

## 2021 National Children's Month:

# DSWD, partners continue to champion children's rights amid pandemic

To drumbeat attention towards upholding and protecting children's rights amid the COVID-19 pandemic, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Council for the Welfare of Children (CWC), National Youth Commission (NYC), and other partner government agencies and organizations will spearhead the observance of the 2021 National Children's Month (NCM) this November.

By virtue of Republic Act 10661, the NCM is an annual celebration which commemorates the significance of the adoption of the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) by the United Nations (UN) General Assembly on November 20, 1989. It also aims to strengthen the call for public awareness and support in protecting and promoting the rights of children.

The month-long activity highlights the theme, "New Normal na

Walang Iwanan: Karapatan ng Bawat Bata Ating Tutukan!" The theme aims to give attention to the difficulties experienced by children in the new normal setting such as concerns on their rights to survival, development, protection, and participation.

Likewise, the celebration will continue with the gains of the previous NCM celebrations which is anchored on the 3rd National Plan of Action for Children (NPAC) Goals to progressively realize the rights of children.

### NCM Activities

In compliance with the minimum health standards and safety protocols set by the government, all activities of the NCM Celebration will be held virtually, particularly on the Facebook page of the CWC at <https://www.facebook.com/cwcgovph/> and cross posted at the DSWD Facebook page at <https://www.facebook.com/dswdserve/>.

To jumpstart the

celebration, the "Tal-akayang Makabata: The Virtual Press Conference" will be held on October 26 to discuss relevant issues concerning children's rights during the pandemic. It will be attended by representatives from the DSWD, CWC, NYC, and other concerned agencies.

On November 3, an online kick off ceremony of NCM will be held.

## CAVITE PNP's WEEKLY ACCOMPLISHMENT

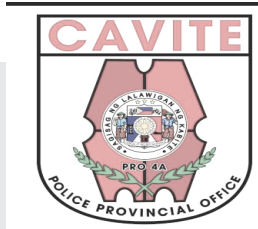

## Nationwide rollout of pediatric vaccination begins October 29

MANILA – Local government units (LGUs) nationwide will roll out pediatric vaccination beginning October 29, Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr., the chief implementer of the National Task Force (NTF) Against Covid-19, said on Friday.

Following the pilot in the National Capital Region (NCR) on October 15 and 22 for the 12-17 age group with comorbidities, Galvez said provinces will also be in

Entering the Narrow Gate

Someone asked him, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" He answered them, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." Luke 13:27

We should definitely take our Lord's words spoken above to heart. It's easy to presume we will be saved. It's easy to simply presume that God is kind and that we are good people at heart and, therefore, salvation is assured. But that's not what Jesus says.

So who will be saved? When we get to Heaven, God willing, we may be surprised at who is saved and who is not. This is clearly one of the messages of today's Gospel. Jesus even goes so far to say that some, when they die, will assume they are going to enter into Heaven but will hear our Lord say to them, "I do not know where you are from. Depart from me, all you evildoers!" Again, we should take these words to heart.

One of the most dangerous sins we can fall into is presumption. Presumption is deadly because it has a double effect upon us. First, the person caught in presumption is one who has committed mortal sin but has not repented of it. But the presumptuous person also remains incapable of repentance because they refuse to acknowledge their sin. Their conscience is not working. They have blinders on and expect God to wear those same blinders. But God sees all things and judges accordingly.

The "narrow gate" of which Jesus speaks is a simile used by Jesus to tell us that it is not easy to obtain Heaven. It requires a concerted effort on our part as well as the infinite mercy of God. But regarding our part, the attainment of Heaven is only possible if we intentionally seek out the will of God and respond generously to Him. First, that means we confess and turn away from our sins. But from there, it means that we make every effort to fulfill God's will in our lives. If this is hard to accept, simply remind yourself that this teaching came directly from Jesus Himself. He is absolutely clear and means what He says. If that fills you with a sort of holy fear, then that is a good thing. "Holy fear" is a gift by which we have a well-ordered conscience that is able to identify those things in our lives that have become immovable obstacles to eternal salvation. The same well-ordered conscience will lead us to that narrow gate which is the only path to eternal life.

Reflect, today, upon the fact that we must all take eternal salvation seriously. If you find that you have become lax in your spiritual life, then use this Gospel as a motivation to change. Do not allow yourself to be one of those knocking at the gates of Heaven, only to realize that our Lord does not know you. Do all you can to eradicate the sin of presumption from your life, and your reward will be truly great in Heaven.

My most merciful Lord, You and You alone can open the gates of Heaven to us, and You and You alone will do so only to those who have responded to Your holy will. Please open my eyes to any ways that I turn from You and remain lax in my spiritual journey. Give me the grace I need to see clearly and to respond to You with all my heart. Jesus, I trust in You.

# Some parents hesitant in sending kids back to school

MANILA – Even with cases of the coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19) infections on the decline, some parents remain half-hearted in sending their children back to school for face-to-face classes.

Not until the virus is eradicated or the entire population has been vaccinated, some parents said, adding that they would rather have their children stay home for blended learning.

Others, however, want to have their children lead more normal lives and reduce the stress of staying at home for more than a year now.

Netizens have contradicting opinions on the re-opening of physical classes in 30 schools on November 15, based on reactions gathered by the Philippines News Agency (PNA) from Wednesday to Friday.

"Yes na yes basta (Yes, so long as they) honor the procedure and protocols," Cynthia Balagan posted.

It was immediately followed by a negative response from Jinky Nicolas, who has a nine-year-old child in fourth grade at a school in Manila.

"No, hangga't may banta pa ng (No, until there is the threat of the) virus," she posted.

Werdan Ymuama is amenable to physically sending children back to school only if teachers and school staff are vaccinated against Covid-19.

"Kung lahat ng student na mag face-to-face at mga guro, gardeners, cleaners, suppliers, etc. ay bakunado. In short, lahat ng bakunado lang makakapasok, pwede iyan (If all students who will attend the face-to-face classes, along with teachers, gardeners, cleaners, suppliers, and others are vaccinated. In short, only those who are vaccinated can enter the school, then that is okay)," Ymuama posted.

Moreover, parents want to be assured that health and safety protocols will still be strictly enforced.

Meanwhile, Gilda Clavio agreed that staying home also has an effect on children and it's about time they return to school.

"Pwede naman na siguro basta masunod ang protocol, and mga safety ways, why not? Kasi para ma-develop na rin mga kids, maraming stressed na kids na rin (Maybe it is time. So long as protocols are followed, why not? This will also help kids develop. They have been through stress also)," Clavio said.

On the other hand, some parents still prefer online learning for their children's safety.

"Hmm, 'di bale ng mahirapan sa online class mga anak ko, basta safe (I don't mind if my children find online classes more difficult so long as they are safe). Hope that this will not be mandatory," Gordon Matthew Concepcion posted.

Schools participating in the pilot physical classes have disinfected and retrofitted classrooms.

Some parents are not comfortable with the barriers though.

"Hindi po sa mga barrier na 'yan matatapos ang safety ng mga anak namin. Ang dami pa din pong kaso ng Covid para i-consider na ang face-to-face. 'Wag muna po sana (The safety of our kids does not depend on those barriers. There are still many cases of Covid-19 to already consider face to face. Not yet). Better be safe than sorry," Arlene dela Cruz Bismonte said.

On September 20, President Rodrigo Duterte approved the pilot implementation of face-to-face classes in low-risk areas while the rest of the country will continue with blended distance learning.

The approval was in consideration of education quality, mental health, and economic issues amid the pandemic.

Education Secretary Leonor Briones explained

that only schools that have met the safety and readiness assessment, as approved by the Department of Health, Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases, and other organizations specializing in children's health, would be allowed to hold face-to-face classes.

To be allowed at a time are 12 learners in Kindergarten, 16 each for Grades 1 to 3, and 20 learners for technical-vocational students.

Each session will run for a maximum of three hours for Kindergarten to Grade 3 and four hours for Senior High School.

The pilot face-to-face classes will be conducted every other week and all qualified learners will be given the opportunity to attend physical classes.

However, Briones clarified that participating schools must secure the written support and consent of parents of students and no learner shall be forced to attend face-to-face classes. source:(PNA)

cluded next week.

"In the next few days, we are expecting to have an increase in our vaccination considering that we will be having a rollout of the children's vaccination in all LGUs," Galvez said in an interview during the arrival of more than one million Pfizer doses at the Ninoy Aquino International Airpo.

LGU vaccination sites, including hospitals, have been inspected in preparation for the inoculation of minors.

Some LGUs appealed that instead of hospitals, they will use their existing vaccination sites as their healthcare staff are trained on how to respond to adverse effects following immunization.

"We made some adjustments that some of these vaccination sites will be set up near hospitals," Galvez said.

The vaccines will be initially deployed to LGUs that have vaccinated at least 50 percent of their target population.

Only Pfizer and Moderna vaccines have been approved for pediatric inoculation.

The country has so far received 94,678,340 doses of various Covid-19 vaccine brands, both procured and donated.

Of the total, 54,444,161 have been administered.

A total of 25,101,222 Filipinos are fully vaccinated as of Friday and since vaccination began on March 1. source:(PNA)

# Barako farmers to benefit from RIIC initiative

MANILA – Barako coffee farmers and processors will greatly benefit from the Regional Inclusive Innovation Center (RIIC) initiative in Calabarzon, Department of Science and Technology Region IV-A Director Emelita Bagsit said.

"Kapeng barako is the focus commodity of RIIC as this is an important commodity in the region. It would also help re-establish the branding and reintroduce barako coffee," she told the Philippine News Agency in an interview on Friday.

Barako coffee (Coffea liberica) has a strong taste and popularly grown particularly in the provinces of Batangas and Cavite.

RIIC in Calabarzon is a partnership initiative of the DOST, Department of Trade and Industry, Batangas State University (BatStateU), NEDA, PCCI, with support from USAID STRIDE. The DOST-Calabarzon has committed PHP1.4 million to strengthen this.

DOST-Calabarzon and its partner agencies eye the RIIC to be a dynamic one-stop-shop for prospective innovators in the region, with the goal of increased utilization and uptake of innovation programs and services, as well as research and development (R&D) outputs among micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs).

While the DOST has a NICER (Niche Centers in the Regions for R&D), Bagsit said RIIC has a broader scope.

"Both NICER and RIIC promote innovation. They can be interrelated, but there are still differences. In fact, NICER could be a sub-component of RIIC," she remarked.

Bagsit explained that NICERs focus on specific commodity or research areas that are of prime importance to the regions, such as pili nuts (Region V), vector diseases, lakes, etc. On the other hand, RIIC in Calabarzon will initially focus on coffee, but will also cater to other innovation projects.

Further, a region could have many NICERs, but can only have one RIIC.

Meanwhile, Bagsit said that part of the deliverables is to establish project roadmaps, and to make the center sustainable.

Last October 19, it was announced that RIIC, as a program, will carry the official brand, "LINC Calabarzon" or Linking Innovation Networks for Competitiveness in Calabarzon.

LINC will propagate 80,000 barako coffee seedlings among identified farms. Mapping-related activities to identify key innovators in the region, according to Albert Amante, BatStateU vice president for research, and also the project leader.

Also included in the upcoming activities are inventory of assets and coffee-related resources which the DOST-Calabarzon would include in the LINC website and database.

RIICs have a virtual collaboration space and a website accessible for free. The recently-launched website, <https://linccalabarzon.com>, is accessible to all stakeholders who are looking for partners and resources to help support their innovation initiatives.

A Business Innovation Unit (BIU) facility will be established within the KIST (Knowledge, Innovation and Science Technology) Park, which is targeted to open by 2024.

Bagsit clarified that the BIU, sans the facility, has been operational since early 2021 through the BatStateU, since a RIIC represents the local innovation system.

"The BIU will implement activities, such as linking MSMEs and potential innovators on the programs and services of partner institutions," she said. SOURCE:(PNA)

# Cavite allowed Walk-Ins in some vacc centers

Several cities and municipalities in Cavite are now accepting walk-ins at their COVID-19 vaccination sites.

In the city of Imus, Mayor Emmanuel Maliksi shared that residents who wish to receive the first dose of COVID-19 vaccine under their implementation "first come, first served"

Meanwhile, in Indang town, vaccination walk-ins are also opened for ages 18 and above.

While Mayor Angelo Aguinaldo's Kawit said that they also accept walk-ins as long as the vaccine is carrying a valid ID.

drug paraphernalia.

In the campaign against wanted persons, Cavite Police arrested 3 Most Wanted Persons Ranked Nr. 7 in CALABARZON Manhunt Charlie List (Regional) for the crime of Rape; Ranked Nr. 4 in CAVITE Manhunt Charlie List (Provincial) for Violation of RA 9165 (Dangerous Drug Act of 2002); and Ranked Nr 6 in Silang Manhunt Charlie List (Municipal) for the crime of RA 7610 (Anti-Child Abuse Law) and also includes the arrest of twenty (20) other wanted persons charged for other criminal offenses.

As police intensifies its anti-illegal gambling efforts, forty-one (41) individuals were arrested in various illegal gambling activities and confiscated cash money amounting to Php 7,067.00 in different denomination as bet money, and other gambling paraphernalia.

In the campaign against loose firearms, two (2) persons were charged for Violation of RA 10591 after police confiscated 1 unit of caliber .45 pistol in Bacoor City and 1 replica of caliber 22 in Dasmariñas City. Fifty-nine (59) other suspects were arrested for

their involvement in various crime incidents.

In the implementation of Minimum Health Protocols during this pandemic, Cavite PNP recorded a total number of 45,714 violators. Cavite PNP recorded 45,252 violators who were given warning, 435 paid fines, and 27 violators were charged for any other offenses they committed.
