CAVITE WELCOMES NEW YEAR WITH FEWER INCIDENTS, HIGHLIGHTING PUBLIC COOPERATION

City of Imus, Cavite (PIA) — Cavite rang in the New Year on a calm and orderly note as authorities recorded a significant decline in holiday-related incidents, underscoring the impact of public cooperation and strengthened law enforcement efforts.

The Cavite Police Provincial Office (PPO), led by Acting Provincial Director Col. Ariel Red, reported a sharp drop in firecracker- and pyrotechnics-related in-

juries during the New Year celebrations. Data from the Ligtas Paskuhan campaign showed a 75 percent decrease in incidents, from 36 cases in 2024 to just eight in 2025.

All recorded cases involved firecracker and pyrotechnic injuries. Notably, there were no reported incidents of indiscriminate firing, stray bullets, road crashes, or fires linked to fireworks and pyrotechnic devices.

DOH Activates Code White Alert for Hospitals During Traslacion 2026

The Department of Health (DOH) will place hospitals in Metro Manila and nearby areas under Code White Alert in preparation for Traslacion 2026 on Friday, January 9, Health Assistant Secretary and spokesperson Dr. Albert

Domingo announced over the weekend. Under Code White Alert, DOH-run hospitals are directed to maintain maximum readiness to respond to any medical emergency that may arise during the annual procession honor-

ing the Black Nazarene. The DOH will deploy around 200 members of its health emergency response teams, strategically positioned during peak activity periods along the procession route. Domingo said the number of deployed

personnel may be adjusted and increased depending on the situation.

Domingo strongly discouraged individuals with heart and respiratory conditions, as well as pregnant women, senior citizens, and children, from joining the

procession due to health risks associated with extreme crowd density.

Devotees who choose to participate were reminded to bring identification cards, drinking water, and maintenance medications, and to wear loose

and comfortable clothing. Domingo also advised the public to wear face masks and carry alcohol or hand sanitizer to help prevent the spread of disease during the crowded event.

PH to host Asian Beach Games in 2028

The Philippines is set to host the Asian Beach Games in 2028.

Philippine Olympic Committee (POC) president Abraham "Bambol" Tolentino said that after email correspondence and phone calls with Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) officials, the country will stage the Southeast Asian Plus Youth Games in late 2027 and the Asian Beach Games (ABG) in early 2028.

The POC had announced the creation

of the SEA Plus Youth Games and the Philippine hosting last Thursday.

"The Asian Beach Games will have its third edition this April in Sanya (China) so it will be two years after when we host the games in 2028," Tolentino said on Saturday, adding that the two hostings run in consonance with the Philippine Sports Commission's (PSC) — through its chairman, Patrick "Pató" Gregorio — intensified sports tourism campaign.

"We will submit both letters (of intent) to the OCA before its Gen-

eral Assembly later this month in Tashkent. It's a mere formality. After getting the official approval from the OCA, we'll immediately be proposing to the PSC on hosting both events."

Tashkent is hosting the important OCA activity that will also tackle Uzbekistan's hosting of the 2029 AYG.

The POC and PSC are on the same page on the sports tourism campaign, with President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. setting into motion last year the multi-pronged National Sports Tourism Inter-Agency Committee

(NST-IAC) headed by Gregorio.

"These coming international events fit well with the goal of the NST-IAC, we at the POC are remaining proactive on these efforts," said Tolentino, also the president of the national federation for cycling.

PhilCycling will hold the Asian Cycling Confederation Track Championships in March at the brand-new and International Cycling Union-standard Tagaytay CT Velodrome.

Tolentino said expectations are high for Filipino athletes' participation at the Milano-Cortina Winter Olympics on Feb 6-22 and the ABG on April 22-30 in Sanya, China.

Also on the POC calendar are the Asian Games in Nagoya on Sept. 19 to Oct. 4 and the Asian Indoor and Martial Arts Games in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia on Nov. 28 to Dec. 7.

The SEA Plus YG are designed for athletes aged 17 and under who will compete in two mandatory sports, a maximum of 12 Olympic sports, a maximum of five Asian non-Olympic sports and one traditional sport with up to six medal events.

Tolentino is the founding president of the SEA Plus YG, which counts as members Thailand, Indonesia, Malaysia, Laos, Cambodia, Myanmar, Vietnam, and Timor Leste. The "Plus" refers to at least one invited Asian NOC in other Asian sub-regions for each edition of the Games for the purpose of providing added competition for the region's grassroots.

CALABARZON's first coconut enterprise sub project to rise in Batangas

LIPA CITY, Batangas (PIA) — Batangas Province will soon become a major player in the country's coconut industry through a P108.32-million coconut oil processing enterprise funded by the Department of Agriculture's Philippine Rural Development Project (DA-PRDP).

The project is the first enterprise subproject in CALABARZON to be funded under the DA-PRDP Scale-Up project, which provides targeted infrastructure, facilities, technology, and information to raise income, productivity, and competitiveness.

The DA-PRDP tapped the Agricare Multipurpose Cooperative and the Palacpac Malinao San Nicolas Calantas Multipurpose Cooperative for the plant construction, as well as the installation of a coconut oil mill system that will produce high-value crude coconut oil (CNO) and copra cake for animal feed.

In a press release, the DA-PRDP noted that the project includes a processing facility in Rosario, Batangas, that will help bridge the supply gap for crude coconut oil and copra cake.

"Instead of selling raw coconuts, the project processes copra into high-value CNO and copra cake. This will empower the community to shift from primary production to value-added agro-industry," the DA-PRDP said.

The facility was designed as a local processing hub that will consolidate copra from at least 1,207 coconut farmers, increasing the overall copra production in Batangas.

According to the Agricare Multipurpose Cooperative, copra is one of the most in-demand agricultural products in the province, with nine feed mills already committed for product intake.

Furthermore, the DA and the Philippine Coconut Authority (PCA) have committed to providing continuous technical support to the project proponents and the partner copra suppliers. (PB-PIA4A/PRDP Calabarzon)

The Department of the Interior and Local Government on Monday outlined plans for the Department for 2026, highlighting the enhancement of the efficiency of the Unified 911 System as the backbone of public safety in 2026.

In a message shared before the DILG family, DILG Secretary Jonvic Remulla stated that more auxiliary assets will be procured for the government's life-line delivery. "This year, we will prioritize additional firetrucks, police vehicles, and emergency response assets to strengthen the Unified 911 system as investments in public safety," he said.

Last September, Unified 911 was launched

Remulla targets stronger 911 in 2026; credits DILG workforce for solid 2025 performance

to consolidate the country's emergency hotlines into a single central number and modernize the emergency response system. It achieved a 97.92 percent efficiency rate for the more than 2.4 million handled calls in November 2025 through its National Call Center in Manila and the Regional Command Center in Cebu.

Remulla likewise reaffirmed the responsible and purposeful utilization of public funds in line with the signing of the General Appropriations Act for FY 2026, supporting President Ferdinand Marcos Jr.'s call for prudent fiscal management and uninterrupted public service delivery.

As the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM) achieved the historic zero backlog feat, the DILG is also considering conducting video proceedings of cases involving police personnel to enhance transparency in ensuring due process.

With the Phil-

ippines' chairmanship of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) this year, the DILG has expressed its commitment to rigorous preparations, serving as the ASEAN Senior Offi-

cial Meetings on Trans-national Crime (SOMTC) - Philippines, and the ASEAN SMART Cities Network lead.

Meanwhile, the DILG Chief acknowledged the Department's

employees for their collective toil, underscoring that national policies are seamlessly translated into local action due to their commitment to excellent public service. "We will contin-

ue building a DILG that is trusted and effective. One that delivers good local governance, ensures public safety, and moves the country forward inclusively," Remulla emphasized.

Col. Red attributed the peaceful celebration to the combined efforts of law enforcers, local government units, and the public. "The remarkable decrease in incidents during the New Year's Day celebration is proof of the effective implementation of the laws and the cooperation of the people," he said, adding that public discipline played a

crucial role in ensuring safety across the province. The Cavite PPO also cited intensified operations against illegal firecrackers and loose firearms, heightened police visibility, and close coordination with local government units and the Caviteño community as key factors behind the positive outcome. The provincial police force extended its gratitude

to partner agencies, LGUs, and residents for their continued support in maintaining peace and order.

Meanwhile, Bacoor City Mayor Strike Revilla reported that Department of Health data recorded 22 fireworks-related injury cases as of December 31, 2025, including patients treated in hospitals outside the city. Most incidents occurred inside homes, involving families from Molino IV and Ligas III who were affected by fountain and dragon firework displays.

The report also noted that most of those injured were adults, serving as a reminder that firework safety remains a shared responsibility—whether celebrations take place indoors or outdoors. (RBF)

SSS marks 2025 with pension reform and program upgrades; Looks forward to 2026

The Social Security System (SSS) closes 2025 with implementation of the Emergency Loan Program (ELP) capping off achievements that strengthened social protection for millions of Filipinos highlighted by successful implementation of the Pension Reform Program, loan program enhancements, expanded membership coverage, and significant strides in digital transformation.

SSS President and CEO Robert Joseph Montes De Claro said, "This year was a turning point for SSS. From the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. and with guidance from former Finance Secretary Ralph G. Recto and current Finance Secretary Frederick D. Go, we delivered on our promise to provide better benefits and programs, faster services, and wider coverage for our members. These milestones reflect our unwavering commitment to social security protection for all Filipino workers and their beneficiaries."

Key Achievements in 2025

2025 SSS Pension Reform Program featuring annual pension increases for all 3.8 million pensioners every September from 2025 to 2027 – 10% increase for retirement and disability pensioners and 5% increase for survivor pensioners; Salary Loan Program enhanced with reduced interest rate to 8% (from 10%) for more than 600,000 member-borrowers;

Calamity Loan Program enhanced with reduced interest rate to 7% (from 10%) and with faster activation for about 630,000 member-borrowers; Pension Loan Program for SSS Retiree and Surviving Spouse Pensioners implemented featuring loanable amount up to P300,000 for retiree pensioners and P150,000 for survivor pensioners for more than 30,000 pensioner-borrowers;

Issued MySSS Card with 2-in-1 functionality, a valid SSS ID and automatic enrollment as a disbursement account with almost 10,000 cards received already by SSS members and almost 100,000 disbursement accounts enrolled;

Emergency Loan Program implemented with low interest rate of 7% and 6-month moratorium on loan repayment for more than 26,000 member-borrowers;

Contribution Subsidy Provider Program rolled out led by Double Dragon Corporation paying P18.2-M to fully subsidize SSS contributions for 2,000 informal sector self-employed workers in Iloilo City and Roxas City for 12 months – local government units, religious groups, and others also registering as subsidy providers;

Accredited 25 Cooperatives as Coverage and Collection Partner to facilitate SSS registration, contributions collection, benefit and loan applications for more than 200,000 members of cooperatives;

Partnered with various government entities for social security coverage of Job Order/ Contract of Service (JO/COS) workers who are not covered by GSIS – more than 500,000 JOs registered and more than 200,000 JOs regularly paying SSS contributions; and

Implemented Run After Contribution Evaders (RACE) Programs nationwide to exact compliance from delinquent employers.

Looking forward to 2026

"We also look forward to 2026 where we continue implementation of existing programs, develop new ones, strengthen member servicing, and expand footprint of SSS nationwide and abroad," De Claro added.

The year 2026 brings with it Tranche 2 (of 3) of the Pension Reform Program for another round of pension increase for all pensioners in September. Also available for 2026 is the Emergency Loan Program up to 9 Decem-



ber 2026 or until the calamity declaration is lifted.

Micro loan program

From 17 December 2025 approval by the Social Security Commission of the guidelines for micro loan program, we expect implementation of this loan program early in 2026.

"With guidance from Finance Secretary Frederick D. Go, SSS is looking to implement this micro loan program through partner institutions very soon as a safer and affordable option to borrow cash for short-term needs with 15- to 90-day tenor and interest rate of 8% per annum or 0.67% per month," De Claro said.

Expanding footprint in the Philippines and overseas

Toward ensuring that no Filipino worker is left behind, we shall pursue opening of local and overseas branches in 2026. SSS is looking to establish Foreign Representative Offices in Madrid, San Francisco, and Ma-

cau while looking to establish 10 new branches locally.

Massive recruitment of personnel

For 2026, SSS is looking to hire about 1,800 personnel toward completely providing manpower resources in the frontlines – be it physically or virtually through electronic means. This recruitment effort aims to address gaps in service delivery and handling of requests for assistance and various complaints.

Other initiatives for 2026

Other programs being explored include potential partnership with the National Commission of Senior Citizens (NCSC) through Chairperson Ma. Mercedes N. Gutierrez for the Annual Confirmation of Pensioners (ACOP) Program, special programs for gig economy workers, and contribution subsidy program for 2,000 OFWs through P28.8-M commitment from Double Dragon Corporation.

"Looking back at 2025 and forward to 2026, we remain committed to our goal of making SSS relevant in the life of every Filipino at every point in their lives by providing quality social protection, continuous enhancement of member servicing platforms, and espousing the value of saving for the future," De Claro emphasized.

rules and regulations (IRR) of the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD) and the Department of Economy, Planning, and Development (DEPDev) Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2025-001.

"Under President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s housing agenda, our goal is clear. Filipino workers should have access to homes that are safe, decent and built to last, and that remain within their reach," DHSUD Secretary Jose Ramon Ailing said.

Ailing noted that up-coming residential condominium projects, price ceilings were likewise adjusted based on building classification and unit size, with maximum selling prices set at up to PHP1.8 million for projects above five floors with unit sizes of 27 square meters and above.

For eligible socialized condominium projects in the National Capital Region and other highly urbanized cities, the IRR allows additional charg-

es based on the zonal value of up to PHP200,000, bringing the allowable maximum selling price for select categories to as high as PHP2 million.

Under the IRR, the maximum selling price for socialized house and lot units was raised to PHP44,440 for a minimum unit size of 24 to 26 square meters, and PHP950,000 for units measuring 27 square meters and above.

Under the Pag-IBIG Housing Loan for the Expanded 4PH, qualified members may avail of loans at a subsidized interest rate of three percent for the first five years, extendible for another five years for eligible borrowers.

This translates to monthly amortizations of about PHP4,005 for house and lot units priced up to PHP950,000, and around PHP8,432 for condominium units priced up to PHP2 million.

Through Pag-IBIG Fund's "Early Bird" promotion, the first 30,000 qualified borrowers may enjoy the subsidized three-percent interest rate for

the first 10 years of their housing loan. (PNA)
