


CAVITE PNP ARRESTED 31 INDIVIDUALS IN AN OVERNIGHT POLICE OPS

Camp BGen Pantaleon Garcia, Imus City, Cavite - Police authorities arrested 31 individuals and recorded 629 Minimum Public Health Standards (MPHS) violators in an overnight anti-criminality campaign on April 12.

In the campaign against illegal drugs, 18

individuals were arrested during a buy-bust operation conducted by Cavite PNP and confiscated 44 pieces of small size heat-sealed transparent plastic sachets (HSTPS) containing white crystalline substance suspected as shabu, and other drug paraphernalia. the crime of Slight Physical Inju-

Restrictions, incentives may encourage Filipinos to get booster

MANILA – Restrictions and providing incentives could encourage fully vaccinated individuals to receive their booster shots, a health expert said last Thursday.

In an online forum, Philippine College of Physicians president Dr. Maricar Limpin echoed the suggestion of Presidential Adviser for Entrepreneurship Joey

Concepcion on mobility restrictions and a reward system that may help improve the vaccination numbers, especially in areas with low coverage.

"Probably, we can restrict and if the private sector can afford it, then, there can be some incentives para maeniganyo natin ang mas maraming tao (so we can entice more people)," she said.

She said correct information on Covid-19 vaccines and their benefits must be communicated to the public.

terests in the programs, projects, and activities addressing this concern," dagdag ni Kal. Briones.


The NLA is expected to retain, expand, and establish literacy steps in motivating and recognizing individuals, institutions, and LGUs through awards and appropriate recognition.

COVID-19 NEW CASES IN CALABARZON CONTINUE TO DECLINE as of April 7

The Department of Health (DOH) – CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, Quezon) reported a total of 17 new cases of Covid-19, 5 are from Batangas, Laguna- 8, Cavite-2, Rizal- 1, Quezon 1 and Lucena City with zero case, making a total of 497,215 cases recorded in the region as of April 7, 2022.

"Amidst the gradual decrease of COVID-19 cases in the region, we would like to emphasize the observance of safety protocols. Ang laban natin sa COVID-19 ay hindi pa tapos,

kaya 'you must not let your guard down,' Regional Director Ariel I. Valencia emphasized.

DOH Regional Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (RESU) recorded a total of 189 active cases and 483,631 recoveries with 13,395 deaths.

The province of Cavite has the highest recorded COVID-19 cases

with 170,922, followed by the Province of Laguna with 125,057, Rizal Province with 87,750, Batangas Province with 81,310, Quezon with 25,775, and Lucena City with 6,401.

"Sa datos ng ating Regional and Surveillance Unit, patuloy ang pagbaba ng kaso ng COVID-19 cases sa lahat ng lugar sa Calabarzon, dahil dito apat na prob-

insya na ang isinailalim na sa pinakamaluwag na risk classification," he added.

Four (4) provinces in the region are now under alert level 1 after the Province of Rizal was recently included in the de-escalated areas to Alert Level 1, while Quezon remained at Alert Level 2 until April 15.

issue a local policy aimed at institutionalizing the program implementation and the allocation of funds. With the program implementation, the rehabilitated RPWUDs can look forward to being assisted by the government in their journey back to their families and communities.

Presently, the Department continues to advocate for the institutionalization of YBP in all localities, and has identified three model/pilot areas wherein implementation is closely monitored, and breakthroughs are documented for possible replication. These model/pilot areas are Tuy, Batangas; Barbaza, Antique; and Glan, Sarangani.

Based on the March 2022 report, the LGUs with existing MOA with the DSWD are composed of three provincial LGUs; 17 City LGUs; and 111 municipal LGUs.

Of the total LGUs, 34 are from Central Visayas with the rest distributed in all regions nationwide as indicated by the signed and duly notarized MOAs.

In line with the Mandanas ruling, the DSWD is currently transitioning to fully devolve the implementation of key programs to the LGUs, including the YBP.

With illegal drugs a threat to the development of the sectors that DSWD serves, the Department continues to exert all efforts at advocating the institutionalization of the YBP in all LGUs. ###

Under alert level 1, Intrazonal and interzonal travel movements are permitted without regard to age and comorbidities. Also, all establishments, persons, or activities, are allowed to operate, work, or be undertaken at full on-site or venue/seating capacity provided it is consistent with minimum public health standards; provided further, that face to face classes for basic education shall be subject to prior approval of the Office of the President.

As of April 7, 2022, fully vaccinated individuals in the region reached 10,005,639 (74%), 10,581,727 (79%) got their initial dose, while 2, 066, 977 (21%) got their booster shots.

“Patuloy po nating ikinakampanya ang pediatric vaccination sa mga batang edad 5-11 taong gulang at maging ang booster shots sa iba pang eligible population para makumpleto ang three doses na kailangan para sa mas kumpletong proteksyon laban sa virus,” he concluded.

DA assures intensified
local food prod'n during
Filipino Food Month kick-off



Agriculture Secretary William Dar expressed support for the annually-held Filipino Food Month (FFM) celebration, stressing that it is aligned with the mission of the Department of Agriculture (DA) in supporting local food producers in terms of livelihood and market linkage.

“Promoting our local culinary heritage can create demand for Philippine agricultural produce both in local and in international food and beverage markets,” he said during the kick-off event on April 4, 2022.

The DA chief added that this collaboration is important especially during challenging times brought by the Covid-19 pandemic and the ongoing crisis between Ukraine and Russia, which caused the price hike in fuel, agricultural inputs, and various commodities.

“This is the time for the government to turn crisis into an opportunity by budgeting more resources for agriculture so that we can level up local food production in the country. The budget has to be substantially increased if we want to achieve food sovereignty for our country,” he appealed.

In support of his vision of food sovereignty in the Philippines, Dar called on the Bureau of Plant Industry (BPI) and the High-Value Crops Development Program (HVCDP) to assess possible assistance in production, provision, and distribution of native herbs and ingredients necessary for creating Filipino food.

The secretary also announced that DA has recently signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA), Department of Tourism (DOT), and Philippine Culinary Heritage Movement (PCHM) to further reinforce cooperation among four institutions in promoting culinary traditions and food tourism.

“Food is our common ground. It brings happiness, satisfaction, and it connects us all. It is a catalyst of development, and change not only for our physical well-being and basic needs, but for our nation's progress as well. We have a very rich and diverse culinary tradition and treasures that we need to preserve and protect,” Secretary Dar shared.

Meanwhile, Undersecretary for High-Value Crops and Rural Credit and DA FFM Steering Committee Co-chair Evelyn Laviña stressed the role of Filipino cuisine in the preservation of the country's sense of identity and culture.

Highlighting the concept of Filipino food as a centerpiece of Filipino gatherings, Usec. Laviña remarked how “it binds people together behind a common source of cherished communal experience” to nourish both the body and the community spirit.

“Filipino food is an amalgam of many influences from all over the world and culture, which our mothers and great grandmothers over the centuries have magically fused, reinvented, and reformulated to suit our palates and preferences while incorporating and adapting a diverse and rich source of available regional ingredients in creating unique Filipino cruises from Batanes to Basilan,” she added.

The FFM was made possible by Presidential Proclamation No. 469, which recognizes the role of the state in the “preservation, enrichment, and dynamic evolution of a Filipino national culture” and in extending “support to agriculture through appropriate technology and research, and adequate financial, production, marketing, and other support services”.

DA Undersecretary for Consumer and Political Affairs Kristine Evangelista, also co-chair of the DA FFM Steering Committee, described the event as “one of the best initiatives of the Philippine government to harness the capacities of the private sector to enhance Philippine agriculture.”

This year's celebration encapsulates the theme, “Pagkaing Pilipino, Susi sa Pag-unlad at Pagbabago”.

The opening ceremony was also attended by Usec. Fermin Adriano, Usec. Leocadio Sebastian, and Asec. Noel Reyes, among many others. DOT Secretary Bernadette Romulo-Puyat, NCCA Chair Arsenio Lizaso, and PCHM Founder and President Jam Melchor also took part in the celebration via video message. ### (Krystelle Ymari A. 131 LGUs commit to implement DSWD's Yakap Bayan Program

A total of 131 local government units (LGUs) nationwide signed recently an agreement with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) for the implementation of the Yakap Bayan Program, the reintegration intervention strategy for the rehabilitated Recovering Persons Who Used Drugs (RPWUDs).

YBP is a holistic intervention to assist RPWUDs in their recovery journey and to facilitate their reintegration to their families and their respective communities. The program is the core contribution of the DSWD to the government's fight against illegal drugs.

As of March 31, 2022, some 131 LGUs nationwide have entered into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the DSWD committing to implement the YBP in their respective jurisdiction.

The YBP implementation entails the provision of aftercare services, such as relapse prevention sessions, counselling sessions, health and fitness therapy, spiritual interventions, and skills training, among others, to improve the well-being and social functioning of RPWUDs.

Under the MOA, the LGUs are expected to

Bus terminals on ‘heightened alert’ for Holy Week exodus

MANILA – Bus terminals nationwide will be put on “heightened alert” starting Friday to April 16 as part of the government’s preparation for the exodus of devotees and vacationers during the Holy Week and summer vacation.

In a statement on Wednesday, the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) said its central office and regional directors were given orders to work with other government agencies in ensuring the security of commuters and proper observance of protocols in all bus terminals.

“Inaasahan ang matinding pagdagsa ng mga pasahero dahil sa Semana Santa (We are expecting a massive influx of passengers because of the Holy Week),” the LTFRB said.

Under the program, dubbed “Oplan Biyaheng Ayos: Summer Vacation 2022” of the Department of Transportation

(DOTr), the LTFRB would carry out random inspections of buses to ensure their roadworthiness and the safety of passengers.

Commuters in the NCR and neighboring cities are advised to use the four major land terminals -- the Parañaque Integrated Terminal Exchange (PITX), the Santa Rosa Integrated Terminal (SRIT), and the North Luzon Expressway Terminal (NLET), and the Araneta Center Terminal.

Malasakit Help Desks will be set up in integrated terminals and in areas near private terminals to provide information to commuters.

Private terminals in the NCR are allowed to operate only from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. in accordance with the “window scheme” being implemented by the Metropolitan Manila Development Authority, the LTFRB said. SOURCE:(PNA)
