

DOLE Cavite launches
Government Internship Program



Calamba hailed
as city with
cleanest air in PH

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) -- The city of Calamba in Laguna was recognized as the least polluted city in the Philippines and the sixth cleanest city in the entire Southeast Asian region, in terms of air quality based on the 2023 IQAir World Air Quality Report.

The report provided a review of PM2.5 air quality from 7,812 cit-

ies worldwide, and 357 regional cities in South-east Asia. Regarded as the most impactful of all air pollutants due to its small size, it can penetrate deep into the respiratory system causing harmful effects to the human body.

According to the study, Calamba ranked sixth in Southeast Asia and the cleanest in the

country, with an 8.2 µg/m3 average of PM2.5. Ranked ninth on the list is Carmona, Cavite, with 8.9 µg/m3, while Balanga, Bataan ranked 11th with 9.2 µg/m3.

To live through the distinction, Calamba City Environment and Natural Resources Office (CENRO) is set to strengthen the city's ordi-

Olympic berths

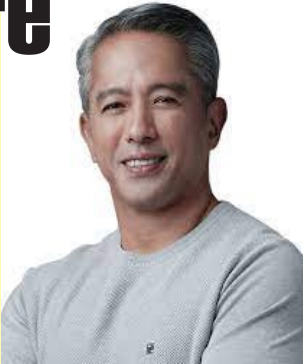
MANILA – Thirteen Filipinos have secured berths at the Paris Olympics while more are hoping to qualify for Team Philippines, which is celebrating its 100th year participation in the Games.

The Philippine Olympic Committee (POC) has formalized negotiations with a month-long training camp in a world-class facility at Les Arenes de Metz in France ahead of the July 26 to Aug. 11 Paris Olympics.

"We have, as of now, qualified 13 athletes for Paris," said POC president Abraham "Bambol" Tolentino during the first POC Journey to Olympic briefing at the Milky Way Restaurant in Makati City on Friday.

Those who earned direct qualification to Paris were pole vaulter Ernest John "EJ" Obiena; boxers Eumir Felix Marcial, Nesthy Petecio and Aira Villegas; weightlifters Vanessa Sarno, Erleen Ann Ando and John Febuar Ceniza; and gymnasts Carlos Yulo and Aleah Finnegan.

nances against the usage of single-use plastics to maintain a cleaner and sustainable environment.

In an interview with the Philippine Information Agency Usapang PIA radio program, Ronn Martin Reyes, the supervising environmental management specialist of CENRO Calamba emphasized that the local government plans to review and revise the current ordinances to dissuade residents from using plastic.

"We actually have regulations about the use of styrofoam and plastic bags, which are covered under the ordinance 10-481. We will be focusing on reviewing and strengthening these laws by campaigning to utilize alternatives," Reyes stated.

This initiative is integral to the new 10-year Solid Waste Management Plan of Calamba following the existing policies set by the national government.

He explained: "We will be revising it. The first thing we need to do is the Waste Analysis and Characterization. So, we have to study and analyze the contents of the waste from households and establishments. We need to determine the percentage of biodegradables, recyclables, residuals, and hazardous waste. We also want to include innovative technologies to improve our Solid Waste Management Plan."

Apart from this action, Reyes said that the city government's initiatives, projects, and ordinances are environment-centric under the leadership of Mayor Roseller Rizal and the support of Calamba CENRO.

This includes the establishment of Task Force KKK or the Kalikasan at Kalinisan para sa Kaligtasan, tasked with cleaning operations throughout the city, and the enactment of a city ordinance prohibiting the burning of garbage that may cause air pollution.

Calamba has received the distinction of being the cleanest city in Southeast Asia and in the country based on the 2018 IQAir World Air Quality Report, where the city then recorded an average of 9.2 µg/m3. (CO,CH/PIA-Laguna)

# Ang tunay na may-ari...

Hindi tumitigil ang China sa panghaharass at pambully sa Pilipinas. Kung anu-ano ang ginagawa ng chinese coastguards at palala nang palala ang kanilang istilo para itaboy ang mga Pinoy coastguards sa West Philippine Sea (WPS) at naghahatid ng supplies sa mga kasamahang nasa Ayungin Island. Ayon sa International Law, ang WPS ay bahagi ng karagatang sakop ng Piliinas. Ang ibang bansa ay naniniwala rito, subalit ang china ay hindi, at nagsasabing sila ang may-ari ng nasabing lugar. Hindi na kailangang isa-isahin pa ang mga karahasan at panggigipit na ginagawa ng mga Intsik sa WPS. Alam na ito ng lahat. At nito lang nakalipas na linggo, may lumabas na balitang ikinawindang ng mismong si Pangulong BongBong Marcos. Diumano, may "Gentlemen's agreement ukol sa West Philippine Sea ang Manila at Beijing noong panahon ng administrasyong Duterte". "I am horrified by the idea that we have compromised... through a secret agreement, the territory, the sovereignty and sovereign rights of the Philippines," ayon pa sa pahayag ni PBBM.

Ayon sa dating tagapagsalita ni ex-Pres. Digong Duterte na si Harry Roque, may gentlemen's agreement" diumano sa pagitan nina Duterte at Xi ng China para sa status quo sa WPS, at pinapayagan ng china ang resupply missions sa Sierra Madre, subalit hindi ang pagdedeliber ng construction materials para sa pagsasaayos ng naturang barko. Subalit binigyang diin naman ni Roque na hindi ipinangako ni Duterte na aalisin ang Sierra Madre sa Ayungin. Ngunit ayon naman kay Salvador Pan-elo, dating chief legal counsel ni Duterte, "quoted" niya ang dating Pangulo na nagsabing WALANG GENTLEMANS AGREEMENT.

Pinanindigan naman ni Roque ang kanyang sinabi. Bago lumipad patungong US si PBBM noong Miyerkules, sinabi nito na walang proof o ebidensya ng secret agreement at hindi ito legally binding dahil typically oral. # Cavite bolsters vaccination against pertussis

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) – The Cavite Provincial Health Office (PHO) heightens its response against the highly infectious Pertussis by targeting unvaccinated individuals, particularly infants in their Outbreak Immunization Response (ORI) program.

The ORI program is in addition to their ongoing routine immunization against pertussis, following the declaration of a state of calamity in the province due to the increase in confirmed and suspected cases of the disease in Cavite from January to April 2024.

Based on the data presented by Ralph Laurence Figueroa, the health education and promotion

officer-designate of Cavite PHO, there are 17 cases of pertussis recorded throughout 2023. By the first quarter of 2024, cases had significantly increased to 36 diagnosed and suspected patients, resulting in 6 deaths during the said period.

"From January 2024 to March 25, 2024, we recorded a total of 36 cases. The number of cases increased significantly at around a 3,500% increase in cases. Aside from that, there were six deaths recorded during that period," Figueroa stated.

While pertussis can infect anyone, the Cavite PHO primarily focuses on vaccinating in-

ants and children, as they are deemed the most vulnerable to the respiratory disease.

As of March 30, 2024, individuals infected by the highly contagious disease in the province range from 1 day old to 26 years old.

Figueroa explained: "We are currently prioritizing unvaccinated or under-vaccinated children, particularly those who haven't completed their primary dose. We cannot deny that we still have shortages of vaccines against pertussis at the moment, which is why we prioritize those unvaccinated or under-vaccinated children."

Children ages 1 and a half months old, 2

and a half months old, and 3 and a half months old need to be administered with the Pentavalent vaccine. The vaccine requires three doses and should be completed within a 4-week interval between doses to protect against pertussis.

In general, the provincial government of Cavite maintains close coordination with other frontline government agencies, including the Department of Health for the timely reporting of cases, the status of vaccine delivery, and other supplies needed by the province.

Along with getting vaccinated to boost defenses against pertussis, the public is encouraged to wear masks if experiencing

a cold or cough, consume nutritious food, and ensure adequate sleep or rest.

As of April 6, 2024, despite continuous measures to control the contagious disease, the DOH-Regional Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit has reported 59 confirmed and suspected pertussis cases in Cavite, with 8 fatalities due to the disease. (CO/PIA-4A)
