P600 million fake items seized in Cavite and Bulacan

DENR unveils environmental quality data center

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), through the Environmental Management Bureau (EMB), has launched a data center that provides real-time monitoring of air and water quality, including the status of solid and hazardous waste management, facilities

with environmental compliance certificates (ECCs), and online permitting system. DENR Acting Secretary Jim O. Sampulna said the EMB Data Center unveiled on May 18 provides the most intensive services to "give the public quality environmental data that

brings together real-time air, water and even solid waste data from across the country that will certainly empower our citizens to make informed health choices and strengthen the DENR's capability to take immediate action against erring establishments." Sampulna noted

that similar undertakings have been made in other DENR field offices in recent years but were "not as intensive as this one." He commended the efforts of the DENR-EMB as the funds for the establishment of the P10-million facility came from the savings of the bureau.

MANILA – The Bureau of Customs (BOC) on Friday reported the seizure of Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) infringing goods worth over PHP600 million in various operations in Cavite and Bulacan.

In separate statements, the BOC said two teams have presented Letters of Authority (LOA) issued by BOC Commissioner Rey Leonardo Guerrero, upon inspection of warehouses in the provinces.

The first operation, led Customs Intelligence and Investigation Service (CI-IS)-IPRD, inspected the warehouses inside MacLane Storage Facility on Niog Road, Bacoor City, Cavite, where they found counterfeit goods bearing the brand names such as Nike, Adidas, Lacoste, Dickies, among others, worth PHP590 million on May 10, 2022.

Comelec ready to hold special polls for Remulla post

MANILA – The Commission on Elections (Comelec) on Monday said it can hold special polls for the position of Cavite 7th District Rep. Jesus Crispin "Boying" Remulla once he assumes the job as secretary of the Department of Justice (DOJ) in the next administration.

Comelec Commissioner George Garcia said it is up to the House of Representatives to decide if it would appoint a caretaker solon or declare a vacancy and call for a special election.

"We will wait for Congress. If Congress says we will fill up the position to conduct a special election, we will conduct the special election," he said in a press

briefing. "But usually, the Congress just appoints a caretaker to handle the concerns of the district."

Remulla, who was reelected to the post in the May 9 elections, reportedly accepted the

The BOC said prior to sealing of the subject warehouses, BOC examiners, in the presence of CIIS and the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) operatives, did the initial inventory of fake items.

Also, other items such as construction supplies, power tools, numerous marine communication and telecommunication devices, and assorted foodstuff, were also found during the operation.

Further on-site inspection also revealed two 40-foot containers filled with IPR-infringing goods.

It added that representatives of the warehouses and containers, who were not identified were informed by the implementing team to provide importation documents and other pertinent permits covering all goods found thereat.

Investigation is also underway for other possible violations of the Intellectual Property Code of the Philippines (RA 8293) and the Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (RA 10863).

The operation was in coordination with BOC-Port of Manila, and the AFP.

Meanwhile, authorities inspected warehouses at Fochun Industrial Compound in Balagtas, Bulacan where they found counterfeit goods estimated at PHP78 million on May 2.

The fake items and other products bearing the brands Adidas, Nike, Jordan, Gucci, Kawasaki, Yamaha, and Honda, among others, were seized for failure of the owners to comply with the Department of Trade and Industry's safety standards.

The subject warehouses have also been sealed after the BOC examiners initial inventory of various items and goods.

The owners and their representatives were invited during the operation and have issued certification of non-authenticity on those counterfeit goods.

Aside from the fake items, the team also found a container and upon checking of the importation documents, it was revealed that the declaration of the said cargo was steel channel but was found to contain aluminum profiles.

Also, the representatives of the warehouses were asked by the team to provide importation documents and other pertinent permits covering all goods found thereat.source: PNA/ By Ferdinand Patinio

Investigation is also underway for other possible violations of the Republic Act (R.A.) 4653, Intellectual Property Code of the Philippines (R.A. 8293), Consumer Act of the Philippines (R.A. 7394), and the Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (R.A. 10863).

DAP, FOI-PMO conducts graduation ceremony for IO’s Cert Course

QUEZON CITY (PIA) -- The Development Academy of the Philippines (DAP), in collaboration with the Freedom of Information-Project Management Office (FOI-PMO) of the Presidential Communications Operations Office (PCOO), conducted a face-to-face Graduation Ceremony for its Information Officer's Certification Course on 19 May 2022 at the City Garden Suites, Ermita, Manila.

The graduation ceremony served as the concluding event of the first phase of implementation of the Certificate Course delivered in two (2) batches from December 2021 to May 2022 to institutionalize the expertise of the country's FOI Officers in government by developing their competencies in the areas of access to information, data privacy, records management, and national security.

Ninety-four co-learners from various agencies were recognized in the ceremony which included 3 participants from the Philippine Information Agency namely, PIA FOI Focal person Ms. Liberty D. Aragones, Mr. Jayson P. Leguab from the PIA HRDD, and Mr. Sixto Paulo S. Agato from the PIA Good Governance Unit.

Mr. Agato, meanwhile, is an instrumental member of the group which was awarded with the Best Policy Proposal for their Policy Proposal on the Establishment of a Social Amelioration Program Information Clearing House System (SAP-ICHSI) which aims to create a centralized and interconnected link between all SAP implementing agencies to generally eliminate red tape and corruption in the implementation of SAP.

“266,966 children aged 5-11 years old remain unvaccinated in the Province of Quezon and another 9,141 are also due for their second doses. Kaya mas lalo pa naming paigtingin ang vaccination efforts through our demand generation to strengthen vaccination acceptance

amongst target groups,” Regional Director Ariel I. Valencia stated.

ed platform for the facility which is housed in a 60-square meter room at the EMB executive building in Quezon City.

The data can be accessed at www.emb.gov.ph

Cuñado said the aggregate and validated data on air, water, and solid waste from all EMB regional offices are housed in the data center to efficiently monitor the compliance of various industries and establishments.

The facility strengthens DENR’s push for transparency and good governance as the platform allows for early detection of pollutive activities, as the center is equipped with a notification system which is set off once it records an exceedance in emission from a plant connected to its system.

A self-generated show cause order is sent online to the establishment, giving it 24 hours to explain why it should not face proceedings leading to a possible issuance of a notice of violation.

Other vital information stored in the data center includes online application and processing for wastewater discharge permits along with the names of applicant-firms that have been approved and denied, providing public transparency on the compliance of establishments to the DENR effluent quality standards.

The public can also access data on the status of solid waste management facilities including the materials recovery facilities (MRFs) at the barangay level and 10-year solid waste management plans that have been submitted by local government units (LGUs) to the National Solid Waste Management Commission.

Likewise, accessible from the data center are the location, status, respective capacities of operational sanitary landfills (SLFs) and the corresponding LGUs accommodated by these SLFs.

As of May 19, 2022, the Regional Vaccination Operations Center (RVOC) reported a total of 1,541,791 unvaccinated 5-11 years in CALABARZON region, Batangas- 291,367, Cavite- 362,034, Laguna-320,414, Rizal 301,011 and Quezon-266,966.


