CALABARZON MEDICAL FRONTLINERS GETS SINOVAC JABS

The Department of Health (DOH) - Calabarzon (Cavite, Laguna, Rizal, Batangas, Quezon) began vaccinating its medical frontliners against the Covid-19 virus starting with the staff of Antipolo City Hospital System Annex II in Antipolo City.

The ceremonial Covid-19 vaccination was led by Secretary Vivencio B. Dizon, Deputy Chief Implementer and Testing Czar, DOH Assistant Secretary Maria Francia M. Laxamana, Department of Interior and Local Government Assistant Secretary Manuel B. Felix, Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo and Mayor Andrea Bautista-Ynares.

Secretary Dizon, who is one of the guests of honor, assured that the government is doing its best to procure more vaccines as the number of

CAVITE EVACUATION PLAN FOR TAAL VOLCANO ERUPTION BARED

More than three hundred participating Punong Barangays, respective mayors from four municipalities of Batangas including Agoncillo, Laurel, Lemery and Talisay, and eight LGUs in Cavite composed of

Alfonso, Amadeo, General Emilio Aguinaldo, Indang, Magallanes, Mendez, Silang and Tagaytay City as well as other local officials of Cavite attended the Coordination Meeting for the Taal Volcano Eruption Evac-

uation Plan on March 2, 2021 at the Tagaytay International Convention Center covered court in Tagaytay City.

Cavite Governor Jonvic Remulla personally led the meeting together with Vice Governor

Jolo Revilla and underscored the importance of the preparations. He recalled that during the Taal volcanic eruption in January 2020, more than 52,000 evacuees from Batangas went to Cavite and how both provinc-

es met many challenges along the way. This prompted the provincial government to craft disaster preparedness measure as the activity of Taal volcano cannot be predicted. The evacuation

15 New Rice Trainers Ready For Rollout

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite - Now on its third year of implementation, ATI Calabarzon funded and facilitated the first batch of "Training of Trainers on Production of High-Quality Inbred Rice Seeds and Farm Mechanization" in 2021.

Fifteen (15) farm owners, & farmers' cooperative/association members graduated from the first batch of the Training of Trainers on Production of High-Quality Inbred Rice Seeds and Farm Mechanization which ran from February 15 to 25, 2021 at Villar SIPAG Farm School in Bacoor City, Cavite & ATI CALABARZON in this city.

The training aims to enhance the knowledge and skills of the participants on modernized production technologies of high-quality inbred rice and seeds and acquaint them on the implementation procedures of the Farmers' Field School on Production of High-Quality Inbred Rice Seeds Certification and Farm Mechanization. The intensive activity involved participatory discussions, workshops, practical hands-on activities on high-quality inbred rice seed production & farm mechanization through experts from DA RFO IV-A, PhilMech, PhilRice and other partner agencies. Topics on RCEF LSA Certification & Farm School TESDA Accreditation were also discussed during the week-long activity. Participants were also able to present selected topics on PalayCheck System during the microteaching activity.

Atty. Rhaegee Tamaña, Chief of Staff of Senate Committee on Agriculture and Food stressed in her message, "Mag-apply as accredited RCEF LSA ng ATI at kalaunan ay maging TESDA Farm School ng maibahagi ang mga natutunang makabagong kaalaman sa kapwa magsasaka." One of the graduates, Wilma Isabel Bulan from Sta. Cruz, Occidental Mindoro shared her meaningful journey in the training.

"After this training, we now carry the initial led to start transferring and teaching what we have learned to our fellow farmers. Pass on the ball to keep rolling, so many famers will know and be educated to improve their present practice. Experience plus tested new technology, teaching combined, by and by will achieve better results. Application [of the learnings] is not constant: it has to be flexible depending on many different factors. people who want to be vaccinated has increased. "We will have adequate supply of vaccines as they are still arriving so there's no need to worry because there's more to come," he stated during his message.

Aesc. Laxamana, on the other hand, emphasized that the vaccine is safe. "Our healthcare workers be protected against COVID-19 in order for them to continue providing the best care for our patients. And getting vaccinated is the only way for them to be protected."

The first batch of 600,000 doses of Sinovac vaccines donated by China arrived on February 28, 2021, and the health department immediately began its mass vaccination of medical frontliners.

Sinovac has been granted emergency approval by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) on February 22, 2021. According to Jainai, a total of 7,190 Sinovac vaccine were allocated to medical frontliners of 13 hospitals located in various provinces of the region.

Among them are Rizal Provincial Hospital System – Antipolo Annex II with an allocation of 280 vaccines followed by Batangas Medical Center with 1,011, Batangas Provincial Hospital with 184 vaccines, Ospital ng Lipa with 229, General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital – 900, Ospital ng Imus – 294, Der La Salle University Medical Center – 1,529, Laguna Provincial Hospital and San Pablo

In the latest statement of Governor Jonvic Remulla on social media, he announced the allocation of P750 million of the province's fund for the vaccine against

The province is still in contact with Moderna and Pfizer's response for vaccines that will be allocated to senior citizens aged 60 and above.

Remulla also said in such post that Astrazeneca's "effectiveness" against COVID-19 is high.

"AstraZeneca is proven 60-91 % effective in preventing COVID-19. This is also proven to be 100 % effective in preventing the

severe effects of COVID."

The governor finally promised that the provincial government will not stop to protect its citizens.

"We will not stop in our duty to protect and provide for the people of Cavite. It is our sworn duty to do so; nothing shall deter us from doing what is right and what is best. We still have many next steps. Watch out for my update next weeks."

District Hospital – 334, Laguna Medical Center – 415, Dr. Jose P. Rizal Memorial District Hospital – 318, Quezon Medical Center – 1,461, Maria L. Eleazar General Hospital – 71 and Claro M. Recto Memorial District Hospital with 154 vaccines.

their LGU of destination before travelling to ensure a smooth trip.

Malaya also said that under the new protocols approved by the IATF, no traveler shall be required to undergo facility-based quarantine unless they exhibit symptoms upon arrival at the LGU of destination. “Therefore, the health assessment of passengers or travelers supervised by medical professionals shall be mandatory upon entry in the port/terminal and exit at point of destination,” he said.

He said that all LGUs, regardless if they require PCR tests or not, shall conduct clinical and exposure assessment at all points of entry and exit to ensure that only asymptomatic, non-close contact individuals are allowed to travel or move from one LGU to another.

Malaya emphasized that with the travel regulations harmonized, minimum public health standards which include physical distancing, hand hygiene, cough etiquette and wearing of face masks and face shields, among others, shall be strictly implemented by the PNP and local authorities.

Those Authorized Persons Outside of Residence (APORs) from national government agencies and attached agencies shall provide their identification card, travel order, and travel itinerary, and must pass

symptom-screening at ports of entry and exit pursuant to IATF Resolution No. 98-A issued on February 4, 2021.

“Pero kahit lumuwag ang travel protocols, paalala po sa travelers na pinapatupad pa rin ang minimum public health standards. Mag-ing disiplinado pa rin po sa pagsunod sa physical distancing, hand hygiene, cough etiquette at pagsuot ng face masks at face shields. Disiplina muna para sa ligtas na biyahe,” he said.

For ports and terminals, on the other hand, all must have assigned sufficient quarantine facilities. A referral system must be in place wherein travelers who become symptomatic shall be transferred to quarantine or isolation facilities to enable the Bureau of Quarantine for airports, or local health officials in case of LGUs, to take over.

For the National Capital Region, all buses bound for provinces shall be required to use the Integrated Terminal Exchange as the central hub for transportation. No bus company or public transport shall be allowed to use their private terminals. LGUs, at their option, may provide transportation for all travelers who are transiting from one LGU to another in cases of arrivals at air and seaports to their end-point destinations.



PRO4A Rolls-out COVID-19 Vaccination Simulation

Camp BGen Vicente P Lim – The Police Regional Office 4A has started its COVID-19 Vaccination Simulation Exercises this afternoon, March 3, 2021 held at the Office of the Regional Health Service (RHS) 4A, inside the camp.

Headed by the RHS 4A Assistant Chief, PLTCOL Fernando Merca-

do, the simulation exercise was participated in by the personnel of Police Regional Office CALABARZON and was witnessed by the representatives from the Department of Health 4A.

PRO4A personnel who will be vaccinated will undergo five phases: (Step 1) Sanitation/Triage Area, (Step 2) Registra-

plan is being rolled out to all the involved LGUs specifically to Punong Barangays who are on the ground for them to understand the procedures and protocols that will be observed especially during the time of COVID-19 pandemic should Taal volcano erupt.

He also added that the ultimate aim of the activity is to institutionalize the evacuation plan so that preparations are in place when the disaster occurs regardless of the incumbent administration. This will be done thru regular simulation of the evacuation procedures and continuous practice of preparation measures.

Ms. Eloisa Rozul of the Cavite Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office led the

rollout of the evacuation plan to the attendees. Highlight of the presentation is the twinning of Batangas and Cavite LGUS to facilitate evacuation. Evacuees from Laurel, Batangas will be sheltered in the town of Alfonso. Those coming from Talisay, Batangas will be received by the municipalities of Silang ang Indang. The municipality of Mendez as well as Tagaytay City will receive evacuees coming from Agoncillo, Batangas. For evacuees coming from Lemery, four LGUs of Cavite namely Magallanes, General Emilio Aguinaldo, Tagaytay City and Amadeo will provide shelter. Designated pickup points in the different subject municipalities of Batangas have been initially identified as well as the evacuation sites in partner Cavite LGUs. Cavite province will facilitate transportation of evacuees from the strategic pickup points in Batangas. Swabbing of evacuees will also be done in identified swabbing areas in Cavite as a safety protocol in light of the COVID-19 pandemic before proceeding to the assigned evacuation areas.

Mayors of the eight Cavite LGUs represented by Cavite Mayors' League President Frederick Vida of Mendez unanimously expressed their commitment to accept and provide for the needs of those who will be displaced from the province of Batangas if and when Taal volcano erupts. Meanwhile, local chief executives from Batangas expressed their gratitude for the support and shelter provided to their constituents during the 2020 Taal volcano eruption. Mayors' League President of Batangas, Mayor Valentino Patron of San Jose said that the show of support of the province of Cavite to their constituents lifts their morale and that the act will never be forgotten. In a gesture of appreciation, they presented to the Governor the infamous 'balisong' of Batangas as a token of gratitude.

The forging of partnership between the two provinces was witnessed by Presidential Chief Legal Counsel Salvador Panelo who was incidentally visiting the province.

DILG: PNP Travel Authority and medical certificate no longer required for travel



Mayor Lani Mercado-Revilla led the launch of Barangay E-Governance and Information System which will be used by 73 barangays in the city for the new normal way of public service.

BEGIN will be used by the barangays for monitoring, databasing and survey work. BEGIN will start for the survey and registration of Bacooreños who want to vaccinate Covid-19 vaccine. BEGIN can also be used in disaster response operations, implementation of National ID system and delivery of social services to Bacooreño.

The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) today confirmed that the travel authority from the PNP and the medical certificate from the LGU health office are no longer required for travel after the IATF-MEID approved the harmonized national travel protocols for land, air, and sea recommended by the department.

DILG Undersecretary and Spokesperson Jonathan Malaya said that the Inter-Agency Task Force on Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-MEID) issued Resolution No. 101 on Friday approving the streamlined travel protocols crafted by the

DILG in coordination with the Philippine National Police, Union of Local Authorities of the Philippines, League of Provinces of the Philippines, League of Municipalities of the Philippines, and the League of Cities of the Philippines.

He said that the new protocols are applicable to all LGUs across the country and he enjoined all LGUs to comply with the new regulations issued by the IATF.

He also said that COVID-19 testing shall not be mandatory for domestic travelers except if the LGU of destination will require testing as a requirement prior to travel. "If the LGU of destination requires a

test, it shall only require a Reverse-Transcription - Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) test and no other. Meaning, LGUs cannot require Antigen tests or rapid tests as test requirements prior to travel," he said.
