In an effort to diversify markets for PH exporters, the Department of Trade and Industry-Export Marketing Bureau (DTI-EMB), in coordination with the Philippine Trade and Investment Center-Middle East and Africa, is conducting an Outbound Business Matching Mission (OBMM) to the Middle East on February 12-24, 2020. The OBMM is in conjunction with Gulfood 2020 in Dubai World Trade Centre.

"We hope that through this OBMM, the Philippines will be able to explore business environment and possible prospects in the Middle East markets and sustain networking and follow-up activities in the UAE as part of the mission legs last 2019," DTI-Trade Promotions Group (TPG) Undersecretary Abdulgani M. Macatoman said.

The OBMM also targets to develop and expand relationships with business, government, and multiplier organizations in Middle East countries and enhance local

Establishing a confederation of Government Information officers (GIOs) like

CAGIO is one way of realizing this goal.

CAGIO Members from Regional Line Agencies (RLA) of Calabarzon sat down to elect the Interim Chairperson and Co-Chairperson in order to set the direction and ways forward of the associa-

tion.

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources Region 4A (DENR 4A) RPAO Chief Ann Hazel Javier was elected as the Interim Chairperson and the Co-Chair is the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources

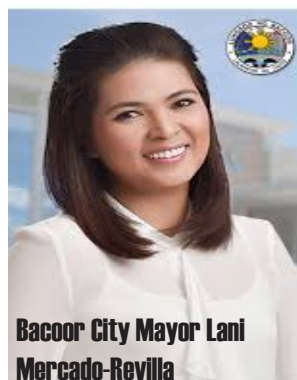
(BFAR) Agriculturist Veverlyn E. Samadan.

Cavite Provincial Government releases financial assistance to ASF-affected hog raisers

Following the African Swine Fever (ASF) epidemic that hit the province of Cavite late last year, the provincial government has distributed more than eleven million pesos worth of financial assistance to the 530 hog raisers affected. The first batch was released on February 11, 2020 for the 106 beneficiaries in the City of Bacoor in the distribution witnessed by City Mayor Lani Mercado-Revilla, Mr. Richard Quion, City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officer and Dr. Ella Mae

Gandia of the City Veterinary Services Office.

Cavite was hit by the

African Swine Fever (ASF) late last year affecting its small hog industries. The PDRMO and the Provincial Veterinary Office (PVO) conducted Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment and confirmed cases of ASF in the cities of Bacoor, Dasmariñas, Imus and Gen. Trias. To prevent the further spread of the virus, additional Quarantine Checkpoints were stationed in entry and exit points in the province along with other epidemic interventions in the affected swine farms.

Governor Jonvic



Remulla sought the aid of the legislative body for the passage of Sangguniang Panlalawigan Resolution No. 1352-2019 declaring the province under State of Calamity on November 13, 2019 and authorizing the release of quick response fund to address the ASF and

mitigate its impact.

Hogs affected by the virus and those within the one-kilometer radius were culled and buried as a standard protocol enforced by the Department of Agriculture. The financial assistance from the provincial government was intended help

small hog raisers recover from the losses brought by the ASF and is separate from the assistance from the national and local government. The amount of financial assistance which will be given to hog raisers is computed based on the num-

A. Eat healthy

Consume at least five servings of fruits and vegetables every day. Fruits and veggies are loaded with Vitamin C. This vitamin is one of the biggest immune system boosters of all. In fact, a lack of vitamin C can even make you more prone to getting sick. Foods rich in vitamin C include citrus fruits like oranges, dalandan or “uk-ban” and lemon. They are also rich in folate (folic acid) and dietary fiber and other antioxidants. To fully grasp the requirements of ISO 9001:2015 in the context of an internal auditor, the provincial government of Cavite thru the Cavite Quality Management Office (CQMO) conducted the ISO 9001:2015 Internal Quality Audit Training at the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, Legislative Building in Trece Martires City on February 11-12, 2020. The training aimed to capacitate the internal auditors for the continual improvement of the Quality Management System of the different offices of the provincial government in preparation for re-certification.

Adopting of the process approach and risk-based thinking, PGC-QMS Consultant on Operations, Mr. Antonio Santos shared valuable inputs on auditing to equip IQAs with knowledge and understanding of what objective evidence are needed to demonstrate conformance with the QMS requirements. The training also aims to prepare the internal auditors on reporting valid information, factual and value-adding audit findings.

Among the topics tackled on the first day were Audit

Principles, Understanding the Requirements, and Initiating the Audit and Audit Preparation. Participants were also taught on how to prepare the correlation matrix and how to fill out the auditors note.

On the second day, Audit Execution, Audit Reporting and Audit Follow-up were deliberated and a mock audit was initiated to let the internal auditors have a feel of how an audit is conducted in an organization with situational problems to test their skills in finding evidence that will support their audit reports.

Previous trainings and seminars were initiated in preparation for the external audit to be held on the second quarter of this year. On August 7-9, 2019, Internal Quality Auditors Training was also conducted at Tagaytay Haven Hotel for the new set of internal auditors. It also served as a refresher course for the senior internal auditors. Likewise, on January 21, 2020, ISO 9001:2015 Appreciation and Risk-Based Thinking Seminar was held to fully grasp the concepts of the QMS international standard. --Gina Perlado Pereña

Cavite Waterways of 28 Barangays, Submerged Garbage Cleared!

After four months of massive efforts, all the submerged garbage along the waterways of 28 barangays in Cavite were already removed, a report from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) CALABARZON says.

The removal of submerged garbage is a sub-project under the first phase of the DENR's Manila Bay Rehabilitation Project a.k.a. “Battle for Manila Bay”. The sub-project started in October 2019 and

was completed in January 2020.

The DENR allotted P1-M budget for each of the 28 barangays. P600-K of which was allocated for the clean-up of waterways and information drive, while the remaining P400-K was downloaded to the concerned local government unit for the hauling and transportation of collected waste to the sanitary landfills.

River marshals or “Bantay-Linis Ilog” were hired from among the locals to conduct the daily clean-up activities

and assess the wastewater being discharged to the waterways.

Other activities included in the sub-project were conduct of communication, education and public awareness campaigns on the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act; conduct of livelihood training on the conversion of solid waste into income-generating projects including composting and vertical gardening; fabrication and installation of informative signages;

and monitoring of unlawful acts like disposal of wastes into waterways.

DENR Manila Bay Coordinating Office - Cavite Site Manager, Judaline Fabro said some garbage coming from other parts of the Manila Bay region accumulate in the 28 barangays whenever high tide occurs. “Nonetheless, the concerned barangay government units pledged to continue the clean-up even after the end of their contract with the DENR”, she added.

D. A good rest is a must

RECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite- The primary function of the Farmers' Information and Technology Services (FITS) Center is to provide information and technology services to farmers and stakeholders. he won't tolerate abuses especially in the bureaucracy.

At the same time, President Duterte said that he will not allow any type of land reclamation by the private sector during his term, except priority government projects.

“Not during my

time. I will only allow maybe plans of whatever reclamation if it is in connection with the government project. I will not allow massive reclamation for the private sector. Not now. Because if you approve one, you approve all,” he said.

“When you govern you try to be — at

least you try very hard to be equal and fair. But if I do that, I will choke Manila,” he said, explaining the reason why he took control of the government reclamation authority.

The DOH, the World Health Organization (WHO) and other health experts are working hard to contain the virus and search for possible cure. However, we as individuals can contribute by preventing ourselves from acquiring this infection.

Under the project, a new terminal building was constructed to accommodate 160 passengers. The terminal building is equipped with flight information display system (FIDS), closed

understanding of the current economic conditions and business opportunities.

The mission is also anchored on EMB's aspiration to engage with high-level promo-tion, targeted market intelligence and business matching, and focused training and capacity building for both large companies and micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) which also echoes the thrust of the Philippine Halal Export Development and Promotion Act (PHEDP) and the Expo 2020 Dubai campaign.

Moreover, this project supports the Export Promotion for PH Food Sector which en-deavors to bring Philippine cuisine, ingredients, and beverages overseas. The program's strat-egy will build on Strategy No. 3 of PEDP 2018-2022 which is to design comprehensive packages of support that will be able to mainstream the Philippine food, food ingredients, and beverages sectors and encourage innovations on major Philippine commodities and niche products.

Led by Usec. Macatoman, the business delegation is composed of representatives from 11 Philippine business companies, namely: Fitrite, Inc; Fruits of Life, Inc; HDR Foods Cor-poration; Jocker's Food Industries; Magic Melt Food, Inc; Marigold Manufacturing Corp; Marikina Food Corp; Pinesvill Trading FZE LTE; Pixcel Transglobal; Sagrex Food, and LBC. Also included in the delegation are Philippine Commercial Attaché for the Middle East and Africa Charmaine Mignon S. Yalong, DTI-EMB's Senior Trade and Industry Development Specialist Myrtle Faye L. Solina, and Trade and Industry Development Specialist Al-Mahdi I. Jul-Ahmad.

The featured products for this mission are food items, sauces, spices, mixes, and con-diments as well as cargo and logistics for the services.

Macatoman reiterated the need for more Philippine brands to enter the Middle East markets to cater the demand of Filipinos living there, and to a larger extent, to penetrate the mainstream market. This mission also endeavors to deliberately promote Philippine bananas in the Middle East market, among others.

The delegation is set to have business matching events, market scanning, store visits, meetings with government authorities and a visit to Gulfcood 2020.

“As part of the OBMM's activities, the PH exporters will be engaged in B2B meetings with prospective buyers which will give them knowledge of the market requirements in terms of volume, quality, and price. It will bolster and increase exports of food and non-food products and services to GCC countries,” DTI-EMB Director Senen M. Perlada said.

Gulfcood is the world's largest annual food, beverage, and hospitality exhibition which attracts F&B professionals from all over the world to Dubai - a hub for international trade and commerce. It is also celebrating its 24th edition this year.

In January - November 2019, the Philippines exported USD 720.1M worth of goods to the Middle East and imported USD 3,298.8M of goods. Among the top products exported by the country were bananas, including plantains, fresh or dried (USD 211.9M), Input or output units, whether or not containing storage units in the same housing (USD 64.0M), other bread, pastry, cakes, biscuits and other baker's wares, whether or not containing cocoa (USD 41.3M), pineap-ples, fresh or dried (USD 38.1M), and video projectors (USD 22.1M).

On the other hand, the country's top imported products from the Middle East in the same period were petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, crude (USD 2,112.6M), light petroleum oils and preparations thereof (USD 225.9M), propane, liquified (USD 126.6M), butanes, liquified (USD 120.9M), and aeroplanes and other aircraft, of an unladen weight not exceeding 2,000 kg (USD 72.7M).

The program also requires participation from the Philippine National Police (PNP), Department of Education (DepED), Department of Health (DOH), Commission on Higher Education (CHED), Technical Ed-ucation and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), Department of Social Welfare and Develop-ment (DSWD), and Juvenile Jus-tice and Welfare Council (JJWC), for technical, logistical, security, intelligence and other related as-sistance and support.

Funding

PDEA institutionalizes conduct of uniform-
drug advocacy program for youth

The Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) is lead-ing the newly institutionalized uniform preventive education program intended for Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) and their youth constitu-ents.

Known as “Sangguniang Kabataan Standard Training in Extensive Anti-Drug Preventive Education – A Uniform Program for Youth Leaders (SK-STEP-UP), the program was approved and adopt-ed on June 27, 2019, under Dangerous Drugs Board (DDB) Board Regulation No. 5 Series of 2019.

“This paved the way to the guidelines institutionalizing a uniform preventive education program in anti-drug advocacy com-plementing the demand reduction campaign for the youth leaders in the community,” said PDEA Director General Aaron N. Aquino. **What is SK STEP-UP?**

The SK STEP-UP is designed as a supervisory level preven-tive education training program aimed at empowering the SK and ba-rangay youth leaders to be Certified Anti-Drug Advocates cascading and harmonizing the government's drug demand reduction strategy down to the grassroots level.

The youth leaders of the community, specifically SK Chair- persons, its Councilors, selected Local Youth Development Council members, and other equally qualified youth leaders who are at least 18 years old, but not more than 24 years of age, shall be responsible in the regular conduct of prevention activities and organizing anti-drug events in their barangays, lead by example, and empower and inspire their age groups to stay away from illegal drugs.

The SK STEP-UP has three phases namely: Youth Camp; Trainer's Training for the Youth Leaders; and Ground Implementa-tion, Monitoring, and Evaluation.

Youth Camp

The Local Government Units (LGUs), through their An-ti-Drug Abuse Councils (ADACs) shall hold 2 to 3-day youth camp with local SK Federation Chairmen, Councilors, or selected youth leaders as participants. Besides supervising the youth camp, PDEA shall provide the subject matter experts (SMEs), camp program and mechanics. The LGU will be responsible for the logistical require-ments for the event.

During the camp, participants are expected to exchange ideas, cultural experiences, best practices, talents, and related skills. They will be assessed by the program officials and coordinators based on their competencies and leadership potential for them to be consid-ered in the next phase.

Trainer's Training for the Youth Leaders

In this phase, the LGUs, through their ADACs, are re-quired to organize 3 to 5-day Trainer's Training of Youth Leaders for those participants who passed the competency requirement of Phase I. The training modules include the SK STEP-UP Program's Adminis-tration; Comprehensive Drug Abuse Prevention Education (DAPE); Communication and Life Skills Development; Practical Community Immersion; Basic Research and Development; and Formulation of Action Plans and Implementation.

“Upon successful completion of the trainer's training pro-gram, graduating participants will be conferred the distinction as SK STEP-UP Certified Anti-Drug Advocates,” said Aquino.

Ground Implementation, Monitoring, and Evaluation

The new anti-drug advocates are expected to conduct the ground implementation of his/her action plans for their respective barangays. They need to submit quarterly reports of barangay advoca-cies to their ADACs, to monitor the functionality and operational-ization of the program.

SK STEP-UP's Concept of Implementation

PDEA, as the Chairman for the National Secretariat for the SK STEP-UP Program, shall orchestrate, coordinate and oversee the successful implementation of the program, in collaboration with the DDB, Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), National Youth Commission (NYC), as members of the National Sec-
