Three High value individuals arrested in an Anti- illegal drugs operation in Bacoor City

Bacoor Component City Police Station -In a successful operation, the Bacoor Component City Police Station Drug Enforcement Team, in coordination with the Philippine Drugs Enforcement Agency (PDEA), apprehended four suspects involved in selling of alleged shabu. The buy-bust operation transpired on April 6, 2024 at about 6:30 AM, Brgy. Talaba 3, Bacoor City, Cavite.

According to the reports, the apprehended individuals, identified as aliases "KUYA" (38 years old), resident of Brgy. Zapote 1, Bacoor City, Cavite, "RON" (46 years old), and "LYCA", (26 years old), both resident of Taguig City, were categorized as "High Value Individuals" (HVIs). Their arrest followed an alleged sale of suspected shabu

to a police poseur buyer. Recovered from the suspects' possession were more or less Fifty (50) grams of suspected shabu with standard drug prize of Php 340,000.00 consists of three (3) pcs of heat sealed transparent plastic sachet and one (1) piece knot tied together with non-drug

Installation of Mokusaku Facility and Seminar on SAVERS Technology

Through the continuous collaboration with the Japan Agricultural Exchange Council (JAEC), the third batch of the Installation of Mokusaku Facility and Seminar on SAVERS Technology was conducted today.

The activity activity took place at Profeta Integrated Farm owned by Mr. Mario Profeta, a Magsasaka Siyenstista, in Brgy. Tres Cruces, Tanza, Cavite, with 25 participants who are farmer-leaders and Agricultural Extension Workers (AEWs) from various municipalities and cities across



Cavite Province.

Additionally, Mr. Seiya Yoshida, Mr. Rossian Sanagen and Mr. JR Perlas from JAEC, along with Ms. Bernadeth Carandang from Magallanes and Ms. Eva Pugay from Naic, shared

their expertise on SAVERS Technology and Mokusaku during the two-day activity.

The technology briefing was held successfully through partnership with the Office of the Provincial Agriculture Office of

Cavite, represented by Ms. Cynthia Perez, DA-Regional Field Office IV-A and Ms. Gerlie Aure, and the Municipal Agriculture Office of Tanza, through Municipal Agriculturist, Mr. Domingo Austria.

prevent the virus from further spreading.

"We highly encourage local health personnel to co-locate because one of our findings upon institutionalizing local government units in terms of DRRM-H (disaster risk reduction and management in health) is that they are located within the operations center," Francisco said.

He further explained: "We want reporting to be on time, and as much as possible, instances where individuals experience symptoms should be reported within 24 hours to prevent the disease from spreading."

Citing the country's experience during the COVID-19 pandemic, the DOH Calabarzon and its local counterparts will adopt the 'Prevent-Detect-Isolate-Test-Reintegrate' (PDITR) strategy on top of other infection prevention control measures.

The health department also reminded health fa-

cilities to implement infection prevention control protocols, such as proper disposal of infectious wastes.

"Infection prevention and control, as well as physical distancing inside health facilities are very important. The public is also encouraged to wear face masks to prevent infection, especially in large gatherings," the health officer said.

Other precautions to observe include proper and regular handwashing, keeping infants and children away from individuals with suspected symptoms, and having their children vaccinated.

The DOH Calabarzon assured the public of their readiness to accommodate the possible influx of outpatient consultations and admissions in health facilities, with their sufficient human resources, supplies, and equipment in rural health units and hospitals. (PB/PIA-4A)

PhilHealth coverage for breast cancer now upby P1.4M per patient

QUEZON CITY (PIA) -- To further aid breast cancer patients in the Philippines through their medical treatments, Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) enhances its coverage by Php 1.4 million, more than a hundred percent increase from its previous package of P100,000.

Under the PhilHealth Circular 2024-0007, which took effect on March 30, 2024, PhilHealth's Z Benefit Package now covers Stages 0 to 4 of breast cancer which previously covers Stage 0 to IIIA only.

"This significant leap in the Z Benefits Package for breast cancer is proof that PhilHealth is committed to delivering our mandate, to provide responsive benefits to our Kababayans and we will continue implementing benefits that will

improve the financial coverage under our thrust," said PhilHealth President and CEO Emmaniel R. Ledesma Jr. during a press conference in Pasig City.

"This package provides a 'holistic approach' to breast cancer treatment because it covers diagnostic tests, breast cancer management, up to surveillance or assessment for early signs of relapse after the surgery," he added.

Based on the guidelines of the circular, Php 1.4 million is the maximum amount a patient can avail for one cycle of care, from diagnostic tests to monitoring after a successful surgery.

Coverage

The mandatory services differ in package rates depending on the doctor's rec-

ommendation, and patient's condition.

Diagnostic tests and prognostication range from Php 1,000 to Php 10,000; surgical procedures and partial mastectomy to modified radical mastectomy range from Php 30,000 to Php 140,000; hormoneotherapy coverage is Php 2,700 or Php 18,000, while cytotoxic chemotherapy ranges from Php 43,000 to Php 185,010.

The bulk of the package falls to targeted therapy amounting to more than Php 1 million coverage, which translates to Php 333,336 for 18 maximum cycles.

The surveillance or monitoring is divided into basic and specific services, ranging from Php 5,000 and Php 9,000 respectively.

How to avail?

PhilHealth members or qualified dependents may visit any contracted health facilities near you (see list below).

Two of which are in Metro Manila, East Avenue Medical Center (EAMC) in Quezon City and Philippine General Hospital (PGH) in Manila.

Contact the Z Benefits Coordinator of any of the current contracted health facilities to guide you on the availability of the procedures.

Upon the submission of documentary requirements and approval of PhilHealth, the doctor may proceed to provide all mandatory services.

What is a Z Benefits Coordinator?

All contracted health facilities are required to have a Z Benefits Coordinator that will guide breast cancer patients throughout the process.

According to PhilHealth, they want to unburden the patient and their families to the process of availing the benefit.

A Z Benefits Coordinator is responsible to explain the process to the patient, coordinate with PhilHealth on matters pertinent to the availability of the patient, and remind of

lacking requirements and scheduled check-ups.

Added to the relief, PhilHealth also requires contracted hospitals to submit the patient's documentary requirements, and not the patient or family themselves.

At present, PhilHealth continues to beef up their information dissemination, not just to promote the significance of prevention through free consultations, but also encourage hospitals and other health facilities to be contracted under the package to make it more accessible to patients needing treatment.

CAVITE CITY (PIA) – A new 100-bed 3-storey mega health center in Cavite that will cater to the needs of a growing population in Cavite's 1st district aims to ease overcrowding in hospitals.

The Cavite City Medcare Mega Health Center, located in Barangay 28, Sea Breeze, Cavite City will provide free, accessible, and quality public health care services to Caviteños through its medical surgical, outpatient, diagnostic, birthing, emergency, and pharmacy services.

Health Secretary Dr. Teodoro Herbosa together with DOH Assistant Secretary Dr. Ariel Valencia, led the turnover ceremony, which was graced by Cavite City 1st District Rep. Ramon Jolo B. Revilla III, Cavite City mayor Denver Reyes-Chua, Cavite board member Ram Revilla-Bautista, and other city officials.

Cavite's 1st

district is composed of Cavite City and the towns of Noveleta, Kawit, and Rosario.

Sec. Herbosa assured the public that the DOH will continue its commitment to improving the quality of health services in the country, and will support the efforts of local government units

and its leaders to alleviate poverty through the 8-point action agenda of the department.

"The establishment of mega health centers like this is a way for us to finally achieve and strengthen universal health care. [We believe] that every life is valuable

Batangas to highlight 'goto,' 'kapeng barako' on Filipino Food Month

BATANGAS CITY – The provincial government of Batangas is taking full advantage of the celebration of Filipino Food Month to expand the markets of both the province's hospitality industry and the local agricultural sector.

DOH raises alert on pertussis in Calabarzon

CALAMBA CITY (PIA) – The Department of Health (DOH) in CALABARZON has activated its Incident Management Team (IMT) to augment the needs of local health offices following the declaration of a code blue alert in the region against pertussis.

In a Code Blue Alert, LGUs and health facilities are expected to provide surveillance re-

ports on pertussis cases to the Incident Command Systems to facilitate timely updates and data analysis.

Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management in Health (RDRRM-H) officer-in-charge, Joehl Francisco, urged local health offices to actively report suspected and confirmed cases of pertussis within 24 hours to
