Cavite LGUs to beat road clearing ops deadline

GENERAL TRIAS CITY, Cavite - With 16 days more to go before the Sept. 29 deadline, Cavite's 16 towns and seven cities are now in the home-stretch in their respective public road clearing in compliance with President Rodrigo Duterte's directive to reclaim public roads from private use and remove illegal structures and obstructions.

The Department of the Interior and Local

Government Memorandum Circular 2019-121 has imposed the deadline on Sept. 29 for local government units (LGUs) throughout the country.

"I think we will get it before the Sept. 29 deadline by DILG. Most of the residents and business owners already comply with the clearing operations order," General Trias City Mayor Antonio Ferrer said in an interview. Ferrer has led the

clearing operations since Day One of the DILG's enforcement order, in Barangay Tejero, by directing the Public Order and Safety Task Force to check compliance by the city's 33 villages ahead of the deadline.

This city's clearing operations also received the support from 33 village chiefs through the Liga ng Barangay (LnB) Federation president Alfred Ching for the city-

wide information dissemination campaign and actual cleanups.

"I am grateful to those who have already followed the DILG order," Ferrer said.

The city's clearing operations covered busy stretch of the Antero Soriano Highway from Bacao to Tejero; Tejero Crossing, Tejero-San Juan Road, Malabon Trias proper; Gen. Antonio Road from Bacao to

Dulong Bayan to Brgy. 96th, Governor Ferrer Drive from Barangay Prinza to Manggahan, Crisanto delos Reyes Avenue from Manggahan to Alingaro, Governor's Drive from San Francisco to Manggahan, up to the boundary at Trece Martires City.

In Carmona town, Mayor Roy Loyola and his team are clearing the stretch of Governor's

First-'Living-Museum-Tour' still runs in Cavite
GONEWS First 'Living Museum Tour' still runs in Cavite

A non-traditional and dynamic mode of learning the life and times of General Emilio Aguinaldo, where one can sit down and watch and "interact" with characters from the past, still runs at the Museo ni Emilio Aguinaldo (MEA) every other Saturday until December 2019.

Private and non-profit organization Fundacion Santiago (FS) partnered with the National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP) and Cavite El Viejo Heritage Tourism Association (CVHTA) to usher in its "blast from the past" tour experience, using first-person interpretation of the life and works of the President of the First Philippine Republic with its "Sa Aming Tahanan: A First Person Interpretation Program."

Staged through the perspective of different people – both historical or fictional composite characters – the project was first coined to highlight Aguinaldo's sesquicentennial birth celebration on March 22, said FS consultant Kara Garilao.

As the primary funder, concept developer, and implementor of the program, "one of the tour's objectives is to humanize our heroes, aside from providing a new concept of learning (compared with merely reading through history books), and level up any museum experience by allowing viewers to experience history first-hand, and be 'transported' back during the time of "Miong" (as the general was fondly called during his time)," Garilao said.

This is the "first of its kind in all NHCP run museums" and the tour is divided into three parts: the first when Miong was aged 17 (circa 1886), and in years 1920 and 1939, respectively.

Guests will meet the general's mother Doña Trinidad Aguinaldo played by Lean Aldea, who provides insights into Aguinaldo's bio, tracing his birthplace in Kawit, Cavite on March 22, 1869.

The story then brings the audience to 1920 or 24 years after he proclaimed the country's independence at his Kawit mansion's balcony, where revolu-

tionary veteran Roberto Magsilang (played by Raymond Llave) or Valerio Busise (played by Raimund Villoriente) recounts the 'pakikibaka' (revolutionary struggles) up to the time Magsilang retired to a simple life as a family man and farmer.

"To present that life continued after the revolution," Garilao said.

The last stop is in 1939, when Aguinaldo was already in his senior years, where guests will meet Solidad Galang (played by Marita Dizon) or Caridad Biscocho (played by Lhen Rivera), the witty house maid with a strong

Batangas-accent revealing the hometown of Aguinaldo's second wife, Doña Maria Agoncillo.

"The plus factor of this tour is that it allows the audience to ask questions, from trivia items to unclear parts of history, which is the fun part," Garilao added.

Interested tour participants are advised to book ahead due to the limited 20 slots per tour schedule from 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. every other Saturday, until December this year.

MEA is located at Kaingen in Kawit and is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Tuesday to Sunday. (Gladys Pino)

On behalf of Cavite Governor Jonvic Remulla, former Board Member Irene Bencito welcomed the delegations from the different provinces and agencies to Cavite. Likewise, Cavite State University President, Dr. Hernando Robles imparted his message of support to the program reflecting CVSU's commitment to the GAD advocacy. Undersecretary Jose Miguel Dela Rosa of NEDA served as the keynote speaker and he shared how Ambisyon 2040 reflects the dream of what Filipinos wish to accomplish as a nation to uplift the life of all in a sustained manner. He emphasized how GAD recognizes that both men and women are capable of good leadership and how it invests in knowledge sharing to achieve the goal of eliminating violence and empowering women towards inclusive development.

Among the roster of speakers were Assistant Regional Director Gina Gacusan and Ms Lovely S. Mores, Senior Economic Development Specialist both of NEDA Region IV-A, and Ms. Maria Kristine Josefina Balmes, Deputy Director of the PCW. They set the context on the first plenary session with talks on the Philippine and the CALABARZON development agenda as well as the GAD initiatives, and the current of state of Filipino women. DPWH Undersecretary Maria Catalina Cabral shared the department's initiatives in mainstreaming GAD in infrastructure projects taking into consideration the varying needs and concerns of different sectors in planning, design and other aspects of project implementation. Cavite Provincial Nutrition Action Officer Helen Peñalba talked about the Challenges of Maternal and Child Nutrition as a gender and development concern and the move to address them by scaling up national and local health and nutrition programs thru Republic Act 11148 or the Kalusugan at Nutrisyon ng Mag-Nanay Act. PCW Chief GAD Specialist Nharleen Santos-Millar discussed GAD agenda setting which is the basis for GAD planning and budgeting.

Break-out sessions were conducted for RLAs, LGUs and academic institutions to focus on topics more relevant to the organization and GAD issues more commonly observed in their field. For instance, the mainstreaming of GAD in higher education institutions and the issues of people with diverse SOGIEs in schools were discussed in the academe group. For LGUs, the GAD indicators in the Seal of Good Local Governance, SOGIE legislation and the different GAD tools for assessment were among the topics.

Highlighting the third day of the convention was a very informative and interesting talk show hosted by Mr. Alex Czar Masiglat, Chief of the Plans and Program section of the Office of Civil Defense Region IV-A, on the GAD advocacies initiated by men and the concerns of the LGBTQ community. He was joined by guests Mr. Ricky Bunao of DSWD Region IV-A and current Vice Chair of Men Opposed to VAW Everywhere (MOVE) Philippines, Inc., Major Marco Antonio Magisa of the Philippine Army for the organization's non-discriminatory policies and initiatives, Mr. Harold David of the Commission on Population Development Region IV who shared the Kalalakihang Tapat sa Responsibilidad at Obligasyon sa Pamilya (KATROPA) program, and Ms. Florita Lachica, Assistant PSWDO of Batangas and a vocal advocate of the SOGIE equality bill.

Drive and the town proper’s main road, assisted by the local police and the clearing task force.

Tagaytay City Mayor Agnes Tolentino also ordered the 34 village chiefs to

place “No Parking” signs on the city’s major thoroughfares, including the removal of illegal structures on sidewalks.

In Amadeo town, some 26 village chiefs and their clearing operations team also removed electric posts and tree obstructions upon instructions from Mayor Redel Dionisio who also ordered the upkeep of the town’s main Crisanto delos Reyes Avenue.

Meanwhile, Cavite’s western coastal town of Noveleta Mayor Dino Reyes Chua admitted he has to work until midnight to monitor the clearing operations along the Antero Soriano Highway going to Cavite City.

He has been supervising the removal of electric posts obstructing the main highway because these posts that pose risks and hazards to motorists and vehicles, have to be removed after the road-widening projects.

He thanked the town’s 16 village leaders for taking the lead to clean their respective areas and responding to constituents’ reports on illegal obstructions that need to be removed.

Officials of the cities of Imus, Bacoor, Dasmariñas, Cavite, Trece Martires and the towns of Kawit, Rosario, Naic. Maragondon, Ternate, Magallanes, Bailen, Alfonso, Indang, Mendez, Gen. Mariano Alvarez and Silang confirmed that they are now in the final stages of clearing operations in their respective areas. source:(PNA)

Health Office (PHO) disclosed that Bacoor City has recorded some 419 dengue cases during the first half of this year.

In Cavite province, Bacoor ranked second highest dengue case, next to Dasmariñas City with 913 while General Trias City came in third with 385 cases.

Meanwhile, General Trias City Health Officer

Dr. Jonathan Luseco, said they have also slated a massive clean-up drive along the stretch of the open canal in Pasong Camachile while the city health personnel are spear-heading the fumigation in the city’s 33 villages. (PNA)

FEATURE : Hands off our children: Saving PH youth from communism

MANILA -- The fight has just begun.

This is what the parents of teenagers who have joined left-leaning youth groups have declared during a recent interview over Philippine News Agency's (PNA) One on Juan talk show.

Relissa Lucena, mother of Alicia Jasper who was recruited by Anakbayan, said she and other parents will not back down against the campaign of left-leaning youth groups.

“Nakita po kasi namin na systematic ginagawa ng maka-kaliwang grupo. Tinuturuan nila ang mga bata na maging rebellious sa mga magulang at kinokondisyon nila ang mga magulang na tanggapin na rebelde na ang mga anak nila (We saw that the leftist groups’ actions are systematic. They teach the kids to rebel against their parents and they condition the parent’s minds to simply accept the fact that their kids are already rebellious),” Lucena said.

Hence, the parents have come together to establish “Hands Off Our Children”, a campaign that seeks to help families looking for their teenage loved ones who have been recruited by Anakbayan, League of Filipino Students (LFS), Kabataan Party-list and other youth groups.

“Ito po ay para matulungan namin ang mga magulang na may mga anak na nasa first stage palang ng (Through this, we’ll help parents whose children are still in the first stage of) rebellion so they can learn from our experiences,” Lucena said.

“They shouldn’t get angry at their children, rather, they must understand them and stop them from communicating with these groups,” she added.

Signs your child has become activist

Jovita Antoniano, mother of Trisha who was recruited by Anakbayan and LFS , said the first things she noticed about her daughter joining an immersion is the denial of God’s existence.

“Iyong anak ko, excited lagi magsimba kapag may piyesta sa amin pero noong nakaraang piyesta na umuwi siya sa amin sinabi nya na hindi ko na kailangan magsimba (My daughter used to be excited to hear mass during feast days in our place but the last time she got home on a feast day she said she doesn’t need to go to church),” she said.

Antoniano added that her daughter said she need not study at the university because the lessons they learn in the mountains are much deeper and important than the subjects taught in schools.

“Apat o limang beses lang siya umuwi pero nag-cha-chat kami kasi nga nagpapadala ako ng pera pero hindi pala siya nakatapos ng Grade 12. Tumutulong daw siya sa mahihirap at nagtuturo sa mga lumad pero sabi ko paano ka magtuturo kung wala kang natapos na edukasyon (She goes home four or five times only but we always chat because I send her money and I didn’t know that she didn’t even finish Grade 12. She helps the poor and teaches the indigenous people but I told her how can she teach if she hasn’t finished her education?),” she said.

Meanwhile, Elvy Caalaman, mother of Lory who joined the Kabataan Party-list, said she noticed that her daughter started cursing, drinking and smoking when she became an activist.

“Hindi na siya nakikipag-usap sa mga pinsan. Ayaw niyang sumagot sa mga tanong at naging mapag-isa (She doesn’t talk to her cousins anymore. She doesn’t want to respond to questions and she became a loner),” Caalaman added.

As for Jacqueline Mendoza, she noticed that her daughter Queenilyn has become argumentative when she started joining rallies staged by Anakbayan.

“Lagi siya nakikipagtalos sa mga kapatid niya at may sagot siya sa lahat ng mga tanong. May sarili na siyang mundo at mga barkadang sinasamahan kasi bantay sarado siya ng grupo nila (She argues with her siblings and she always has answers to all questions. She has her own world and set of friends because her group members guard her closely) she said.

“Sumulat siya nung 2017, sabi niya, mama, ito na ang pinasok kong buhay, alam ninyo na isa na akong NPA (She wrote me in 2017, she said, mama, this is the life I chose, as you know I’m now part of the NPA [New People’s Army],” she added.

Citing that the common denominator among their children is age, Lucena said left-leaning youth groups take advantage of the youth’s passion and vulnerability.

“Iyong pagiging agresibo nila, curious sa lahat ng bagay, paghahanap ng belongingness, sinamantala ng mga grupong ito. Kasi parang ang mga anak namin ay naging overwhelmed sa new information nakukuha sa kanila ang mga anak namin (These groups use their being aggressive, curiosity about everything and search for belongingness. It seems like our children got overwhelmed by the new information they offer), she added.

Not their fault

While they are frustrated about what happened to their daughter, Antoniano said they are not angry at her because they know she can start over and build a bright future for herself if she chooses to come home.

“Wala kasalanan ang aming anak dahil biktima lamang siya ng mga organisasyon gaya ng LFS at Anakbayan na pinagkatiwalaan namin (Our child is not in the wrong because she is just a victim of organizations like LFS and Anakbayan who we trusted),” she stressed.

Addressing Kabataan Party-list Rep. Sara Elago, Caalaman said left-leaning youth groups are the true enemies of the Filipino youth because they destroy the young people’s dreams and opportunity to have a bright future and a whole family.

“Ginagawa ninyong aktibista ang mga anak namin at pinaakyat sa bundok. Maraming encounter sa bundok at maaring mamatay doon ang mga anak namin at uuwi na lamang sa amin na bangkay? Anong klaseng puso meron ka Sara Elago (You recruit our children to be activists and make them stay in the mountains and they could die from encounters and just return to us dead. What kind of heart do you have Sara Elago?),” she added.

Believing that the fight against youth activism and communism can be won, Lucena urged other parents of missing activist youths to join their group.

“We have a Facebook page, it’s Hands Off Our Children. Kung gusto po ninyo kaming makausap o humingi ng payo, magpadala lang kayo ng mensahe at may sasagot sa isa samin at huwag po tayong matakot na ipaglaban ang mga anak natin (If you want to talk to us or if you want to seek advice, just send us a message and someone in our group will reply and don’t be scared to fight for our children),” Lucena said. source:(PNA)

Cops nab Calabarzon’s No. 2 most wanted person

A murder and carnapping suspect tagged as No. 2 most wanted person in the Calabarzon Region, was arrested recently by police operatives in Barangay Cantabaco, Toledo City, Cebu where he hid for almost 16 years.

In a press conference on Friday at this regional police command at Camp Vicente

Lim in Calamba City, Police Regional Office (PRO4A)-Calabarzon regional director, Brig. Gen. Edward E. Carranza, with Police Col. Serafin F. Petalio II, head of the regional police intelligence division (RID), presented the handcuffed suspect Marvin Opamin Dupal-ag alias “Marvin” who refused to be in-

terviewed. “The suspect hid for almost 16 years after he committed the crime of murder in 2003, however with the joint efforts of our intel operatives and the cooperation of the community, Dupal-ag was arrested yesterday afternoon,” Carranza said.

He commended the

operating units of the RID4A headed by Petalio, Police Regional Office 7 and joint operatives from city police stations of Toledo City, Cebu and Dasmariñas City, Cavite, where Dupal-ag committed the crimes of murder, frustrated murder, and carnapping.

Carranza also vowed to intensify its anti-criminality operations against wanted persons in line with President Rodrigo Duterte’s campaign against illegal drugs and criminality.

“We shall remain

firm in our stance to put these criminals behind bars,” he said.

Dupal-ag was captured through a warrant of arrest issued by Judge Norberto Quisumbing Jr. of the Regional Trial Court (RTC) Branch 21 in Imus City, Cavite on March 3, 2008.

According to police record, Dupal-ag is an alleged member of the Notorious South People (NSP) gang operating in Southern Luzon, who happened to recruit members for the criminal group.

It was during one of the NSP gang’s illegal recruitment schemes when Dupal-ag murdered an alleged recruited victim named Jerson Joseph Beltran Cabayan on Nov. 9, 2003 in Dasmariñas City and eluded arrest after committing the crime.

Another warrant of

arrest was also issued against the suspect by Judge Fernando Felicen of the same regional trial court on Oct. 13, 2008 for frustrated murder and for violation of Republic Act 6539 or the Anti-Carnapping Act of 1972.

The cases stemmed from the suspect’s frustrated murder charge on another victim Dave Medina Barazaga on July 15, 2007 and forcibly took away the victim’s four-wheeled vehicle.

Carranza appealed to the public to report any incident and whereabouts of criminal suspects.

“Let the rule of law take its course and that justice will be served,” he said. (Robert A. Maico)

BACoor CITY CLEANS RIVER BANKS TO CONTAIN DENGUE

BACoor CITY, Cavite – Residents of Barangays Talaba IV and Zapote II on Friday embarked on a massive clean-up and clearing stagnant waters in creeks and esteros that are suspected breeding sites of the dengue-carrying mosquitoes.

The massive clean-up drive is among the vector control measures by the Department of Health (DOH) to address the national dengue epidemic.

DOH Calabarzon regional director, Dr. Eduardo Janairo joined Bacoor City Health Office (CHO) chief Dr. Ivy Yrastorza, along with Talaba IV and Zapote II village leaders and barangay health workers (BHWs) for the clean-up.

The health officials, village chiefs and scores of village folks trooped to the banks of the creeks and esteros, which flow into the Zapote River, where they scooped tons of garbage that clogged the canals.

The clean-up drive stretched from Barangay Ligas, Zapote to Talaba IV and up to Sitio Longos in Barangay Zapote, where piles of trash were seen strewn on the canals and esteros.

"This is only one way to contain dengue in our area. Another is the misting or fumigation in the

73 villages here, the observance of the 4 o'clock habit, and cleaning one's backyard and removing stagnant water in tires or bottles where mosquitoes thrive," Yrastorza said in an interview.
