CBCP urges 'digital media fasting' this Lent

With Lent approaching, the Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines (CBCP) is urging Catholics to fast not only from food but also from digital distractions.

CBCP President Gilbert Garcera said modern technology, while beneficial, often consumes attention and weakens spiritual focus, making digital media fasting a timely Lenten discipline.

"Excessive media use often leads to distraction, fatigue, loss of focus, weakened relationships, and diminished spiritual awareness," Garcera said in a pastoral letter.

"Digital media fasting helps restore balance and reminds us that technology must serve human life—not dominate it," he said.

Garcera emphasized that fasting is an interior act of renewal rather than a punitive measure, describing digital restraint as a way to cultivate silence, deepen prayer and strengthen relationships.

"Fasting is not for show but an intimate offering to God, who sees what is done in secret and rewards sincerity of heart," he said.

Cayetano sees pay ward access to help ease hospital congestion

MANILA – Allowing PhilHealth members to occupy vacant pay ward beds when basic wards are full will help decongest public hospitals and speed up patient admissions, Senate Minority Leader Alan Peter Cayetano said Monday.

Cayetano said the move makes full use of existing hospital capacity, particularly during peak periods when charity wards are overcrowded but some pay beds remain unused.

“Sometimes the problem is not the absence of a new policy, but the failure to use what is already allowed,” he said.

The senator earlier raised the issue during

Senate deliberations on the proposed 2026 budget of the Department of Health, questioning why vacant pay ward rooms could not be opened to patients waiting in full basic wards.

“If you go to PGH (Philippine General Hospital) or any other government hospital at puno ang basic ward, ano ang remedy ng pasyente? Kung may bakante na pay ward, hindi ba pwedeng gamitin iyon (what is the patient’s remedy)? If there is a vacant pay ward, can’t that be used?” he said.

During the hearing, Health Secretary Teodoro Herbosa said patients may be accommodated in vacant pay

wards, especially during congestion, though the practice varies by hospital.

“Pwede. We can actually allocate to pay ward and get a patient there lalo na kung bakante siya (Yes. We can actually allocate a patient to the pay ward, especially if it is vacant),” Herbosa said.

Cayetano said applying the arrangement more consistently across government hospitals, including major institutions such as the Philippine General Hospital, would promote efficiency and ensure patients are admitted promptly.

“All Filipinos deserve the best social services. We must make

better use of available facilities so patients are accommodated promptly and not left waiting for care. We want to make sure that no Filipino is left behind when it comes to healthcare,” he added. source: (PNA)

letter encouraged practical steps, including limiting screen use before sleeping and upon waking, observing device-free meals, removing distracting applications, and setting aside occasional 24-hour or weekend fasts. Garcera said digital media fasting is not anti-technology but an invitation to use technology more intentionally. “Digital media fast-

ing invites a rediscovery of silence, prayer, contemplation, and authentic relationships. It is not meant to punish the body but to free the heart,” he said.

He added that the practice may lead to greater mental clarity, emotional calm, improved rest, renewed physical energy, and stronger family and community bonds.

The CBCP called on

dioceses, parishes and families to promote digital media fasting during Lent and beyond.

“The Lord calls us to fast not with gloomy faces but with joyful hearts seeking renewal,” Garcera said. “In stepping back from digital excess, we reclaim interior silence, deepen relationships, and rediscover God’s presence in daily life.”

DepEd highlights importance of public-private partnership to improve learners' literacy

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — The Department of Education (DepEd) reaffirmed its commitment to improving learners' literacy through strengthened public-private partnerships in support of the BINHI Reading Program, one of the agency's key initiatives aimed at enhancing foundational reading skills among students.

DepEd Secretary Sonny Angara, during his visit to the Calamba Central Elementary School on Monday, February 9, where the program is being implemented, emphasized that collaboration with private partners has played a significant role in expanding the reach of literacy interventions, providing additional learning resources, and strengthening teacher capacity-building efforts.

"This is a big help because we know that sometimes we lack materials or the delivery of materials gets de-

layed. That's why this is really good to see—every child has their own reading kits, and it truly helps even at a young age. It also makes learning enjoyable. The children are very engaged, and this shows how valuable our private partnerships with DepEd really are," Angara said.

The BINHI Reading Program, initiated by BINHI Foundation Inc., is designed to address learning gaps in literacy, particularly among early-grade learners who require focused intervention in reading and comprehension. Through structured reading sessions, assessment tools, and targeted instructional strategies, the program seeks to ensure that students develop essential literacy skills at an early stage.

For BINHI Program Kit 0 Teacher Ivy Roquero, the program is deemed effective as it is structured progressively to match the learners' developmental stages,

ensuring that each child builds strong foundational skills before moving on to more complex reading tasks.

"It is helping our students, and we see it every day based on their performances in every activity, you see progress. In Kit 0 (kindergarten), we focus more on learning the sounds—how to blend and how to segment words. When they move to Kit 1, which usually starts in Grade 1, the learners begin reading sentences, phrases, and even paragraphs, already with comprehension. One of the goals of BINHI is, as much as possible, to develop learners into analytical thinkers," Roquero stated.

The department has likewise implemented the ARAL Program or the Accelerating Reading and Literacy, which aligns with the objectives of the BINHI Reading Program, that strengthens foundational skills through structured interventions,

targeted assessments, and focused support for learners who are struggling with reading.

"This is very good because as early as Kindergarten and Grade 1, children are already learning how to read and understand. That is truly the directive of President Marcos—to focus on literacy and basic reading. So this is very timely. We also have the ARAL Program, so everything is aligned. We will be able to help everyone and ensure that no child is left behind," Angara emphasized.

Through sustained collaboration and innovation, DepEd remains optimistic that strengthened partnerships will further enhance the implementation of the BINHI and ARAL programs, ultimately cultivating a stronger culture of reading and equipping Filipino learners with the essential skills needed for lifelong learning and future success. 755 Residents Benefit from Cavite Provincial Government's Health Outreach in Rosario
