BARANGAY OFFICAL AND TANOD OF DATU ESMAEL NABBED WITH SHABU WORTH P3.4M

An incumbent barangay kagawad of Datu Esmael, Pacalinog Rasul y Bolo, 52 years old , was arrested in a buy-bust operation conducted at Barangay Datu Esmael by Cavite Police Provincial Office (PPO)-Provincial Intelligence Branch (PIB) of Provincial Drug Enforcement Unit (PDEU), Dasmarinas City Police Station (DCPS)-City Drug Enforcement Unit (CDEU) and the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA)-Cavite last December 27. Along with Pacalinog was Barangay Tanod Taratingan Ala y Rasamala, 63 years old.

Confiscated during the operation were one (1) piece of heat sealed plastic sachets and five (5) pieces of knot tied plastic bag containing white crystalline substance suspected as 'shabu,' weighing

Gordon: Proposed Philippine Marshal Service to prevent instances of judges being intimidated from holding trial

PASAY CITY, Jan. 3--Senator Richard J. Gordon, chairman of the committee on Justice and Human Rights, said the proposed Philippine Marshal Service will prevent cases where judges are prevented from holding trial in their assigned salas thru intimidation, which has been happening in some areas in the country.

"There have occasions, for example, and I'm sure both my colleagues here who were in the police--I remember many judges would not stay in Sulu or in Basi-

lan. They would hold court in Zamboanga and even the mayors did that. Also, there have been occasions where we have had to move courts or cases and be brought to Manila because we are not so confident about the protection that will be availed of the judges," he noted.

Gordon also cited a judge in Basilan who carries an AK-47 because he was not sure that he was going to get the protection and the Maguindanao Massacre case.

"So we are coming from that direction. We are

coming from a direction that will allow the Supreme Court to protect our judges. Under the Constitution, they are in control of the Judiciary and I think they should be allowed to make sure na maipagtatanggol natin iyang mga huwes natin, lalo na iyong mga nasa malalayong lugar. Pag nagkaroon tayo ng marshal service, protective services, siguro may laban na ang mga huwes at sigurado mag-iisip na ng dalawang beses o tatlong beses iyong mga mananakot at papatay sa mga husgado," he said.

Rizal Day: Customs, traditions & celebrations

Celebrated every 30th of December, Rizal Day is a national holiday that memorates the life and heroism of Dr. José Rizal - a man many consider to be one of the Philippines.

In the past, most of the official ceremonies on Rizal Day were performed at Rizal Park in the city of Manila.

During this official ceremony, flags are flown at half-mast and the President of the Philippines lays a wreath on the shrine ded-

Recently, it is no longer the case, as ceremonial programs are now being conducted nationwide especially in places where there are monuments of Rizal and government officials attend these programs as guest of honor.

As national holiday, most workers have the day off as a fully paid work day. However, those who do have to work on Rizal Day receive twice their normal day of wages

On the early morning of the 30th of December 2019, 123 years after Rizal's execution at the exact place, Executive Secretary Salvador Medialdea representing President Rodrigo Duterte led the flag-raising and wreath-laying ceremonies at the 123rd death anniversary of Rizal

He was joined by Department of National Defense (DND) Secretary Delfin Lorenzana, Secretary Carlito Galvez, Jr. Presidential Adviser on the Peace Process, Manila Mayor Francisco 'Isko Moreno' Domagoso, other government officials and the public in

Presence of Rizal's descendants, led by beauty queen and first Filipina who won the Miss International title, Ms. Gemma Cruz Araneta made the event more meaningful.

Araneta's paternal great-grandmother was Doña Maria Mercado, the sister of the José Rizal. Her mother is writer and journalist Carmen Guerrero Nakpil, and her maternal uncle is writer and diplomat León María Guerrero III.

She expressed gratitude after seeing that more people came to Luneta this year to remember Rizal's martyrdom.

"Some of our government officials don't seem to give enough importance to this year's ceremony. But we are very happy to see and also my relatives are happy to see the park is full of people admiring Rizal and honoring what he did for the country," she said. According to the lawmaker, the results of the global Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) 2018, which assessed 15-year old students' proficiency in Mathematics. Science and Reading Comprehension. underscore the necessity of build- Matematika ay hindi lamang suma- proposed measure mandates all curriculum that focuses on Mathematics and the Sciences.

The triennial study revealed that among 79 countries, Filipino students scored second lowest in Science and Mathematics. Filipino high school students scored an average of 353 and 357 in Mathematics and Science, respectively. The focus of the next PISA assessment, which will be in 2021. will be on Mathematical Literacy.

500 grams and with an estimated market value of P3.4 Million Pesos. The arrested suspects are brought to DCPS and they are facing charges of violating Republic Act No. 9165 or the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002.

The Committee on Justice and Human Rights is hearing bills proposing the creation of a Philippine Marshal Service that would ensure ecurity and protection of the members of the Bench. The bills include Gordon's Senate Bill No. 118, Senator Panfilo Lacson's SBN 1209 and Senator Ronald Dela Rosa's 1237.

In his bill, Gordon proposes the creation of a Philippine Mar shal Service under the Supreme Court, through the Office of the Court Administrator which shall be tasked, to protect, defend, safeguard, watch over, provide security and ensure the safety of justice, judges, court officials and personnel, and halls of justice, courthouses, and other court buildings and properties; conduct threat assessments and undertake investigations of crimes and other offenses committed, including potential security threats, against the same.

The marshals will also assist in the execution and implemen ation of court orders; assist in the protection of witnesses and in the security in the transportation of accused or witnesses necessary in the coninuation of court proceedings; seize, freeze, manage and dispose of assets seized, frozen or forfeited by the Courts nationwide; and make arrests of fugitives, searches and seizures in accordance with the Constitution, existing laws, jurisprudence and rules, among others.(OSRG)

PNP hiring 17,00 cops in 2020

QUEZON CITY, (PIA)--The Philippine National Police is calling all able-bodied Filipino men and women aged 21 to 30 years old to take on the challenge to serve a noble career in the police service.

The National Police Commission and the Department of Budget and Management have authorized the PNP to fill-up 17,000 vacancies under its Recruitment Program for year 2020. These vacancies comprise the 10,000 annual regular recruitment quota and 7,000 additional quota to replace retired, deceased, dismissed, AWOL, and other separated personnel.

"We want the largest pool of applicants that we can muster from which to select only the best and most qualified candidates that will be recruited into the police service," PNP Officer-in-Charge, Police Lieutenant General Archie Francisco F Gamboa said.

"The annual recruitment program has taken Philippine law enforcement to a higher level by closing the gap in the police-to-population ratio to within ideal limits set by law," he said.

Gamboa said, successful candidates will be appointed to the initial rank of Police Patrolman with a gross monthly salary of P29,668.00 with other mandated allowances and benefits.

PNP Director for Personnel and Records Management, Police Major General Lyndon Cubos advised all prospective applicants to make ready with their clearances, certifications and other documentary requirements to facilitate speedier processing of applications when the recruitment will eventually commence in the coming weeks.

Cubos said applicants must be:

1. A citizen of the Philippines;

2. A person of good moral character;

3. Must have passed the psychiatric/psychological, drug and physical tests to be administered by the PNP;

4. Must possess a formal baccalaureate degree from a recognized learning

5. Must have any of the following basic eligibility requirements:

- PNP Entrance (NAPOLCOM)

- FNP Entraite (NAPOLCOM)

- RA No. 1080 (Bar and Board Examinations)

- PD No. 907 (CS eligibility to College Honor Graduates)

6. Must not have been dishonorably discharged from military employment or dismissed for cause from any civilian position in the government;

7. Must not have been convicted by final judgment of an offense or crime involving more latural transitions.

involving moral turpitude;

8. Must be at least one meter and sixty-two centimeters (1.62m) in height for male and one meter and fifty-seven centimeters (1.57m);

9. Must weigh not more or less than five kilograms (5kg) from the standard weight corresponding to his/her weight, age, and sex; and

10. Must not be less than twenty-one (21) or more than thirty (30) years of age.

Cubos said all applications for recruitment may only be filed thru the PNP Online Recruitment Application System (ORAS) portal at www.pnporas.pnp-dprm.

"We have adapted this digital information system in recruitment applica-

we have adapted this digital information system in recruitment applica-tion to level the playing field for all applicants by eliminating opportunities for third party intervention in the rigid selection process," Cubos said.

"Under this system, all applicants become nameless and faceless entries represented only by barcodes while going thru all the mandatory procedures of tests, interviews, and physical and psychological examinations," Cubos explained. (PNP-PIO)

30 rice farmers train on inbred rice seed production

LOS BAÑOS, Laguna (PIA)--About 30 rice farmers from Laguna and Quezon were trained as potential seed growers during the five-day Training on Inbred Rice Seed Production and Certification held recently in this town.

Organized by the Agricultural Training Institute (ATI) Region IV-A, the training and extension arm of the Department of Agriculture, the activity aims to provide the rice farmers with knowledge and skills in the production of inbred seeds.

"Through the lectures from technical experts and hands on exercises such as field inspection and roughing, the participants acquired the knowhow of producing inbred seeds," training project officer Mr. Mervin Vitangcol said.

Based on the data of the Philippine Rice Research Institute (PhilRice), high-quality inbred rice seeds and proper management can increase the yield up to 10% or more. It also assures high-seedling vigor, purity, strict limit on weeds and uniformity of crop stand.

On the other hand, production cost is low as the use of inputs is maximized and nutrients uptake is more efficient. Seed purity adds to the uniformity of crop stand so marketing efficiency improves, and post-harvest losses

Moreover, the training acquainted the participants on certification process as part of the requirements in the accreditation of seed growers.

Seed certification process includes: 1) accreditation of seed growers; 2) preliminary field inspection; 3) final field inspection; 4) seed selection; 5) receiving of sample seeds; 6) seed testing of seed samples; 7) issuance of results of analysis; and the final process is 8) tagging.

To date, CALA-BARZON has a total of 33 seed inspectors. Lectures and discussions on Integrated Pest Management (IPM), Integrated Nutrient Management, and Integrated Crop Management (ICM) were also delivered during the training. (Janine L. Cailo, ATI Calabarzon/CPG, PIA-4A)
