The Office of the Provincial Public Employment Service Manager (OPPEM), headed by Ms. Rizalie Pinpin-Enero, collaborated with the local government of Cavite City, under the leadership of Mayor Denver R. Chua, for the successful run of the Cavite Career Caravan in Cavite City on February 19, offering a wide-array of opportunities for Caviteño jobseekers.

The initiative successfully brought together 330 registered job seekers, 40 local, and 3 international companies offering a total of 12,419 job vacancies. A total of

30 applicants were hired on the spot. Additionally, 11 national government agencies were present to assist participants in updating their records. These agencies included the Philippine Statistics Authority, Social Security System, PAGI-BIG Fund, Department of Trade and Industry,





DOST Cavite Eyes Tech Upgrade for Magallanes Women's Cooperative



The Department of Science and Technology (DOST) Cavite, in coordination with the Forest Products Research and Development Institute (DOST-FPRDI), conducted a field visit at the Magallanes Women's Club Multi-Purpose Cooperative (MAWCO) in Magallanes, Cavite on February 20 to evaluate the proposed site for an upcoming project. The visit aimed to assess the suitability of the location for the installation of equipment that will be provided to the cooperative under the proposed initiative.

The DOST-FPRDI team carefully inspected the area to determine if it meets the technical requirements necessary for safe and efficient equipment operation. The assessment focused on space, structural condition, accessibility, and other essential

PGC offers free healthcare services for Kawit Kalayaan Hospital's 30th anniversary

In line with the 30th anniversary celebration of Kawit Kalayaan Hospital on February 20, the Provincial Government of Cavite (PGC) intensified its commitment to accessible healthcare by conducting a comprehensive Medical and Dental Mission for Caviteños. The activity was spearheaded by the Office of the Provincial Governor's Medical Mission Team and the Office of the Provincial Health Officer, in collaboration with the



Southern Tagalog Regional Hospital. A total of 274 residents from various areas of Cavite directly benefited from the outreach activity. The mission delivered a wide range of free healthcare services, including medical consultations, physical check-ups, dental treatments such as oral examinations and extractions, cancer screenings which provided residents with an opportunity for early detection and timely medical



intervention. Prescription medicines were also distributed during the activity. 

Pilgrimage to bring St. Francis relic to parishes nationwide

Catholics across the Philippines will have the rare opportunity to venerate a first-class relic of Saint Francis of Assisi during a nationwide pilgrimage.

The relic relic, classified as "cineribus corporis," contains the bodily ashes of the saint.

The pilgrimage, called "Lakbay ni Francisco," was formally launched Feb. 21 at St. Francis of Assisi Parish in Mandaluyong City.

Organized by the Blessed Ivan Merz Family, an association with roots in Croatia, the initiative collaborates with the Secular Franciscan Order to promote devotion.

The tour marks the 800th anniversary of the death of Saint Francis, the Italian friar who died in 1226.

Church officials said the pilgrimage is meant to honor Saint Francis' legacy while inspiring prayer, reflection, and spiritual renewal among the faithful nationwide.

The Church also reminded participants of the spiritual graces associated with acts of devotion.

"The indulgence is a manifestation of God's mercy... granted through the Church to remit the temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven," the Apostolic Penitentiary said.

DOH calls for systemic approach in solving malnutrition

Calamba City- The Department of Health (DOH)'s Philippine Multisectoral Nutrition Project (PMNP) has called for a multisectoral and systemic approach to addressing malnutrition in the region during its Regional Local Government Unit Mobilization and Technical

Assistance Team Meeting and Coordination in Calamba City, Laguna, from February 18 to 20, 2026. The PMNP-- whose programs focus in Quezon Province, is comprised of National Government Agencies,

local government units, and civil society organizations-- with a shared goal of ending malnutrition through coordinated supervision and mentoring activities aimed at strengthening the capacity of local government units in implementing their nutrition programs.

Bam Aquino's twin housing measures to benefit urban poor, low-income families

Senator Bam Aquino has filed two housing-related measures aimed at establishing an inclusive resettlement program for informal settler families (ISFs) and creating a loan condonation program for low-income families with delinquent socialized and low-cost housing loans.

Aquino submitted Senate Bills No. 1861 and 1863 ahead of his meeting with urban poor organizations at the Senate, where he committed to finding ways to address their relocation issues and to ensure that their welfare is fully and adequately protected.

The bills were inspired by the success-

ful housing initiatives of late Jesse Robredo during his time as Mayor of Naga City and later as Secretary of the Department of the Interior and Local Government.

Senate Bill No. 1861 prioritizes the establishment of on-site, in-city, and near-city relocation programs to keep families close to their jobs and other livelihood opportunities, with off-city resettlement as a last resort.

"It institutionalizes a clear order of preference in resettlement, prioritizing on-site, in-city, and near-city options before off-city relocation, so families can remain close to jobs and opportunities," Aquino

no said, adding that the measure also helps strengthen the role of local government units in leading accountable and coordinated resettlement programs.

lance (IVS), real-time mapping, automatic gate barriers, and Augmented Reality (AR) surveillance—enhancing resources, and ensuring a safer operational environment.

This initiative aligns with the focused agenda of CPNP PGEN Jose Melencio C Naratez Jr, on Employing Enhanced Managing Operations and PRO4A's strategic pillars under the Proactive Anti-Criminality Campaign, strengthening security, operational readiness, and technological innovation for a safer community.

ed families to actively participate in planning, ensures social preparation, livelihood support, and access to basic services, and incorporates safeguards against forced evictions.

“By mandating adequate consultation, integrating livelihood support, clarifying inter-agency responsibilities, and reinforcing safeguards against forced eviction, the bill transforms existing principles into concrete, operational standards,” Aquino pointed out.

“Inclusive cities are built by ensuring that the workers who power our economies, the families who sustain our communities, and

the vulnerable sectors who face the greatest risks are not left behind,” he added.

Meanwhile, Senate Bill No. 1863, or the Housing Loan Condonation Act, allows low-income families with delinquent socialized and low-cost housing loans to restructure payments without processing fees or down payments, condone accumulated interest and penalties upon approval, and provide a more affordable interest rate, flexible repayment terms, and incentives for timely payments.

The measure covers loans under the National Housing Authority (NHA), Social Housing Finance Corporation (SHFC), National Home

Mortgage Finance Corporation (NHMFC), and Philippine Guarantee Corporation (PGC)

“By giving struggling families a realistic path to recover their housing loans, this measure strengthens communities, prevents unnecessary displacement, and safeguards prior government investments in socialized housing,” Aquino said.

“It forms part of a broader housing reform agenda to build more homes, protect families from displacement, and ensure that beneficiaries of government housing programs are not left behind by inflexible financing terms,” he added.

One of the 2025 Gawad Lingkod Bayani awardees is Dalisay Lopez, a laboratory aide at the Pesticide Management Division of the National Crop Production Center (NCPC) at the University of the Philippines. She initially did not expect to advance to the regional level, much less be recognized as one of the award recipients.

“I had always wished for it and truly wanted it, so that when I retire, I could leave behind something meaningful, something that would serve as an inspiration to

our colleagues. When we received the news, I told my boss, ‘This is it—the moment we’ve been hoping for has finally come. We’re going to receive this award.’”

Through her work, Lopez chose to persevere so she could support her family and help fund her siblings’ education, even if it meant not finishing her own studies. She said that what mattered most to her was having the heart and determination to provide for her family.

“I am grateful to have contributed to our institution in my own way. Considering how large the UP system is, making it through is truly an honor. Even though I hold a mod-

est position, being part of this recognition is already more than I could have asked for.” Lopez, along with the other awardees, is among the public employees exemplifying that the spirit of dedicated public service remains alive and thriving in the government.

As the CSC continues its search for exemplary civil servants through the Gawad Lingkod Bayani, it enables government employees to persevere more in their work, make meaningful contributions to the Filipino people and the nation, and bring honor to themselves and their institutions.
