owning decent houses.

Alfonso Mayor Randy Salamat said the housing project, located in RS Ville, Barangay Taywanak Ibaba is a rent-to-own scheme payable within 30 years thru the SHFC.

A government owned and controlled corporation, SHFC is the

lead government agency that undertakes financing of social housing programs catering to formal and informal sectors with low-income.

TESDA seeks private sector partners under EBT programs

PhilGuarantee loans to MSMEs rise to P1.47B in end-March

MANILA - The Philippine Guarantee Corporation (PhilGuarantee) has continued to grow its program for viable but pandemic-hit micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) for the third straight month since its launch in December 2020, with a total of PHP1.47 billion in loans guaranteed as of end-March this year.

The guaranteed loans represent a remarkable 612-percent increase from the PHP207 million pilot guarantee portfolio achieved at the launching of the MSME Credit Guarantee Program (MCGP) in December, PhilGuarantee president-chief executive officer Alberto Pascual said in a report to Finance Secretary Carlos Domin-

Pascual informed Dominguez the number of MSME beneficiaries grew by an impressive 312 percent to 12.122 enterprises in March 2021 from 2.948 that were reported to have availed of its guarantee program as of December 2020.

He said the implementation of improved processing and evaluation parameters starting this year led to the increase in the number of beneficiaries under MCGP.

From the start of the MGCP's implementation last year, the PhilGuarantee Governing Board chaired by Dominguez thus far approved a total of PHP37.7 billion in credit guarantee facilities to 34 banks.

"Majority of the MSMEs covered were from the wholesale and retail sector which accounted for 67.26 percent of the total, or PHP503.5 million with 9,113 MS-MEs assisted." Pascual said

Pascual said the second-biggest group with guarantee coverage was the manufacturing sector, which accounted for 7.77 percent or PHP58.17 million with 1.048 assisted MSMEs.

The agriculture sector was the third biggest sector that have benefited from the MGCP, with 158 MSMEs assisted through guarantees amounting to PHP33.91 million, which is 4.53 percent of the loans covered so far under this program, he said.

In the severely affected hotel and restaurant sector, Pascual said 573 MS-MEs were assisted with guaranteed loans amounting to PHP28.45 million, while the personal services sector accounted for guarantees amounting to PHP31.82 million.

The MGCP grants a 50-percent guarantee for working capital loans and a guarantee of up to 80 percent of the amount for term loans of up to seven years for

The average loan size under the MGCP is less than PHP1 million, with the minimum loan amount set at PHP100,000, which can be availed mostly by micro-businesses borrowing from thrift banks and rural banks.

"In terms of geographical distribution, all regions of the country had received assistance under the MGCP," Pascual said.

The top three regions assisted in terms of guaranteed loan amounts were CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon) or Region IV-A with PHP135.76 million, Central Luzon or Region III with PHP118.87 million, and the Ilocos provinces or Region I with PHP65.82 million.

From three active banks in December 2020, Pascual said there are now 14 active banks participating in the MGCP as of March 31, 2021.

"Twelve more banks are expected to start submitting MSMEs for guarantee coverage as their facilities will be operational," Pascual said.

Under Republic Act (RA) No. 11494 or the Bayanihan to Recover as One Act (Bayanihan 2), MSMEs account for PHP2 billion of the PHP5 billion appropriated for PhilGuarantee to aid pandemic-hit enterprises.

The Bayanihan 2 allocation for PhilGuarantee enabled it to further widen its guarantee headroom of economic activities and extend more assistance to viable but severely affected MSMEs, Pascual said. (PR)

DILG assures public of transparency in the development of 822 remote barangays which are formerly communist strongholds

The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) today assured the public of transparency in the implementation of the P16.44-billion Barangay Development Program which will bring infrastructure and development projects to some 822 remote and neglected barangays nationwide that have been cleared of communist influence by government forces since 2019.

"The government's efforts in clearing these barangays of communist terrorists will be put to waste if we suddenly leave them hanging now that they have been freed from the clutches of communist terrorist groups. We therefore appeal to our Senators not to deprive these barangays of government support and assistance now that they need us most," said DILG Secretary Eduardo M. Año.

Año said the P16.44-billion fund for various infrastructure projects through the Support to the Barangay Development Program (SBDP) will bring development and improve the conditions of the people living in the remote 822 barangays mostly in mountainous areas that have long been neglected by the government.

"The very reason that these barangays were misled and influenced by the communist terrorist groups (CTGs) is because the people never felt the presence of government. For the first time, they will get the government attention and assistance that they deserve," he said.

Several senators and House representatives have sought to defund the National Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (NTF-ELCAC) and realign its budget, including the funds for the Barangay Development Program. The DILG is one of the key member-agencies of the NTF-ELCAC.

The DILG Chief said that under the SBDP, each cleared barangay will be given up to P20-million for various projects like farm-to-market roads; school buildings; water and sanitation system; health stations; rural electrification; agricultural, livelihood, and technical vocational training or projects; assistance to indigent individuals or families; housing; COVID-19 Vaccination and other health-related projects; and projects in connection with natural or human-induced calamities.

"After more than 50 years of insurgency problem, we are finally gaining traction in the whole-of-nation approach in ending local communist armed conflict through the efforts of our government forces and with the Barangay Development Program. Ituloy-tuloy na po natin ito para hindi na muli makapanggoyo pa ang mga communist terrorists at magkarooon na ng tunay na kapayapaan at kaunlaran lalo na sa 822 barangays na ito na matagal nang naiwan sa laylayan ng lipunan," he said.

According to Año, a total of 2,386 SBDP projects have been identified by the local government units (LGUs) themselves across 40 provinces, 198 cities and municipalities, and 822 barangays nationwide. So far, 1,460 out of 2,386 proposed projects have been endorsed to the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) worth P8.282-billion. These will benefit 31 provinces, 127 cities and municipalities, and 487 barangays nationwide.

Of the P16.44-billion SBDP fund, Region XI will receive P4.3-billion; Region XIII will get P3.82-billion; Region X will have P2.38-billion; Region VI will have P1.48-billion, and Region XII will receive P1.24-billion. Meanwhile, Region V will get P980-million; Region IX will have P680-million; Region IV-A will have P600-million; Region IV-B will get P500-million; Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR) will have P160-million; Region VIII and Region II will receive P120-million each; Region I will get P40-million, and Region III will have P20-million.

Pursuant Executive Order (EO) No. 70, SBDP is a national priority program of the government which provides the much-needed support, both infrastructure and social services, to the 822 barangays that were cleared from insurgency from 2016 to 2019.

Five-step barangay clearing process

Meanwhile, DILG Spokesperson and Undersecretary Jonathan E. Malaya said that the 822 target barangays first underwent the five-step clearing process through the DILG's Retooled Community Support Program (RCSP) before infrastructure projects through the SBDP will be implemented.

"These barangays underwent a long and rigid process before they were declared cleared of communist influence. Nagkaroon ng maraming konsultasyon, dayalogo at training sa mga namumuno at reorientation para sa publiko," he said.

RCSP is a convergence mechanism for local governments to come together and identify issues and government interventions, particularly at the barangay level. It is based on an empowerment framework that aims to improve people's ability to organize themselves and develop their development by implementing value-chain interventions to improve their current situation.

According to Malaya, Regions VI, X, XI, and XIII have already reached Phase 5 of the RCSP implementation process and have now moved to the SBDP phase. Other regions are expected to continue with their RCSP implementation this 2021.

The phases of barangay clearing are as follows: The RCSP program begins with EO 70 and RCSP orientation for local chief executives (LCE) and Sangguniang Bayan members, followed by Phase 1 on organizing and orienting the provincial, city, and municipal RCSP Core Team.
